PROFESSIONAL SERVICE AGREEMENT

THIS PROFESSIONAL SERVICE AGREEMENT (the "Agreement") is entered into as of the Effective Date (defined in Section 1, below) by and between Polk County (the "County"), a political subdivision of the State of Florida, situated at 330 West Church Street, Bartow, Florida 33830, and Eisman & Russo, Inc. (the "Consultant") a Florida corporation, headquartered at 6455 Powers Ave, Jacksonville, FL 32217, whose Federal Employer Identification Number is 59-2606484.

WHEREAS, the County requires certain construction engineering and in section services in connection with the Thompson Nursery Road project; and,

WHEREAS, the County has solicited for these services via RFP 25-245, an advertised request for proposals (the "RFP"), and has received numerous responsive proposals thereto; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the RFP, the County has selected the Consultant and the Consultant remains agreeable to providing the County the professional services described herein, and the Consultant represents that it is capable and prepared to do so according to the terms and conditions stated herein;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual understandings and covenants set forth herein, the parties hereby agree, as follows:

1.0 Effective Date; Term

1.1 This Agreement shall take effect on the date (the "Effective Date") of its execution by the County, and shall continue until the Consultant completes all Services as identified in Section 2, below, unless the Agreement is otherwise sooner terminated as provided herein.

2.0 Consultant Services

2.1 The County does hereby retain the Consultant to furnish those services and to perform those tasks (collectively, the "Services") further described in (i) the County's Request for Proposal RFP # 25-245, to include all attachments and addenda, (ii) the Consultant's responsive proposal thereto, and (iii) the Scope of Services (collectively, (i) (ii), and (iii) are "RFP 25-245"), all of which are incorporated into this Agreement by this reference, attached as a composite Exhibit "A" and made a part of this Agreement.

3.0 Compensation

3.1 General

- 3.1.1 In consideration for its providing the Services, the County shall pay the Consultant the not to exceed amount of \$5,010,675.00 stated in Exhibit "A-III" Scope of Services, which is attached hereto and made a part of this Agreement.
- 3.1.2 The Consultant shall invoice the County based upon the Consultant's fees that are stated on the attached Exhibit "B", "Fee Schedule", which is made a part of this Agreement. The Fee Schedule identifies all Consultant job classifications which will perform billable services pursuant to this Agreement and the fee for each job classification, along with all equipment, materials, and supplies necessary in the performance of the Services. The County shall not be obligated to pay the Consultant (i) for any Services performed by individuals whose job classifications are not listed on the Fee Schedule, and (ii) for the cost of any equipment, material, or supplies not listed on the Fee Schedule that the Consultant may use in performing the Services.
- 3.1.3 All the Consultant's invoices for payment must reference this Agreement and must be submitted using a form approved by the County Auditor.
- 3.1.4 Each invoice shall be due and payable forty-five (45) days after the date the County receives a correct, fully documented, invoice, in form and substance satisfactory to the County with all appropriate cost substantiations attached. All invoices shall be delivered to:

- 3.1.5 The Consultant will clearly state "Final Invoice" on the Consultant's final/last billing for the Services rendered to the County. The Consultant's submission of a Final Invoice is its certification that all Services have been properly performed and all charges and costs have been invoiced to the County. This account will be closed upon the County's receipt of a Final Invoice. The Consultant hereby waives any charges not properly included on its Final Invoice.
- 3.1.6 The County's payment of a Final Invoice shall not constitute evidence of the County's acceptance of the Consultant's performance of the Services or its acceptance of any of the Consultant's Project work.
- 3.1.7 All Consultant invoices shall be accompanied by time and task records for all billable hours appearing on the invoice. After examining an invoice, the County may request that the Consultant submit additional documents to support certain fees or charges.

Upon receipt of any such request the Consultant shall provide the requested documents or other required information to the County Auditor's satisfaction.

3.1.8 On each invoice submitted, the Consultant's Project Manager or designated payroll officer is attesting to the correctness and accuracy of all fees, time charges and requested reimbursements for which the Consultant seeks payment.

3.1.9 The County's review, approval, acceptance, or payment for any of the Consultant's Services shall not be construed to: (i) operate as a waiver of any rights the County possesses under this Agreement; or (ii) waive or release any claim or cause of action arising out of the Consultant's performance or nonperformance of this Agreement. The Consultant shall be and will always remain liable to the County in accordance with applicable law for any and all damages to the County caused by the Consultant's negligent or wrongful performance or nonperformance of any of the Services to be furnished under this Agreement.

3.2 Reimbursable Expenses

3.2.1 All requests for payment of out-of-pocket expenses eligible for reimbursement under the terms of this Agreement shall be reimbursed per the negotiated Scope of Work (Exhibit A-iii) and in accordance with the County's Reimbursable Schedule that is attached hereto as Exhibit "C" and made a part of this Agreement. The Consultant's requests for payment shall include copies of paid receipts, invoices or other documentation acceptable to the County's Auditor. Such documentation shall be sufficient to establish that the expense was actually incurred and necessary in the performance of the Services described in this Agreement.

3.2.2 Reimbursable Expenses are the actual, pre-approved, expenses the Consultant incurred directly in connection with the performance of the Services performed in accordance with this Agreement:

Overnight Deliveries Reproduction Sub-Consultant

- 3.2.3 Mileage and associated travel costs shall be reimbursed in accordance with F.S. 112.061 and County policy for pre-approved out-of-county travel (excluding travel from home offices located outside of Polk County to the Polk County line).
- 3.2.4 All assets, i.e. durable goods, purchased as reimbursable expenses become the property of the County upon completion of any Project work for which the asset was

utilized. All such assets must be surrendered by delivery to the applicable County Division responsible for the Project immediately upon (i) demand, (ii) termination of the Agreement, or (iii) the conclusion of the applicable Project, whichever occurs first.

3.2.5 Consultant shall maintain a current inventory of all such assets.

4.0 Consultant's Responsibilities

- 4.1 The Consultant shall be responsible for the professional quality, accuracy, competence, methodology, and the coordination of all Services performed pursuant to this Agreement.
- 4.2 The County's review, approval, acceptance, or payment for any of the Consultant's Services shall not be construed to: (i) operate as a waiver of any rights the County possesses under this Agreement; or (ii) waive or release any claim or cause of action arising out of the Consultant's performance or nonperformance of this Agreement. The Consultant shall be and will always remain liable to the County in accordance with applicable law for any and all damages to the County caused by the Consultant's negligent or wrongful performance or nonperformance of any of the Services to be furnished under this Agreement.

5.0 **Ownership of Documents**

All analyses, reference data, bills, completed reports, or any other form of written instrument or document created or resulting from the Consultant's performance of the Services pursuant to this Agreement, subject to the cure period provided in Section 26.0, shall become the property of the County after payment is made to the Consultant for such instruments or documents.

6.0 **Termination**

- 6.1 The County may terminate this Agreement, in whole or in part, at any time, either for the County's convenience or because of the failure of the Consultant to fulfill its obligations under this Agreement, subject to the cure period provided in Section 26.0, by delivering written notice to the Consultant. Upon receipt of such notice, the Consultant shall:
- 6.1.1 Immediately discontinue all affected Services unless the notice directs otherwise, and
- 6.1.2 Deliver to the County all data, reports, summaries, and any and all such other information and materials of whatever type or nature as may have been accumulated by the Consultant in performing this Agreement, whether completed or in process.
 - 6.2 Unless in dispute or subject to the County's right of set-off or other remedy,

the Consultant shall be paid for Services actually rendered to the date of termination.

6.3 The rights and remedies of the County provided for in this Section 6 are in addition and supplemental to any and all other rights and remedies provided by law or under this Agreement.

7.0 **No Contingent Fees**

The Consultant warrants that it has not employed or retained any company or person, other than a bona fide employee working solely for the Consultant to solicit or secure this Agreement and that it has not paid or agreed to pay any person, company, corporation, individual or firm, other than a bona fide employee working solely for the Consultant, any fee, commission, percentage, gift, or other consideration contingent upon or resulting from award of or making of the Agreement. For the breach or violation of this provision, the County shall have the right to terminate the Agreement at its sole discretion, without liability and to deduct from the Agreement price, or otherwise recover, the full amount of such fee, commission, percentage, gift, or consideration.

8.0 Assignment

The Consultant shall not assign, transfer, or encumber this Agreement, or any interest herein, under any circumstances, without obtaining the prior written consent of the County, which consent may be withheld in the County's exercise of its reasonable discretion.

9.0 Professional Associates and Subcontractors

If the Consultant requires the assistance of any professional associates or subcontractors in connection with its providing the Services the Consultant must obtain the prior express written approval of the County, which the County may withhold in its discretion, before any such professional associate or subcontractor may perform any work for the County. If after obtaining the County's approval the Consultant utilizes any professional associates or subcontractors in the delivery of the Services then the Consultant shall remain solely and fully liable to the County for the performance or nonperformance of all such professional associates and subcontractors. The failure of a professional associate or subcontractor to timely or properly perform any of its obligations to the Consultant shall not relieve the Consultant of its obligations to the County under this Agreement.

10.0 **Indemnification of County**

Consultant, to the extent permitted by law, shall indemnify, defend (by counsel reasonably

acceptable to County) protect and hold the County, and its officers, employees and agents harmless from and against any and all, claims, actions, causes of action, liabilities, penalties, forfeitures, damages, losses, and expenses (including, without limitation, attorneys' fees costs and expenses incurred during negotiation, through litigation and all appeals therefrom) whatsoever including, but not limited, to those pertaining to the death of or injury to any person, or damage to any property, arising out of or resulting from (i) the failure of Consultant to comply with applicable laws, rules or regulations, (ii) the breach by Consultant of its obligations under this Agreement, (iii) any claim for trademark, patent or copyright infringement arising out of the scope of Consultant's performance or nonperformance of this Agreement, or (iv) the negligent acts, errors or omissions, or intentional or willful misconduct, of Consultant, its professional associates, subcontractors, agents, and employees provided, however, that Consultant shall not be obligated to defend or indemnify the County with respect to any such claims or damages arising out of the County's sole negligence.

11.0 Insurance Requirements

The Consultant shall maintain at all times the following minimum levels of insurance and shall, without in any way altering its liability, obtain, pay for and maintain insurance for the coverage and amounts of coverage not less than those set forth below. The Consultant shall provide the County original Certificates of Insurance satisfactory to the County to evidence such coverage before any work commences. The County shall be named as an additional insured on General and Automobile Liability policies. General Liability and Workers' Compensation policies shall contain a waiver of subrogation in favor of Polk County. The Commercial General Liability Policy shall (by endorsement if necessary) provide contractual liability coverage for the contractual indemnity stated in Section 10, above. All insurance coverage shall be written with a company having an A.M. Best rating of at least the "A" category and size category of VIII. The Consultant's self-insured retention or deductible per line of coverage shall not exceed \$25,000 without the permission of the County. In the event of any failure by the Consultant to comply with the provisions of this Section 11, the County may, at its option, upon notice to the Consultant suspend Consultant's performance of the Services for cause until there is full compliance. Alternatively, the County may purchase such insurance at the Consultant's expense, provided that the County shall have no obligation to do so and if the County shall do so, the Consultant shall not be relieved of or excused from the obligation to obtain and maintain such insurance amounts and coverage.

<u>Comprehensive Automobile Liability Insurance</u>. \$1,000,000.00 combined single limit of liability for bodily injuries, death and property damage resulting from any one occurrence, including all owned, hired, and non-owned vehicles.

<u>Professional Liability</u>. \$2,000,000 for errors and omissions, exclusive of defense costs.

<u>Commercial General Liability</u>. \$1,000,000.00 combined single limit of liability for bodily injuries, death and property damage, and personal injury resulting from any one occurrence, including the following coverages:

Premises and Operations:

Broad Form Commercial General Liability Endorsement to include Blanket Contractual liability (specifically covering, but not limited to, the contractual obligations assumed by the Firm); Personal Injury (with employment and contractual exclusions deleted); and Broad Form Property Damage coverage.

Independent Contractors:

Delete Exclusion relative to collapse, explosion and underground; Property Damage Hazards; Cross Liability Endorsement; and Contractual liability (specifically covering, but not limited to, the contractual obligations assumed by the Firm)

Workers Compensation. The Consultant shall provide, pay for, and maintain workers compensation insurance on all employees, its agents or subcontractors as required by Florida Statutes.

12.0 **Public Entity Crimes**

The Contractor declares and warrants that neither the Contractor nor any of the Contractor's affiliates, as that term is defined in Section 287.133, Florida Statutes, are subject to the restrictions in Section 287.133, Florida Statutes, regarding the commission of a public entity crime. If during the term of this Agreement, the Contractor or any affiliate is convicted of a public entity crime or is otherwise prohibited from performing work for or transacting business with the County pursuant to Section 287.133, Florida Statutes, then the Contractor shall be in material default of this Agreement, and in such case, the County shall have the rights and remedies as provided herein.

13.0 **Non-Discrimination**

The Consultant warrants and represents that all of its employees are treated equally during employment without regard to race, color, religion, gender, age or national origin.

14.0 **Designation of Party Representatives**

- 14.1 Upon receipt of a request from the Consultant, the County shall designate in writing one or more of its employees who are authorized to act by and on behalf of the County to transmit instructions, receive information and interpret and define the County's policy and decisions with respect to the Services to be provided pursuant to this Agreement.
- 14.2 The Consultant shall designate or appoint one or more Consultant representatives who are authorized to act on behalf of and to bind the Consultant regarding all matters involving the conduct of its performance pursuant to this Agreement.

15.0 All Prior Agreements Superseded

This document incorporates and includes all prior negotiations, correspondence, conversations, agreements or understandings applicable to the matters contained herein and the parties agree that there are no commitments, agreements or understandings concerning the subject matter of this Agreement that are not contained in this document or its designated exhibits. Accordingly, it is agreed that no deviation from the terms hereof shall be predicated upon any prior representations or agreements, whether oral or written.

16.0 Modifications, Amendments or Alterations

No modification, amendment or alteration in the terms or conditions contained herein shall be effective unless agreed to and executed in writing by both parties to this Agreement in a form acceptable to the County.

17.0 Independent Consultant

Nothing stated in this Agreement is intended or should be construed in any manner as creating or establishing a relationship of co-partners between the parties, or as constituting the Consultant (including its officers, employees, and agents) as the agent, representative, or employee of the County for any purpose, or in any manner, whatsoever. The Consultant is to be and shall remain forever an independent Consultant with respect to all Services performed under this Agreement. The Consultant shall not pledge the County's credit or make the County a guarantor of payment or surety for any contract, debt, obligation, judgment, lien or any form of indebtedness and the Consultant shall have no right to speak for or bind the County in any manner.

18.0 Public Records Law

- (a) The Consultant acknowledges the County's obligations under Article I, Section 24, of the Florida Constitution and under Chapter 119, Florida Statutes, to release public records to members of the public upon request and comply in the handling of the materials created under this Agreement. The Consultant further acknowledges that the constitutional and statutory provisions control over the terms of this Agreement. In association with its performance pursuant to this Agreement, the Consultant shall not release or otherwise disclose the content of any documents or information that is specifically exempt from disclosure pursuant to all applicable laws.
- (b) Without in any manner limiting the generality of the foregoing, to the extent applicable, the Consultant acknowledges its obligations to comply with Section 119.0701, Florida Statutes, with regard to public records, and shall:
- (1) keep and maintain public records required by the County to perform the services required under this Agreement;
- (2) upon request from the County's Custodian of Public Records or his/her designee, provide the County with a copy of the requested records or allow the records to be inspected or copied within a reasonable time at a cost that does not exceed the cost provided in Chapter 119, Florida Statutes, or as otherwise provided by law;
- (3) ensure that public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements are not disclosed except as authorized by law for the duration of the term of this Agreement and following completion of this Agreement if the Consultant does not transfer the records to the County; and
- (4) upon completion of this Agreement, transfer, at no cost, to the County all public records in possession of the Consultant or keep and maintain public records required by the County to perform the service. If the Consultant transfers all public records to the County upon completion of this Agreement, the Consultants shall destroy any duplicate public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements. If the Consultant keeps and maintains public records upon completion of this Agreement, the Consultant shall meet all applicable requirements for retaining public records. All records stored electronically must be provided to the County, upon request from the County's Custodian of Public Records, in a format that is compatible with the information technology systems of the County.
- (c) IF THE CONSULTANT HAS QUESTIONS REGARDING THE APPLICATION OF CHAPTER 119, FLORIDA STATUTES, TO THE CONSULTANT'S DUTY TO PROVIDE PUBLIC RECORDS RELATING TO THIS AGREEMENT, CONTACT THE COUNTY'S CUSTODIAN OF **PUBLIC RECORDS AT:**

Compliance with Laws and Regulations 19.0

In providing all Services pursuant to this Agreement, the Consultant shall comply with applicable regulatory requirements including federal, state, special district, and local laws, rules

regulations, orders, codes, criteria and standards, including those now in effect and hereafter adopted. Any violation of said statutes, ordinances, rules, or regulations shall constitute a material breach of this Agreement, and shall entitle the County to terminate this Agreement immediately upon delivery of written notice of termination to the Consultant.

20.0 Governing Law and Venue

This Agreement shall be governed in all respects by the laws of the State of Florida and any litigation with respect thereto shall be brought only in the courts of Polk County, Florida or in the United States District Court, Middle District of Florida, located in Hillsborough County, Florida. Each party shall be responsible for its own attorneys' fees and other legal costs and expenses.

21.0 Notices

Whenever either party desires to give notice unto the other, it must be given by written notice, delivered (i) in person, (ii) via registered or certified United States mail, postage prepaid with return receipt requested, or (iii) via nationally recognized overnight delivery service, and addressed to the party for whom it is intended at the place last specified by each party. The place for giving of notice shall remain such until it is changed by written notice delivered in compliance with the provisions of this Section 21. For the present, the parties designate the following as the respective places for giving of notice, to wit:

22.0 Severability

The invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability of any provision of this Agreement, or the occurrence of any event rendering any portion or provision of this Agreement void, shall in no way affect the validity or enforceability of any other portion or provision of the Agreement; any void provision shall be deemed severed from the Agreement and the balance of the Agreement shall be construed and enforced as if the Agreement did not contain the particular portion or

provision held to be void. The parties further agree to reform the Agreement to replace any stricken provision with a valid provision that comes as close as possible to the intent of the stricken provision. The provisions of this section shall not prevent the entire Agreement from being void should a provision which is of the essence of the Agreement be determined to be void.

23.0 Annual Appropriations

Consultant acknowledges that during any fiscal year the County shall not expend money, incur any liability, or enter into any agreement which by its terms involves the expenditure of money in excess of the amounts budgeted as available for expenditure during such fiscal year. Accordingly, any agreement, verbal or written, the County may make in violation of this fiscal limitation is null and void, and no money may be paid on such agreement. The County may enter into agreements whose duration exceeds one year; however, any such agreement shall be executory only for the value of the services to be rendered which the County agrees to pay as allocated in its annual budget for each succeeding fiscal year. Accordingly, the County's performance and obligation to pay the Consultant under this Agreement is contingent upon annual appropriations being made for that purpose.

24.0 Employment Eligibility Verification (E-VERIFY)

- A. Unless otherwise defined herein, terms used in this Section which are defined in Section 448.095, Florida Statutes, as may be amended from time to time, shall have the meaning ascribed in said statute.
- B. Pursuant to Section 448.095(5), Florida Statutes, the contractor hereto, and any subcontractor thereof, must register with and use the E-Verify system to verify the work authorization status of all new employees of the contractor or subcontractor. The contractor acknowledges and agrees that (i) the County and the contractor may not enter into this Agreement, and the contractor may not enter into any subcontracts hereunder, unless each party to this Agreement, and each party to any subcontracts hereunder, registers with and uses the E-Verify system; and (ii) use of the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's E-Verify System and compliance with all other terms of this Certification and Section 448.095, Fla. Stat., is an express condition of this Agreement, and the County may treat a failure to comply as a material breach of this Agreement.
- C. By entering into this Agreement, the contractor becomes obligated to comply with the provisions of Section 448.095, Fla. Stat., "Employment Eligibility," as amended from time to time. This includes but is not limited to utilization of the E-Verify System to verify the work authorization status of all newly hired employees, and requiring all subcontractors to provide an affidavit attesting that the subcontractor does not employ, contract with, or subcontract with, an unauthorized alien. The contractor shall maintain a copy of such affidavit for the duration of this Agreement. Failure to comply will lead to termination of this Agreement, or if a subcontractor knowingly violates the statute or Section 448.09(1), Fla. Stat., the subcontract must be terminated immediately. If this Agreement is terminated pursuant to Section 448.095, Fla. Stat.,

such termination is not a breach of contract and may not be considered as such. Any challenge to termination under this provision must be filed in the Tenth Judicial Circuit Court of Florida no later than 20 calendar days after the date of termination. If this Agreement is terminated for a violation of Section 448.095, Fla. Stat., by the contractor, the contractor may not be awarded a public contract for a period of 1 year after the date of termination. The contractor shall be liable for any additional costs incurred by the County as a result of the termination of this Agreement. Nothing in this Section shall be construed to allow intentional discrimination of any class protected by law.

25.0 Consultant Representations

- 25.1 The Consultant hereby represents and warrants the following to the County:
- 25.1.1 Consultant is a corporation that is duly organized and existing in good standing under the laws of the State of Florida with full right and authority to do business within the State of Florida.
- 25.1.2 Consultant's performance under this Agreement will not violate or breach any contract or agreement to which the Consultant is a party or is otherwise bound, and will not violate any governmental statute, ordinance, rule, or regulation.
- 25.1.3 Consultant has the full right and authority to enter into this Agreement and to perform its obligations in accordance with its terms.
- 25.1.4 Consultant now has and will continue to maintain all licenses and approvals required for conducting its business, and that it will at all times conduct its business activities in a reputable manner.
- 25.1.5 Consultant has no obligation or indebtedness that would impair its ability to fulfill the terms of this Agreement.
- 25.1.6 Consultant has the personnel and experience necessary to perform all Services in a professional and workmanlike manner.
- 25.1.7 Consultant shall exercise the same degree of care, skill, and diligence in the performance of the Services as provided by a professional of like experience, knowledge and resources, under similar circumstances.
- 25.1.8 Consultant shall, at no additional cost to County, re-perform those Services which fail to satisfy the foregoing standard of care or which otherwise fail to meet the requirements of this Agreement.
- 25.1.9 Each individual executing this Agreement on behalf of the Consultant is authorized to do so

26.0 Default and Remedy

If the Consultant materially defaults in its obligations under this Agreement and fails to cure the same within fifteen (15) days after the date the Consultant receives written notice of the default from the County, then the County shall have the right to (i) immediately terminate this Agreement by delivering written notice to the Consultant, and (ii) pursue any and all remedies available in law, equity, and under this Agreement. If the County materially defaults in its obligations under this Agreement and fails to cure the same within fifteen (15) days after the date the County receives written notice of the default from the Consultant, then the Consultant shall have the right to immediately terminate this Agreement by delivering written notice to the County. Upon any such termination, the County shall pay the Consultant the full amount due and owing for all Services performed through the date of Agreement termination.

27.0 Limitation of Liability

IN NO EVENT, SHALL THE COUNTY BE LIABLE TO THE CONSULTANT FOR INDIRECT, INCIDENTAL, CONSEQUENTIAL, SPECIAL, EXEMPLARY, OR PUNITIVE DAMAGES OF ANY KIND OR NATURE, INCLUDING LOSS OF PROFIT, WHETHER FORESEEABLE OR NOT, ARISING OUT OF OR RESULTING FROM THE NONPERFORMANCE OR BREACH OF THIS CONTRACT BY THE COUNTY WHETHER BASED IN CONTRACT, COMMON LAW, WARRANTY, TORT, STRICT LIABILITY, CONTRIBUTION, INDEMNITY OR OTHERWISE.

28.0 Waiver

A waiver by either County or Consultant of any breach of this Agreement shall not be binding upon the waiving party unless such waiver is in writing. In the event of a written waiver, such a waiver shall not affect the waiving party's rights with respect to any other or further breach of this Agreement. The making or acceptance of a payment by either party with the knowledge of the other party's existing default or breach of the Agreement shall not waive such default or breach, or any subsequent default or breach of this Agreement, and shall not be construed as doing so.

29.0 Attorneys' Fees and Costs

Each party shall be responsible for its own legal and attorneys' fees, costs and expenses incurred in connection with any dispute or any litigation arising out of, or relating to this Agreement, including attorneys' fees, costs, and expenses incurred for any appellate or bankruptcy proceedings.

30.0 Force Majeure

Either party hereunder may be temporarily excused from performance if an Event of Force Majeure directly or indirectly causes its nonperformance. An "Event of Force Majeure" is defined as any event which results in the prevention or delay of performance by a party of its obligations under this Agreement and which is beyond the reasonable control of the nonperforming party. It includes, but is not limited to fire, flood, earthquakes, storms, lightning, epidemic, war, riot, civil disturbance, sabotage, and governmental actions. Neither party shall be excused from performance if non-performance is due to forces which are reasonably preventable, removable, or remediable and which the non-performing party could have, with the exercise of reasonable diligence, prevented, removed, or remedied prior to, during, or immediately after their occurrence. Within five (5) days after the occurrence of an Event of Force Majeure, the non-performing party shall deliver written notice to the other party describing the event in reasonably sufficient detail, along with proof of how the event has precluded the non-performing party from performing its obligations hereunder, and a good faith estimate as to the anticipated duration of the delay and the means and methods for correcting the delay. The non-performing party's obligations, so far as those obligations are affected by the Event of Force Majeure, shall be temporarily suspended during, but no longer than, the continuance of the Event of Force Majeure and for a reasonable time thereafter as may be required for the non-performing party to return to normal business operations. If excused from performing any obligations under this Agreement due to the occurrence of an Event of Force Majeure, the non-performing party shall promptly, diligently, and in good faith take all reasonable action required for it to be able to commence or resume performance of its obligations under this Agreement. During any such time period, the nonperforming party shall keep the other party duly notified of all such actions required for it to be able to commence or resume performance of its obligations under this Agreement.

31.0 Key Personnel

The Consultant shall notify the County if any of the Consultant's Key Personnel (as defined, below) change during the Term of the Agreement. To the extent possible, the Consultant shall notify the County at least ten (10) days prior to any proposed change in its Key Personnel. At the County's request the Consultant shall remove without consequence to the County any of the Consultant's contractors, sub-contractors, sub-consultants, agents or employees and replace

the same with an appropriate substitute having the required skill and experience necessary to perform the Services. The County shall have the right to reject the Consultant's proposed changes in Key Personnel. The following individuals shall be considered "Key Personnel:"

The County will negotiate a fee schedule and or overall lump sum price as part of "Selection Process", Elevation Level 4, Contract Negotiations.

Services under this contract will be in compliance with Section 287.055 of the Florida Statutes referred to as the "Consultants' Competitive Negotiation Act" (CCNA). Polk County's Procurement Procedure's Manual outlines the Procedures for Contracting for Professional Services Covered by CCNA. These procedures outline the process used for the selection of a consulting firm awarded through this RFP process.

In accordance with Section 287.055(10), Florida Statutes, or any applicable amending or replacement statute, this provision of the RFP shall serve as the County's public notice that any plans, drawings or designs developed by the successful Proposer(s) on behalf of the County pursuant to this RFP or any agreement, authorization, purchase order or other contract resulting therefrom, are subject to be reused by the County at some future time in accordance with the aforementioned statute.

All services must be performed in accordance with applicable Federal, State and Local regulations.

BACKGROUND, PURPOSE AND SCOPE Background & Purpose:

Thompson Nursery Road is a proposed four-lane urban collector roadway located to the south of Winter Haven. The corridor limits of the Project are from the intersection of US 17 @ SR 540 to the intersection of US 27 @ Thompson Nursery Road (approximately 10 miles).

Polk County has identified the construction of Thompson Nursery Road as a priority given the population and employment growth projected for the region surrounding Thompson Nursery Road. This expected growth is evident in the increased traffic demands on nearby roadways, and future development projects planned along the corridor.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

The scope of work is expected to include, but may not be limited to, construction contract administration, inspection services, monitoring the contractor's quality control process, coordinating and facilitating the County's quality assurance process, coordinating and facilitating the County's quality verification process (when required). The scope of work also includes coordinating the utility relocation efforts prior to and during construction.

Task 1 – CEI Services of Segment One (US 17 to Rifle Range Road)

The construction of Segment One will be managed by the County with assistance from a CEI firm. Segment One is intended to operate as a stand-alone project until the design of the other Segments can be finalized and constructed (approximately 2 miles).

Task 2 – Optional Services (CEI Services of Segment Two - Rifle Range Road to East of CSX Crossing)

The County reserves the option to negotiate at a later date an amendment to the agreement with the Consultant to perform CEI Services for extending Thompson Nursery Road from Rifle Range Road to east of the CSX Crossing (approximately 3 miles).

Task 3 – Optional Services (CEI Services of Segment Four - Eloise Loop Road to West Lake Ruby Drive)

The County reserves the option to negotiate at a later date an amendment to the agreement with the Consultant to perform CEI Services for widening Thompson Nursery Road from Eloise Loop Road to West Lake Ruby Drive (approximately 1 miles).

Task 4 – Optional Services (CEI Services of Segment Five - West Lake Ruby Drive to US 27)

The County reserves the option to negotiate at a later date an Amendment to the Agreement with the Consultant to perform CEI Services for widening Thompson Nursery Road from West Lake Ruby Drive to US 27 (approximately 3 miles).

AGREEMENT

The initial term of this agreement is estimated at two (2) years after notice to proceed is issued, for Task 1. The actual term will be negotiated as part of the Selection Process, Elevation Level 4.

EVALUATION CRITERIA

Proposals should not contain information in excess of that requested, must be concise, and must specifically address the issues of this RFP. Unnecessarily elaborate brochures or other presentations beyond those sufficient to present a complete and effective response to this RFP are not desired and may be construed as an indication of the Proposer's lack of cost consciousness. Elaborate artwork, expensive visual aids, and other presentation aids are neither necessary nor desired unless specifically requested. The Proposal responses shall be contained within a three ring binder (original and each copy in separate binders). For the purposes of this RFP, one page equals a single sided page. It is requested that the responses be in the same order as the selection and evaluation procedures. The submittals should include the following:

The County shall have the right, but not the obligation, to verify the foregoing requirements.
- In the event a Proposer lists one or more sub-consultants in Tab 4 which is a Polk County Entity and receives point(s) as a result, and after the Proposer is awarded the project, if successful, it is determined that the listed sub-consultant does not assist in the performance of the scope of work (and is not replaced with an alternative sub-consultant which is a Polk County Entity), then the Proposer acknowledges and agrees that it may be suspended or debarred by the Procurement Director for failure to comply with the conditions, specifications or terms of a proposal or contract with the County or for committing a fraud or misrepresentation in connection with a proposal or contract with the County, in accordance with the Polk County Purchasing Ordinance and Procedures Manual.

Tab 5 Is the Firm a "Certified Woman or Minority Business Enterprise" (5 Points)

- Polk County Board of County Commissioners has a long-standing commitment to encouraging the utilization of Women and Minority Businesses that do business with the County as vendors. - Proposers or sub-consultants will be allocated points if they are a certified W/MBE as evidenced by providing the documentation described below.
- If the Proposer or sub-consultant has a certified W/MBE status, provide documentation of the firms' certified W/MBE status as defined by the Florida Small and Minority Business Act and as defined in Polk County's Purchasing Procedures. Polk County's Purchasing Procedures recognize the following to meet the requirement of a certified W/MBE status:

Certifications from other governmental agencies will be considered on a case-by-case basis.

• In the event a Proposer lists one or more sub-consultants in Tab 5 which is a Women or Minority owned business and receives point(s) as a result, and after the Proposer is awarded the project, if successful, it is determined that the listed sub-consultant does not assist in the performance of the scope of work (and is not replaced with an alternative sub-consultant which is a Women or Minority owned business), then the Proposer acknowledges and agrees that it may be suspended or debarred by the Procurement Director for failure to comply with the conditions, specifications or terms of a proposal or contract with the County or for committing a fraud or misrepresentation in connection with a proposal or contract with the County, in accordance with the Polk County Purchasing Ordinance and Procedures Manual.

Selection Process

Proposals will be evaluated in accordance with this section and all applicable County procurement policies and procedures.

The County shall appoint a selection committee (the "Selection Committee") that will be responsible for evaluating and scoring/ranking the Proposals in accordance with this Section.

The County will use a competitive selection process based on the Elevation Levels described in this Section. At Elevation Levels 2 and 3, the Selection Committee will score and/or rank the Proposals as applicable.

Selection of a final Proposal will be based upon the following steps and factors:

Elevation Level 1 (Procurement Requirements Assessment):

- The County Procurement Division shall review all Proposals for conformance with RFP guidelines and detailed submittal requirements. At the County's discretion, non-conforming Proposals may be eliminated from further consideration and conforming Proposals shall be elevated to Elevation Level 2. Procurement will distribute Proposals and evaluation criteria to the Selection Committee.
- Procurement will also ensure all firms meet the requirement of certification as outlined in Florida Statute 287.055(3)(c).
- The Selection Committee may convene to review questions that arise during individual member review of submitted Proposals before Elevation Level 2 to allow for questions, clarifications, explanations, or other discussion to be held before the review of Proposals is completed.

Elevation Level 2 (Scoring)

- 1) Each Selection Committee member shall determine which of the following descriptions applies to each of the foregoing evaluation criteria:
- EXCELLENT (1.0): Of the highest or finest quality; exceptional; superior; superb; exquisite; peerless.
 - The Proposer provided information for a given criteria that satisfied the requirements and described specifically how and what will be accomplished in such a manner that exhibited an exceptional and superior degree of understanding, skill, and competency, both qualitatively and quantitatively. The facts included in the narrative (including all supporting documentation, diagrams, drawings, charts, and schedules, etc.) demonstrate the Proposer's ability to perform and deliver far beyond expectation.
- VERY GOOD (0.8): To a high degree; better than or above competent and/or skillful.
 - The Proposer provided information for a given criteria that satisfied the requirements and described specifically how and what will be accomplished in such a manner that exhibited a very high degree of understanding, skill, and competency, both qualitatively and quantitatively. The facts included in the narrative (including all supporting documentation, diagrams, drawings, charts, and schedules, etc.) demonstrate the Proposer's ability to perform and deliver beyond expectation.
- GOOD (0.6): Having positive or desirable qualities; competent; skilled; above average.
 - The Proposer provided information for a given criteria that satisfied the requirements and described specifically how and what will be accomplished in such a manner that exhibited a skillful and above-average degree of understanding, skill, and competency, both qualitatively and quantitatively. The facts included in the narrative (including all supporting documentation, diagrams,

drawings, charts, and schedules, etc.) demonstrate the Proposer's ability to perform and deliver at the expected level.

• FAIR (0.4): Average; moderate; mediocre; adequate; sufficient; satisfactory; standard.

The Proposer provided information for a given criteria that satisfied the requirements and described sufficiently how and what will be accomplished in a manner that exhibited an adequate and average degree of understanding, skill, and competency, both qualitatively and quantitatively. The facts included in the narrative (including all supporting documentation, diagrams, drawings, charts, and schedules, etc.) demonstrate the Proposer's ability to perform and deliver at a level slightly below expectation.

 POOR (0.2): Inadequate; lacking; inferior in quality; of little or less merit; substandard; marginal.

The Proposer provided information for a given criteria that did not satisfy the requirements and described in an inadequate manner how and what will be accomplished. The information provided simply reiterated a requirement, contained inaccurate statements or references, lacked adequate information, or was of inferior quality. The facts included in the narrative (including all supporting documentation, diagrams, drawings, charts, and schedules, etc.) demonstrate the Proposer's ability to perform and deliver at a substandard and inferior level.

• UNACCEPTABLE (0.0):

The Proposer failed to provide any information for a given criteria, provided information that could not be understood, or did not provide the information for a given category as requested.

After a Selection Committee member has determined the description applicable for each evaluation criterion, the total points available for such criterion shall be multiplied by the factor associated with the applicable description to produce the number of points allocated for that evaluation criterion. For example, a Selection Committee member classifies the "Experience and Expertise" criterion (which shall be worth 25 points for the purpose of this example) as "Very Good" (which is a description factor multiplier of 0.8). The points that Selection Committee member allocated for that evaluation criterion would be 20, calculated as follows: 25 available points x 0.8 applicable description factor multiplier = 20 points.

A Selection Committee member's total score for each Proposal shall equal the sum of the total points allocated for each evaluation criteria.

When all Selection Committee members have completed their proposal evaluations, the individual Selection Committee member's total scores for each Proposal will be added together to produce a final score for each Proposal.

Procurement will confirm the calculations for the final score for each Proposal. Then, Procurement shall publish a rank-ordered listing of the Proposals to the Selection Committee with the Proposal receiving the highest point as the highest-ranked Proposal.

In accordance with Section 287.055(4)(a), Florida Statutes, if there are three (3) or more Proposers in Elevation Level 2, the Selection Committee will elevate no fewer than the three highest scored of such Proposers to Elevation Level 3 for interviews. If there are only two Proposers in Elevation Level 2, the Selection Committee shall elevate those two Proposers to Elevation Level 3 for interviews. If there is only one Proposer in Elevation Level 2, then the Selection Committee may collectively decide if they would like to elevate the Proposer to Elevation Level 3 for interviews or if they would like to recommend the Board authorize staff to enter into Contract Negotiations with the Proposer. In the latter case, after Board approval to authorize staff to negotiate a contract, the Proposer will then be elevated to Elevation Level 4 for contract negotiations.

Elevation Level 3 (Proposer Interviews)

The Selection Committee may be required to conduct interviews of the Proposers that it has elevated from Elevation Level 2 to Elevation Level 3.

During an interview, elevated Proposers may be requested to make a presentation focusing on their qualifications, approach to the project and the ability to furnish the required services. The Selection Committee members will have an opportunity to inquire about any aspect of the RFP and the Proposer's Proposal. After all elevated Proposer interviews, each Selection Committee member will individually rank the Proposers in numerical order beginning at number 1 for the Proposer deemed to be the most highly qualified to perform the required services. In accordance with Section 287.055(4)(b), Florida Statutes, in determining whether a Proposer is qualified, each Selection Committee member shall consider such factors as:

- Ability of Personnel
- Whether a Proposer is a certified minority business enterprise
- Past performance
- Willingness to meet time and budget requirements
- Location
- Recent, current, and projected workloads
- Volume of work previously awarded to each Proposer by the County

Procurement shall receive and compile each Selection Committee member's ranking of each Proposer, and then publish a rank-ordered listing of Proposers to the Selection Committee, based on the combined average rankings given each Proposer. The Selection Committee members will then collectively decide if they would like to recommend the Board authorize staff to enter into Contract Negotiations with all Proposers elevated to Proposer Interviews, starting with the highest-ranked Proposer. After Board approval, as applicable, to authorize staff to negotiate a contract, the highest-ranked Proposer will then be elevated to Elevation Level 4, Contract Negotiations.

Elevation Level 4 (Contract Negotiations)

If a Proposer is elevated to this level, the User Division, with the assistance of Procurement and the County Attorney's Office, shall negotiate an Agreement with the elevated Proposer(s) in accordance with Section 287.055(5), Florida Statutes.

If after negotiating for a reasonable time period the parties cannot agree on a contract, the County shall, in its sole discretion, terminate further contract negotiations with that Proposer. Procurement shall notify the Selection Committee that contract negotiations with the elevated Proposer have terminated. The Selection Committee shall then determine whether to recommend to the Board to approve contract negotiations with the next-highest-ranked Proposer, and so on. If the Selection Committee decides not to recommend contract negotiations with the next-highest-ranked Proposer, or if the County determines there is no other Proposer with whom the County can successfully negotiate a contract, then the RFP Selection Process shall terminate.

After contract negotiations with a Proposer are successfully completed pursuant to Elevation Level 4, the Selection Committee shall recommend to the Board of County Commissions that it selects such Proposer to provide the services as outlined in the Agreement. The Board of County Commissioners shall make the final decision whether to enter into an Agreement with a Proposer.

GENERAL CONDITIONS

CONTACT

After the issuance of any Request for Proposal, prospective proposers shall not contact, communicate with or discuss any matter relating in any way to the Request for Proposal with the Board of County Commissioners, and any employee of Polk County, other than the Procurement Director or as directed in the cover page of the Request for Proposal. This prohibition begins with the issuance of any Request for Proposal and ends upon completion execution of a contract. Such communications initiated by a proposer shall be grounds for disqualifying the offending proposer from consideration for award of the proposal and/or any future proposal.

INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

The selected firm, if any, shall maintain, at all times, the following minimum levels of insurance and; shall, without in any way altering their liability, obtain, pay for and maintain insurance for the coverages and amounts of coverage not less than those set forth below. Provide to the County original Certificates of Insurance satisfactory to the County to evidence such coverage before any work commences. Polk County, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, shall be an additional named insured on all policies related to the project; excluding workers' compensation and professional liability. The Workers' Compensation and General Liability policies shall contain a waiver of subrogation in favor of Polk County. All insurance coverage shall be written with a company having an A.M. Best Rating of at least the "A" category and size category of VIII. The firm's self-insured retention or deductible per line of coverage shall not exceed \$25,000 without the permission of the County. In the event of any failure by the firm to comply with the provisions; the County may, at its option, on notice to the firm suspend the project for cause until there is full compliance. Alternatively, the County may purchase such insurance at the firm's expense, provided that the County shall have no obligation to do so and if the County shall do so, the firm shall not be relieved of or excused from the obligation to obtain and maintain such insurance amounts and coverages.

Professional Liability Insurance. \$2,000,000 for design errors and omissions, inclusive of defense costs. Selected firm shall be required to provide continuing Professional Liability Insurance to cover the project for a period of two (2) years after the projects are completed.

INDEMNIFICATION

To the maximum extent permitted by law, the Consultant shall indemnify, protect and hold the County, and its officers, employees and agents, harmless from and against any and all, claims, actions, causes of action, liabilities, penalties, forfeitures, damages, losses, and expenses whatsoever (including, without limitation, reasonable attorneys' fees, costs, and expenses incurred during negotiation, through litigation and all appeals therefrom) including, without limitation, those pertaining to the death of or injury to any person, or damage to any property, to the extent arising out of or resulting from (i) the failure of Consultant to comply with applicable laws, rules or regulations, (ii) the breach by Consultant of its obligations under this Agreement, (iii) any claim for trademark, patent, or copyright infringement arising out of the scope of Consultant's performance or nonperformance of this Agreement, or (iv) the negligent acts, errors or omissions, or intentional or willful misconduct, of Consultant or any persons or entities employed or utilized by Consultant in the performance of this Agreement. The obligations imposed by this Section shall survive the expiration or earlier termination of the Agreement.

PUBLIC ENTITY CRIMES STATEMENT

The Consultant declares and warrants that neither the Consultant nor any of the Consultant's affiliates, as that term is defined in Section 287.133, Florida Statutes, are subject to the restrictions in Section 287.133, Florida Statutes, regarding the commission of a public entity crime. If during the term of this Agreement, the Consultant or any affiliate is convicted of a public entity crime or is otherwise prohibited from performing work for or transacting business with the County pursuant to Section 287.133, Florida Statutes, then the Consultant shall be in material default of this Agreement, and in such case, the County shall have the rights and remedies as provided herein.

EQUAL OPPORTUNITY/AFFIRMATIVE ACTION

APPROACH TO PROJECT

UNDERSTANDING OF PROJECT



Eisman & Russo's (E&R) philosophy is to work as an extension of Polk County staff and be a catalyst for the construction process to achieve a quality project completed on time and within budget. Thompson Nursery Road segment #1 is a proposed four-lane urban collector road that will require a multi-phased approach as it includes widening of US 17 by permit; new alignment construction for a portion of Thompson Nursery Road and then following and widening the existing alignment of Snively Ave/ Rifle Range Road to just south of Eloise Loop Road.

The Thompson Nursery Road project has been our focus for several years including meeting with Jose Fernandez, Doug Gable, and Joe Montoya multiple times to better understand the project needs and performing an extensive constructability review of the Phase IV plans and then presenting our findings and recommendations to Jose Fernandez and Doug Gable to assist in the plan development process. Our constructability comments and recommendations were incorporated into the 100% design plans **adding value** resulting in a more cost-effective project.

This E&R team has a long history of being the catalyst for success by fostering partnerships, overcoming obstacles (utility, design, contractor, etc.), providing innovative solutions, and tenaciously keeping projects moving forward so the traveling public is impacted as little as possible and they have the benefit of a completed project as soon as possible - all while ensuring the project meets budget. How we will achieve this commitment on the Thompson Nursery Road project is detailed below.

Prior to Construction: E&R will immediately begin to assess and address project risks, discrepancies in the plans, and status of any utility work required "prior to construction." We will also schedule, hold, and attend several meetings to facilitate project success. E&R will attend the pre-bid conference as noted in the specifications to aid Polk County in resolution of issues to help ensure proper bidding by contractors. We will hold a "pass the torch" meeting for information sharing with Kimley-Horn's design team (Roadway Design and City Utilities Design) and Polk County staff to discuss key design features, issues that arose during design, commitments made, and right-of-way constraints especially the temporary construction easements (TCEs) shown in the plans. We will schedule a meeting with Kristen Ethridge, FDOT Bartow Operations Center Permit Manager and her team along with Polk County staff to discuss the permit for US 17 construction including any specific requirements and final submittals. We will hold the Pre-construction Meeting with all required attendees to discuss contract requirements, contractor schedules and unique project features. E&R will hold two separate utility meetings. The first will discuss "prior to construction" utility relocation with utility companies, Polk County staff, and the contractor including status, progress, completion schedule, any issues and encourage early partnering between all parties. The second utility meeting will be scheduled once the contractor has completed initial layout so parties can discuss the contractor's schedule then move to the field to discuss location specific issues and review the contractors starting and secondary work areas.

Coordination: E&R highly values working with all agencies and parties to exceed their expectations and deliver a successful project so we proactively communicate with all stakeholders to address issues and expedite resolution to any potential challenges. We monitor and track the project schedule and will keep PM Jose Fernandez and Polk County informed of the project status. We foster the rapport between CEI, County, and Contractor as one of the most critical aspects in the timely completion of any project. Coordinating with the public and various businesses along project corridors and specific attention given to key stakeholders like Lake Ashton and Wahneta we have found invaluable for project success. With the many road use changes and the new alignment near residences, E&R will take a multi-faceted approach to informing the public of upcoming changes in construction and traffic phasing. Prior to construction E&R will meet each resident and business located near the project and provide them with a project flier and E&R contact information. This will allow us to be the initial call for questions, issue resolution, or concerns with construction on the project and alleviate the unnecessary burden from Mr. Fernandez. Next, we will utilize traditional MOT methods including variable message boards to notify traveling motorists of upcoming lane shifts and detours as shown in the plans. Lastly, since Rifle Range Road has heavy truck usage and close proximity to the Intermodal Logistics Center we will utilize our relationship with Amanda Tyner FDOT Freight Coordinator to help spread the word to trucking companies of the detours and lane closures/shifts and the new alignment for Snively Road and Thompson Nursery Road configuration. Value Added: E&R will have a Public Information Officer provided by The Valein Group part-time to assist, when requested by Polk County, in any public forums or meetings and with updating and maintaining the Thompson Nursery Road construction portion of the website.

EEO/OJT Compliance: The project specifications require meeting Equal Employment Opportunity and On-the-Job Training requirements. Our team is very experienced in ensuring compliance having managed many recent projects with compliance responsibilities. Our team is structured to skillfully perform the duties and efficiently ensure compliance.

Project Schedule: The E&R team has extensive experience with complex project schedules. We partner with the contractor to ensure a thorough baseline schedule incorporating contract requirements, sequencing, and all activities including submittals, utility relocations, and required work effort. Identifying the critical path, schedule logic, resource loading, utility relocation, and key milestones are essential to effective schedule management and ensuring completion within contract time. To maintain focus on the project's critical path, status of utility relocation, and progress towards milestones, we discuss progress at each Weekly Progress Meeting to proactively identify and address potential conflicts to minimize costly delays and project risks. This process allows us to raise an early alarm if the contractor begins missing milestones, engage executive management in partnering for solutions, ensure Polk County is protected from liability, and assist in identifying and helping the contractor implement plans to keep the project within goals for time.

We also help the contractor accelerate through evaluating opportunities for concurrent work or mitigating unforeseen issues by identifying alternate work areas or alternate approaches to minimize impact. This Team's recently completed US 27 at SR 60 interchange reconstruction project is an example of how our partnering approach was used very successfully, accelerating the project through multiple opportunities (setting beams over a 3-day weekend closure saving 10 weeks of nightly detours of US 27; rephasing concrete pavement at major intersections, eliminating a bridge construction phase, etc.) leading to the contractor **finishing the project seven months early** to the benefit of the traveling public and the client.

Every one of this team's projects in the last seven years has finished on time and two finished significantly ahead of allowable time providing significant value. Early finish combined with our efficient staff utilization has allowed us to return over \$2.3M to our client in unused CEI dollars providing another significant added value from our services.

Microsoft Collaboration Site: E&R utilizes a Microsoft collaboration site for project documentation, materials testing, RFI's, Shop Drawings, meeting minutes, project photos, and a host of other documents. The site allows for specific access to be granted to different users for different areas like sitewide for Polk County staff or folder specific access to the contractor and Engineer of Record for submittal/ users for different areas like sitewide for Polk County staff or folder specific access to the contractor and Engineer of Record for submittal/ response to items such as RFI, RFM, and shop drawing submittals. This allows efficient flow of documents without going through a "pass through" person. We have found this saves approximately two days per submittal for responses returned to the contractor. One of the key features is materials testing. We utilize an Excel spreadsheet for sample documentation; once a sample is uploaded and sent to the laboratory, then they input the results in the excel file where inspection staff can retrieve the results in the field.

Materials: E&R has teamed with an exceptional geotechnical firm in Roberts Consulting Services (RCS). Their FDOT certified geotechnical laboratory, located in Auburndale, is within 30 minutes of the project. E&R and RCS have completed several projects together and understand the commitment to expedited material sampling and testing. RCS is also very familiar with using E&R's Microsoft collaboration site for efficient documentation of samples and test results. E&R utilizes an excel spreadsheet to document quality control testing, verification testing, and if required resolution testing per contract specifications. If resolution testing is needed, a third party, FDOT certified, engineering and testing laboratory will be utilized.

Technology: E&R embraces technology and utilizes multiple resources to provide our clients with better project documentation at reduced costs. E&R owns and utilizes GPS Rovers to review contractor earthwork construction including checking control, lift thicknesses, subsoil excavation, drainage inlet elevations, and pond construction to ensure there are no constructability issues. The use of GPS Rovers is also **Value Added** as E&R has found this has saved our clients additional money in surveying by limiting the need for a survey team to only checking initial established control and final as-built plans and stormwater checks for permit close-out. Our team is the only team in the area to submit subsoil final documentation in Trimble reports including a 3D model of the area excavated. E&R also owns and utilizes drones for project documentation, aerial photographs of projects, project issue photographs, construction resource manipulation,

and documentation such as equipment, stockpiles, and materials. E&R also utilizes Bluebeam to overlay plans with multiple MOT phases to ensure there are no issues between phases such as grade, alignment, or differing maintenance of traffic sequences at the same location.

Roadway: As previously mentioned, the contractor will be constructing a 4-lane urban typical section along 1.4 miles of new alignment and the remaining 1,400 ft portion of the project will follow the existing CR 655 alignment which will be reconstructed to the same 4 lane typical section; including curb and gutter, sidewalk and a closed drainage system. The last 1,090 ft will transition the 4 lanes back to the existing 2 lane existing CR 655 roadway.

The cross sections indicate there will be over 213,529 CY of subsoil removal ranging in depth from 1 to 5 feet below existing grade. Issue: One of the most challenging areas of subsoil removal is in the vicinity of the triple barrel box culvert area at station 87+00 (Wahnetta Farms)."



Drainage Canal). At this location, the contractor must remove approximately 5 ft of subsoil, install the 36" trunkline and construct the triple barrel box culvert all while maintaining the canal flows and water quality as there are 28 monitoring sites upstream and downstream. Solution: E&R will work with the contractor to ensure this work is scheduled during the dry season. E&R will also have a Pre-activity Meeting to discuss the contractor's means and methods of diverting flow and box culvert construction methods. Value Added: During construction activities along the canal, E&R will take daily turbidity measurements to ensure water clarity standards are maintained. FDEP requires projects to meet a maximum limit of 29 NTUs above background for turbidity.

Another challenging project feature is that the milling and resurfacing limit at the beginning of the project on SR 540 – Winter Lake Road is within the CSX Railroad right-of-way. The E&R team has extensive experience on multiple projects dealing with CSX requirements and will help the contractor with the significant advanced planning necessary to ensure construction is not impacted by CSX requirements; however there is an Issue: The project plans and specs do not discuss working within the railroad right of way and no mention is made of the need for railroad insurance or the requirement to provide 30-day minimum notification before the work at the track starts. Solution: E&R recommends adding a plan note identifying the requirements for the contractor to coordinate and comply with CSX requirements. E&R will discuss CSX requirements with the contractor, ensure critical activities are accurately reflected in the project schedule, and assist the contractor in successfully meeting CSX requirements to maintain project progress.

Maintenance of Traffic: Maintaining traffic flow for residents and businesses along Snively Ave, Eloise Loop Rd and Rifle Range Rd will be a significant concern. E&R is aware of the BOCC's recent directive wherein all road closures over five days require the approval of the Commissioners. Issue: Several TTCP phases include closure of these roads for extended periods but there is no time limit indicated as to how long those detours may be in effect. Solution: E&R suggests that the EOR evaluate the TTCP plans for alternative solutions to closing the roads and detouring traffic or add notes limiting the number of days the detour can be in place. Issue: The work on US 17 and SR 540 will require a permit from FDOT which will limit the hours that lanes can be closed on those roadways as FDOT has

strict policies about lane closures within 600 ft of a signalized intersection. **Solution:** E&R recommends all lane closure restrictions from final permit plans be added to the TTCP plan notes once Polk County and the EOR are finished working through the permit process with FDOT.

Utilities: E&R is known as an industry leader in utility relocation and has a working relationship with each utility represented in this contract. E&R understands the critical role utility relocation has on a project schedule which is why we start utility coordination prior to the construction



contract. E&R reviews utility work schedules (UWS) and charts the amount of "prior to construction" each utility has which provides us a "must start" date for each utility. We coordinate with the utility, ensure they start prior to that date, or if not we delve into why and how they can recover so as to not impact the contractor's start of construction. <u>Value Added:</u> E&R's office is within 20 minutes of the project so we are able to provide utility coordination and inspection of "prior to construction" work at no additional cost to Polk County.

E&R will maintain this coordinated partnering effort once construction starts and utilities are performing "during construction" relocation efforts. E&R has been very successful partnering with utility companies to complete their relocation efforts within contract schedule and in several cases we were able to accelerate completion. However, there are certain instances where utilities were unable to meet their UWS obligations and E&R has been able to mediate over \$500,000 of claims between utility companies and contractors outside of the construction contract, so the settlement becomes a private transaction rather than a contract claim thereby saving our clients money and resources to recover those funds.

There are two water lines (6 and 8-inch) to be installed as part of the construction contract for the City of Eagle Lake. E&R has completed many miles of utility work by highway contractor (UWHCA); most recently for the City of Winter Haven and Town of Dundee. E&R personnel have also administered many contracts utilizing Polk County Utilities (PCU) standards for water installations. E&R team members have utilized Specification 450 of the Polk County Utilities and Specifications Manual previously including the checklist for appropriate installations. As an extension of Polk County on this project, you can rest assured E&R understands the specific requirements of 450A. E&R will be present during all stages of the acceptance process. We will document each step in 450A including the hydraulically cleaning of pressure mains by the swabbing method, hydraulic pressure testing utilizing form 450E for PVC or DI piping, disinfection of at



least 25 mg/liter with at least 10 mg/liter after 16 hours, and ensure the contractor flushes the lines and bacteriological samples are taken at approved sampling points and submitted to a private laboratory certified by the State of Florida. Once all testing and reports are received, E&R will package them together for final Polk County approval and submittal to FDEP for clearance to place the system in service.

Environmental: E&R has reviewed contract documents and specifications for environmental considerations to include approved SWFWMD ERP permit 829041 / 43035591.002. The special provision specifications package details several endangered species that are present on the project and protection requirements that must be met. The Scrub-Jay is one that has significant requirements per the specifications including installation of an exclusionary silt fence around Scrub-Jay habitat detailed in the plans. Issue: The 100% plans only show basic silt fence placement along the corridor and do not depict any exclusionary silt fence placement. Solution: We recommend having the design team provide the exclusionary fence in the plans and note them the locations in the summary of quantities. Gopher Tortoise burrows are noted in the specifications with requirements of silt fence installation for burrow avoidance as instructed in Specifications 104. There is Eastern Indigo snake habitat noted in the specifications with requirements to implement standard protection measures published by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife. Value Added: Michael Conn is an industry leader in environmental rules and regulations as it pertains to endangered species in conflict with construction projects. Michael has worked with E&R on several major projects and has assisted our clients with reporting, relocation, and processing of required documentation of endangered species. As needed and at least quarterly, Michael will visit the project to ensure there are no environmental issues and perform QA inspections of the site and documentation to ensure compliance. Michael will also be available as need to help facilitate any discussions with Regulatory Agencies that are required to maintain project schedule.

Safety & Mobility: E&R promotes safety by making all staff responsible for safety reviews; meeting with the contractor prior to a new phase or traffic shift to assess plans for safe transition, construction zone access, appropriate MOT devices, etc.; and participating in contractor safety meetings. Safety & Mobility are discussed at every Progress Meeting. We are also keenly aware of monitoring the installation and maintenance of temporary barrier walls and crash cushions. We stress resolving safety issues timely to ensure safety is a priority. We work with the contractor to address safety and mobility issues through plan review/assessment, pre-implementation planning, inspection, performance monitoring, and providing feedback for making TTCP adjustments. We also ensure that there is a team focus on providing and maintaining safe and delineated pathways for bicyclists and pedestrians.

Quality Assurance: E&R is committed to quality and professional excellence. We have a tiered QA/QC process which starts on the project with staff meetings and review of upcoming work in the two-week look ahead, testing requirements and critical components for inspection. 

Project Description: E&R provided CEI services for the replacement of the US 27/SR 60 interchange with a Single Point Urban Interchange, widening over a mile of both US 27 and SR 60 to 6-lanes with bike lanes, sidewalks and closed drainage systems. US 27 pavement is 9" plain concrete on 4" Asphalt Base; two new ramps are 8.5" plain concrete pavement. SR 60 was asphalt widening and mill & resurface with overbuild and shifted about 50' north across US 27. Project additionally included replacement of the SR 60 bridge over US 27 with a 264', single span, weathering steel bridge as well as multiple types of retaining walls, a noise wall, full roadway lighting, new signals, two new ponds with impermeable liners, and frontage roads/realignment of local roads.





CONTRACTOR CLAIMS MINIMIZATION

We are catalysts to effective construction and proactively manage projects, working with contractors and utilities to facilitate timely completion and mitigate problems to minimize claims and impacts to residents and businesses. Our team has very successfully worked with a variety of contractors with various reputations for cooperation, claims, and completion; however, our partnering approach and dedicated focus on helping achieve a fair conclusion to all issues has resulted in good projects from all contractors. Many of the contractors with which we have a proven, successful history are also well known to Polk County staff including Jr. Davis Construction Co, Ajax Paving Industries, Prince Contracting, Cobb Site Development, and Watson Civil Construction.

This same approach extends to working with local utility owners when installing facilities for them as part of projects and has resulted in local utility owners being very pleased with our dedication to providing an excellent product, on-schedule, avoiding claims, and initiating cost savings. As an example, we did multiple utility installations (over \$6M) for The City of Winter Haven and their assessment of our performance is 95% satisfaction, as shown in the provided Survey Questionnaires.

Our first initiative toward claims avoidance is to help ensure the contract plans and specifications are clear, consistent, feasible, and as "air-tight" as possible so we use a two-prong approach prior to construction. First, as we did on this contract, we perform a constructability review of the Phase IV plans then meet with our clients and the design EOR to discuss our findings and collaborate on the best way to utilize our comments to improve the project and minimize claim potential. Second, at 100% plans we perform a final constructability review to help ensure a cohesive plan set.

Once a contract is awarded, we start meeting informally with the contractor to begin building working relationships, discuss project constraints, and collaboratively develop the approach to a successful project. As the initial base line schedule is developed our review looks to ensure all activities are accurately accounted for but beyond that we look for avenues to help the contractor advance his schedule and shorten the critical path. We suggest concurrent work opportunities, including rephasing of work or additional work areas to mitigate issues or to provide more efficient construction to gain float in the schedule. This forward thinking helps build a reserve of float time which can be used to minimize claims if there are delays. This schedule advancement has the added benefit of increasing the potential for finishing early, saving money for our clients, and providing a new roadway facility to the traveling public. This team's most recent project, US 27 at SR 60, started with the contractor submitting an initial claim for 575 days and 1.2 million dollars. Through intense schedule analysis, innovation, and daily contractor interactions, the E&R team found opportunities for concurrent work in concrete pavement activities by combining multiple MOT phases into a single phase. Additionally, E&R found an opportunity to gain significant time by working with the City of Lake Wales and the freight community to allow the closure of the US 27 over a 3-day weekend instead of the 3 months of nightly closures for setting the steel girders. E&R championed this endeavor through the FDOT Executive team to the Governor's office. As a result of this and other time-saving measures, the contractor dropped their initial claim and the project was **completed on budget, seven months early.**

Claim minimization is a daily effort. Our Project Administrator (PA) walks the project every morning with the contractor's PM to review areas of concern prior to the contractor's work starting. This proactive identification of problems allows the PA to immediately resolve those issues he can and gives time to consult with other parties to address more complex issues. Early identification not only eliminates claims for rework, it also allows the PA and PM to find other work areas while the issue is resolved which avoids/minimizes extra cost claims. For example, on our US 27/SR 60 project our PA and contractor PM discussing upcoming storm drainage operations on the new Frontage Rd determined utility relocations were not as they should be so to avoid delay the PA identified work in a separate phase on SR 60 placing storm drain and the PM moved his crews there. This eliminated a cost claim for idle labor and equipment and provided time to have the utility fully relocate and not delay the contractor when they returned to Frontage Rd.

Our experience is that items discussed weekly at progress meetings ensure all parties are engaged in fixing issues prior to them becoming a delay or claim. We discuss schedule, each utility in detail, as well as RFI's, RFM's and other submittals. We ask at each meeting if the contractor sees any potential issues or concerns. Once a concern is brought up, then it is tracked with "ball-in-court" accountability and discussed at every meeting until resolution.

Utilities are critical to a successful project and key in claims minimization. The utility work schedule may not always align with the temporary traffic control plans. New utility lines need to be placed before existing lines can be taken out of service and removed. Our focus on these critical interactions during schedule reviews and discussion of upcoming work activities allows us to get ahead of potential utility conflicts which can result in costly delay claims. Case in point, on our SR 542 project, the E&R team determined there was a conflict with storm sewer installation and existing Duke Distribution poles that were to be replaced with new facilities at the right-of way line. E&R coordinated a field meeting with Duke Energy and all sub-leased utilities on the poles to develop a plan of action that, when implemented, successfully relocated all poles well before the contractor's drainage crew reached the location eliminating a major claim.



TIMELY COMPLETION OF PROJECTS

Having the right technical and experienced personnel is extremely important to the success of a project. Equally important is making sure that the personnel are available to properly handle the task or project assigned. The E&R team manages our resources like we do our CEI projects, with in-depth scheduling and project reviews to make sure the right team has the right availability to successfully manage the Thompson Nursery Road Project in Polk County.

The E&R team has the experience, ability and the knowledge to manage multiple concurrent activities. From our Project Administrator to the Field Inspector, we are cross-trained in technical aspects to effectively cover operations as needed and trained in Time Management and Project Management to efficiently provide proper oversight regardless of the size, complexity or length of the construction project.

We understand that this contract may have a construction schedule duration of +/- 24 months. Our CEI project team members are phasing out of current projects beginning August 2025 and will be fully available to start this project on Day One. The E&R team has the strength in personnel, experience and commitment to provide Polk County with the qualified engineers, project administrators and inspectors needed at any time. With a combined resource staff of over 170 CEI personnel in the state of Florida, our team can easily ramp up or adjust the number of staff needed to meet the County's CEI project needs.

Once assigned, we will commit our resources to Thompson Nursery Road until the project is completed in its entirety - from Task 1 (CEI for Segment One - US 17 to Rifle Range Road) through Optional Serivces in Tasks 2, 3 and 4. With an estimated construction duration of 24 months for Task 1, we estimate a requirement of approximately 20,000 inspection staff hours to complete our assignment. We have the resources the County requires to perform CEI services in coordination with the contractor and in compliance with Polk County. We commit the personnel outlined in our proposed project team for the CEI Services for Thompson Nursery Road. We have evaluated the existing and projected workload of each team member and have realistically projected their time available to devote to this project.

Based on the subject Scope of Services, E&R's team estimates +/- 20,000 inspection staff hours to execute full services for the project. Based on the projected workload of the E&R team over next 24 months, we are able to provide Polk County additional staff as needed to complete the project tasks. In addition to the proposed team members, we have additional personnel who are available to assist any time it is necessary. We believe the integration of our organization with team members from our qualified subconsultants provides us sufficient size and talent to be able to act swiftly to any request by Polk County. SCOPE OF SERVICES

Construction Engineering and Inspection (CEI) Services

Thompson Nursery Road Extension – Segment 1

Polk County

Prepared by: Eisman & Russo, Inc.

1. DESCRIPTION

Polk County (the "County") has selected Eisman & Russo, Inc. (the "Consultant") to provide Construction Engineering and Inspection (CEI) services for the Thompson Nursery Road Extension - Segment 1 project. The Consultant will act as the County's representative to oversee and administer the construction contract, ensuring the project is completed in reasonable conformance with the plans, specifications, and applicable regulations.

The Consultant will manage construction activities from pre-construction through final acceptance and post-construction close-out.

2. SCOPE OF SERVICES

A. General Contract Administration

- Administer, monitor, and inspect the Construction Contract in accordance with County guidelines.
- Serve as the County's primary representative for field operations.
- Coordinate and document pre-construction conferences.
- Maintain contract files, correspondence logs, and decision records throughout the construction duration.
- Conduct progress meetings.
- Coordinate with the Design Engineer of Record (EOR) prior to construction and during construction to address plan discrepancies, clarifications, or respond to Contractor requests for information.

B. On-Site Inspection and Oversight

- Provide qualified field personnel to monitor the Contractor's daily operations.
- Inspect the work to ensure reasonable compliance with contract documents and acceptable quality standards.
- Maintain detailed daily reports and photographic documentation of construction activities.
- Monitor compliance with the approved Work Zone Traffic Control Plan, including reviewing modifications.

C. Sampling and Testing

- Coordinate and arrange for materials testing through an independent, certified laboratory.
- Review testing results and verify materials meet contract specifications.
- For any materials not meeting contract requirements, coordinate investigation and evaluation of materials, assessment of acceptability, and final disposition.
- Maintain documentation of material certifications, sample logs, and testing results.
- Prepare a comprehensive materials summary upon project completion.



D. Construction Contract Management

- Review and respond to Requests for Information (RFIs) and shop drawings.
- Track, review, and recommend approval or rejection of contract change orders and contractor claims.
- Monitor compliance with project schedules, including baseline schedule reviews and monthly updates.
- Review contractors' requests for monthly progress payments and, if appropriate, certify pay application is proper and transmit to County with recommendation that the invoice be paid.
- Verify quantity calculation and field measure for payment purposes as needed to
 prevent delays in Contractor operations and facilitate prompt processing of such
 information for the County to make timely payment to the Contractor.
- Direct the contractor, after consultation with the County, on removal and replacement
 of defective work which does not meet specifications or is otherwise incorrectly
 constructed.
- Coordinate with the County and Design EOR in the event of the need to revise the contract drawings during the construction period.

E. Utility Coordination

- Facilitate coordination with utility companies and contractors in assisting conflict avoidance and resolution.
- Monitor utility relocation and installation activities for conformance with contract documents.
- Track and maintain documentation of utility adjustments and approvals.
- Assist the EOR, Contractor, and Utility Owner with resolving utility conflicts to ensure there are limited impacts.

F. Stormwater and Environmental Compliance

- Verify contractor compliance with erosion and sedimentation control measures.
- Ensure stormwater pollution prevention plans (SWPPP) are properly implemented and documented.
- When a NPDES General Permit is required, provide at least one inspector who has successfully completed the "Florida Storm Water, Erosion, and Sedimentation Control Training and Certification Program for Inspectors and Contractors".

G. Public Involvement & Documentation

- Document issues of public concern and maintain a photo log of the project.
- Record and archive digital video of pre-construction conditions and significant construction events.
- Conduct coordination meetings and prepare minutes to distribute to relevant parties.



H. Quality Assurance and Plan

- Prepare and maintain a QA Plan for the County's approval within 30 days of Notice to Proceed.
- Perform quality reviews and internal audits to ensure compliance with CEI responsibilities.
- Maintain all project records in accordance with the County's file management requirements and Public Records Law.
- Provide verification of the Contractor's activities on the project site and perform the sampling and testing of materials and completed work items that are normally done in the vicinity of the project.
- Provide verification samples determining the acceptability of materials and completed work items on the basis of either test results or verification of a certification, certified mill analysis, DOT label, DOT stamp, etc.
- Provide sampling, testing, and laboratory methods as required by the construction contract documents or as modified by the County.
- Documentation reports on the sampling and testing performed will be maintained in the project files and submitted to the County upon request.

I. Contractor Final Payment Request

- Prepare documentation and records in compliance with the Consultant's approved QA Plan and County procedures.
- Submit the Final Estimate within thirty (30) calendar days of final acceptance or where all items of work are complete and conditional / partial acceptance is utilized by the County.
- A scope of any items the County requests to be partially accepted will be provided to the County's Project Manager detailing each item.
- If final as-builts are recommended for disapproval, monitor contractor's preparation of revised final as-built drawings.
- Generate a punch list for the Contractor and ensuring all items are resolved timely.
- Submit a final project report and final pay estimate within 30 calendar days of project acceptance.
- Provide close-out documentation for individual Environmental Resource Permit (ERP) or USACOE Permit.

3. COMPENSATION

Compensation for services rendered under this CEI Contract will be reimbursed based on agreed upon hourly rates and hours worked on the project. The hourly rates will cover all labor, materials, equipment, and other direct costs associated with the services. Any modifications to the scope of work or adjustments to the compensation must be formally approved by Polk County through an official amendment process.
