M.2. Chair Braswell Comments.

Minutes: Chair Braswell said he borrowed a radio from the Emergency Operations Center and listened to what was going on as the wind was blowing 100 mph. He said people's roofs were collapsing on them, we know how much water was on the road and it was crazy to listen to the radio and to hear the sheriff, firefighters and paramedics not bat an eye. He said it was I am done with this do you got something else for me. He said it was impressive and it was bizarre when they were getting phone calls that it's 2:00 in the morning and they decided to go to a shelter with the winds blowing 80 mph. He said people are stupid and are going to keep being stupid in these events and we are going to have people like fire fighters and sheriffs pulling them out of a bad situation. He said it is amazing to him what was going on and it was non-stop. He said when the winds got up so high that the ambulance could not run, the paramedics got in the back seat of a deputies car and still made the run. He said these guy do not bat an eye about putting themselves in harms way. He said he is genuinely impressed. He said we got a lot of work to do, we have a lot of recovery, a lot of flooding, and it is unfortunate but this is going to be a long term recovery.

Minutes

Minutes: County Manager Bill Beasley said yesterday at the Agenda Review Paul Womble gave a comprehensive overview. He said he is going to re-cover six of those areas. He said the storm came in late Wednesday early Thursday morning and left Polk with 12-15 inches of rain. He stated a lot of the heavy rains were in the western portion of the county. He said the soil conditions in the eastern portion can weather heavier, larger amounts of rain better than some of the western sections. He said at the height of the storm we saw sustained winds at 60-65 mph and the highest gusts were 103 mph. He said we had opened 20 shelters with a total capacity of 37,000 people. He said there were 6,700 people at the shelters and within a few days we got out of the shelter business. He said people went to where they needed to be and we closed those shelters. He said the restoration of power is everything towards recovery. He said we are down to less than 5% without power. He said at the height of the storm 60% were without power. He said we have seen localized flooding at different parts of the county in both the east and the west but it was highly concentrated in the west. He said with Hurricane Helene we saw rains within the range of 12-15 inches and some areas may have seen 16-18 inches of rain.

Planning and Development Director Ben Dunn discussed the damage assessments. He said 42 teams were deployed after the storm and 70% of the damages were in the northwest quad of the county. He said there were 38 destroyed structures, 422 with major damages and 1,300 with minor destruction. He said they assessed over 22,000 properties. He said for the major and destroyed structures a lot of that was from intrusions from trees onto roofs and into structures. He said this was a huge rain event. He said they used drones and swamp buggies from the Sheriff's office.

Upon question, Mr. Dunn said the sinkhole has not reached the county right-of-way and it is on private property. He said the Sheriff's office helped the gentleman and brought him to a shelter.

Mr. Beasley discussed public distribution of food and water. He said stores are reopening, power is restored and fuel is reflowing. He said the community is coming back to normal fairly quickly. He said the county is starting the debris management

program. He said the private haulers are going where the bigger money is and where the denser communities are. He said the state has jacked up the rate fairly well; he said Hillsborough County, Pinellas County are all increasing their collection rates and he may come back to the Board in the future with a contract rate adjustment to keep the trucks coming to Polk so they do not leave for higher wages in other jurisdictions.

Chair Braswell said we are lucky and there is a lot of debris but it is not like Irma or Ian. He said it is concentrated in areas. He said this was a rain event because there are still too many white plastic fences standing.

Mr. Beasley said they are not shortening us with the trucks and the private companies are going where the bigger money is being offered. He said Polk is a large county and there is a lot of windshield time in Polk County. He said other counties are incentivizing with higher rates.

Commissioner Combee said we need to ask if AshBritt is working in the counties that are paying more.

Mr. Beasley said it is a multi-year contract.

Commissioner Combee said the rain that fell probably fell in a 6 hour period. He said it is going to take a while for it to drain down and it obviously is getting better. He said the reason old timers have not seen this before is because they were not around the last time that it happened and was when Noah was on the ark. He said he is proud of everybody.

Commissioner Santiago said she is glad that the debris removal started yesterday. She said we had tremendous rain in a short amount of time and it is not going to go away very quickly. She asked people to be patient because staff is working very hard to get it cleaned up and back to normal. She said it is not going to happen over night. She said to be patient and she has a huge log in her yard from a tree and she knows what she is talking about with patience.

Commissioner Wilson said he has gotten a lot of calls worried about Peace River. He said they are not opening any gates. He said the incoming water into Lake Hancock and what it going out has just about equaled out. He said SWFWMD has done a great job working with us on certain things. He said unless there is a major catastrophe they are not opening flood gates P-8 or P-11. He said he looks at it every day at his house and for the last four days on his side nothing has changed.

Upon question, Mr. Beasley said under the Emergency Order he does have the latitude to adjust for the haulers to keep them here. He said there were three federal congress people at the Emergency Operations Center; Congressman Franklin, Congresswoman Lee, and Congressman Soto. He said that state reps were there regularly; Senator Burton, Representative Canady, all five constitutional officers, and a number of Board members present at different times. He said that sends a message to the staff that you got their back and will provide whatever resources are necessary. He said he cannot tell them how reassuring it was to see that kind of leadership. He said we had the tragic fatality and it accents the hazards that these men and women face.
