Summary:

The applicant is requesting a variance to Chapter 2, Section 209.G of the Land Development Code (LDC) for the construction of an accessory structure larger and taller than the primary residence. According to the applicant, the detached building will be about 90' x 60' (5,400 sq. ft.) on a slab foundation and approximately 20 feet high. This accessory structure is almost five times larger than the primary residence, however, the proposal meets setbacks and the storage is necessary to accommodate and secure construction materials, appliances, personal and recreational vehicles, a boat, as well as lawn equipment. They have determined these structural dimensions suit their storage needs. Pursuant to Section 209.G of the LDC, an accessory structure may be permitted to be larger in square footage and in height of the principal structure following approval from the Land Use Hearing Officer (LUHO) pursuant to Sections 930 and 931.

Staff finds that the request meets the following criteria listed in Section 931:

• The request will not be injurious to the area involved or otherwise detrimental to the public welfare as the building is located to the rear of the property while meeting all

accessory setback requirements. Additionally, it is not anticipated to impact the livelihood or safety of the abutting and adjacent property owners.

Development Review Committee

The Development Review Committee, based on the criteria for granting variances, the submitted application, and a recent site visit, finds that the applicant's request as written **IS CONSISTENT** with Section 931 of the Polk County Land Development Code (LDC) and recommends **APPROVAL of LDLVAR-2025-54**

CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL:

- 1. Approval of this variance is to allow an accessory structure (5,400 sq. ft., 20 feet high) that is larger and taller than the primary structure (1,092 sq. ft., 14 feet high) as described in the staff report. Further additions or structures placed on the property shall be required to meet the requirements of Chapter 2 of the Polk County Land Development Code or re-apply for another variance approval from the Land Use Hearing Officer.
- 2. The applicant shall have one (1) year from the date the Land Use Hearing Officer's Final Order is rendered to apply for all necessary building permits and pay all associated fees for the proposed addition.
- 3. The use of the accessory structure approved herein is limited to the storage of items associated with the residential use of this property. No home-based business or commercial uses shall be permitted to occur within the accessory structure.
- 4. This variance does not authorize any encroachments into easements, and the applicant shall be responsible to make certain there are no encroachments unless approval is granted by the easement holder and/or any applicable permitting agencies. The property owner(s) is also responsible for compliance with any restrictions of record pertaining to lots and/or land and this approval shall not be used to supersede authority over those restrictions.

GENERAL NOTES

- NOTE: This staff report was prepared without the benefit of testimony and evidence submitted by the public and other parties at a public hearing.
- NOTE: Approval of this variance shall not constitute a waiver or an additional variance from any applicable development regulation unless specifically noted in the conditions of approval and consistent with the LDC.
- NOTE: All conditions of approval, unless otherwise specified, shall be met prior to the effectiveness and validity of the variance approval.
- NOTE: All written commitments made in the application and subsequent submission of information made during the application review process, which are on file with the Land Development Division, shall be considered to be binding upon the applicant, provided such commitments are not at variance with the Comprehensive Plan, LDC or other development regulations in effect at the time of development.
- NOTE: Issuance of a development permit by the county does not in any way create any rights on the part of the applicant to obtain a permit from a state or federal agency and does not create any liability on the part of the County for issuance of the permit if the applicant fails to obtain requisite approvals or fulfill the obligations imposed by a state or federal agency or undertakes actions that result in a violation of state or federal law.

DEMONSTRATIONS OF THE CRITERIA FOR GRANTING VARIANCES SUMMARIZED BELOW:

1. Whether granting the variance will be in accordance with the general intent and purpose of this Code, and that the variance will not be injurious to the area involved or otherwise detrimental to the public welfare;

Granting this variance will not be injurious to the area or otherwise detrimental to the public welfare. The applicant requests a 90' x 60' accessory structure which is greater in size and height than the primary home. According to the applicant's site plan, the structure will be approximately ten (10) feet from the rear yard and seven (7) feet from the side yard. The proposed accessory structure is anticipated to be twenty (20) feet tall, which is approximately six (6) feet taller than the single-family home.

The primary residence is a 1,092 sq. ft. single-family home constructed in 1962. While the accessory structure is much larger than the existing residence, it will be over 100 feet behind the home and adhere to the 5-foot setback requirements in the RL-4 district. Additionally, eleven (11) multifamily units to the west as well as the potential uses on the vacant properties designated Business Park Center-2 (BPC-2) to the north are more intense in form and function. Aerials indicate the closest neighboring structure is a 700 sq. ft. non-residential structure (permit #: 92093) approximately 32 feet, to the north. An accessory structure for storage is not uncommon, and this proposal will be allowed for residential purposes only. The subject property is large enough to support the structure and maintain an ample distance from property lines.

2. Whether special conditions and circumstances exist which are peculiar to the land, structure, or building involved and which are not applicable to other lands, structures, or buildings in the applicable land use district;

The subject property is more than six times larger than the typical district standard. Minimum lot sizes are 6,000 square feet in the RL-4 land use district, which this site exceeds by over 32,000 square feet. Up until 2009, the property was known as the Oak Breeze Mobile Home Park with eleven (11) mobile home spaces as well as a single-family dwelling. The mobile home park was a legal non-conforming use that existed prior to any zoning regulations (LIC-H-1628). The mobile homes were removed sometime in 2009. Currently, the property consists of a 1962 1,092 sq. ft. single-family residence.

To the west, ten (10) multifamily buildings, each consisting of two (2) units, are owned by the City of Lakeland and have provided affordable housing since 1981. Existing vegetation flanks the sides and rear boundaries of the subject property. The applicant's home is set back approximately 40 feet from the roadway, and any accessory structure would be required to be placed behind the front of the home, limiting the placement of the structure.

3. Whether provided the special conditions and circumstances present in the request do not result from the actions of the applicant;

Per conversations with the applicant, the enclosed structure is to store construction materials, appliances, personal and recreational vehicles, a boat, as well as lawn equipment. They have determined these dimensions suit their storage needs. The proposed metal building, at 5,400 sq. ft., will be almost five times larger than the primary home, however the storage provides an orderly means of keeping belongings inside. As part of the conditions, no home-based

business or commercial uses shall be permitted to occur within the accessory structure. The site plan shows that it is set well off from any roads and is screened from adjacent properties.

4. Whether granting the requested variance will not confer on the applicant any special privilege that is denied by the provisions of this Code and will constitute unnecessary and undue hardship on the applicant;

Accessory structures are permitted in residential land use districts, and structures such as this - as long as it has a permanent foundation, a rigid roof, meets setbacks and building standards, and is in the rear or side yard. The request provides the ability to shelter construction materials, equipment, and personal vehicles within one building. Otherwise, the applicant will have to resort to offsite storage which will incur further financial costs. A list of potential items stored in this accessory structure are provided in the applicant's justification (*Exhibit* 6).

Per Chapter 2, Table 2.2, of the LDC, the RL-4 land use district requires accessory structure setbacks of 35 feet off Urban Collector roadways and side and rear yard setbacks of 5 feet. Rear and side yard setbacks for the accessory storage structure are 10 feet and 7 feet respectively. This structure meets these setbacks without requiring a variance.

5. Whether the variance granted is the minimum variance that will make possible the reasonable use of the land, building, or structure;

The requested variance is believed to be the minimal variance necessary to optimize the use of the owner's land and the applicant has taken care to provide the right space for the accessory structure to the side of the home. Per the Land Development Code, accessory structures are incidental to the principal structure. While greater than the principal structure, the structure will be used for storage of work materials and equipment.

This variance should not be construed as approving any home occupation or short-term rental at this location. Home occupations are subject to Section 559.955 Florida Statues and LDC Section 206.E while short-term rentals are subject to Chapter 509 Florida Statues and LDC Section 303. Home occupations and short-term rentals are not permitted to be operated from accessory structures.

6. Whether that in no case shall a variance be granted which will result in a change of land use that would not be permitted in the applicable land use designation;

Granting this variance will not result in a change of land use. The single-family home will remain a residential use in a residential district.

7. Whether that in no case shall a variance be granted which would result in creation of any residual lot or parcel which does not meet the requirements of this Code; and

Granting this request is not anticipated to result in the creation of a lot or parcel that does not meet the requirements of the Code.

8. Whether that the granting of the variance does not circumvent a condition or the intent of a condition placed on a development by the Planning Commission or the BoCC.

There was no evidence found that suggests the proposed request will circumvent the intent of a condition placed on a development by the Planning Commission or the Board of County Commissioners.

The property is about 0.88 acres and located in a RL-4 land use district. The site was previously known as the Oak Breeze Mobile Home Park (MHP), established sometime prior to 1971 according to historical aerial imagery. The single-family home was constructed in 1962 with 11 mobile home spaces following shortly thereafter. The mobile home park was a legal non-conforming use, predating the first zoning ordinance in 1970 (*Ord 70-3*), and had Commercial-4 (C-4) zoning. After the Comprehensive Plan was adopted in 1991, the property was designated as a non-commercial use of Residential Low-4 (RL-4).

In 2009, the eleven mobile homes were demolished and the MHP license was officially nullified in 2018 (LIC-H-1628). The single-family home remained on the site, and the current owners purchased the property in 2013. According to Table 2.2 of the LDC, the site requires minimum lot sizes of 6,000 square feet, which this property exceeds by more than six times that requirement. The residence backs up to an affordable housing complex consisting of 10 multifamily units constructed in 1981. Abutting the north are properties part of the Highway Heights Subdivision plat (PB 8, PG 23) and are within the Business Park Center-2 (BPC-2) land use designation. These tracts consist of one (1) single-family home, vacant lands, and about a 700 sq. ft. commercial structure (permit #992093) constructed in 2007. Staff found one accessory structure variance found within a one-mile radius of the site which is to the north off of Dille Street. The variance was approved to allow an ADU to exceed the height of the primary dwelling on site (LDLVAR-2025-30).

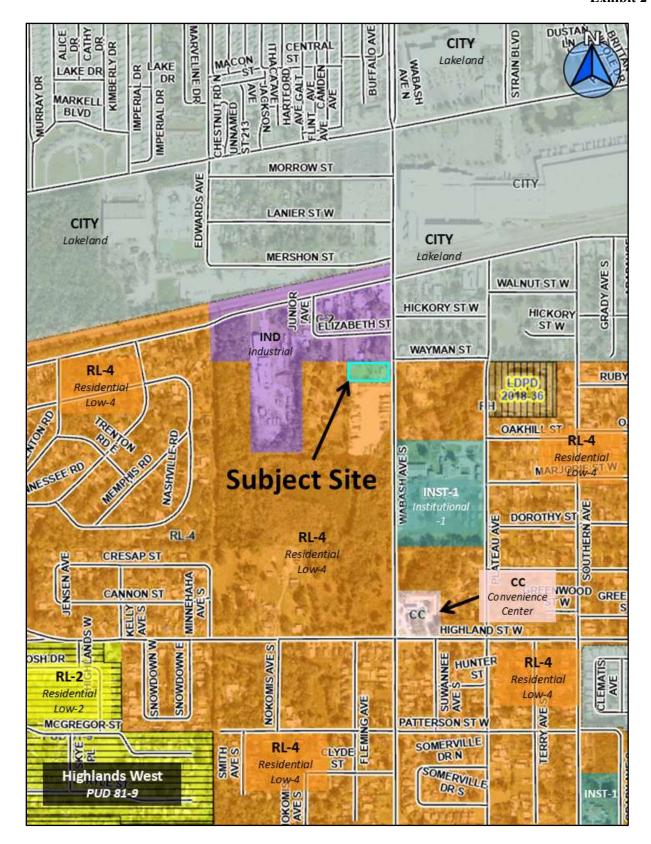

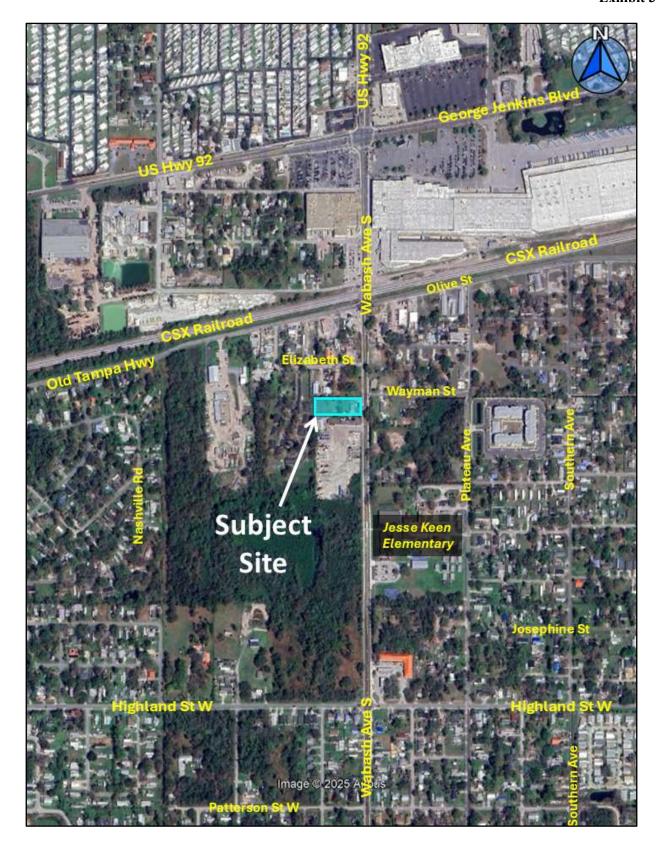

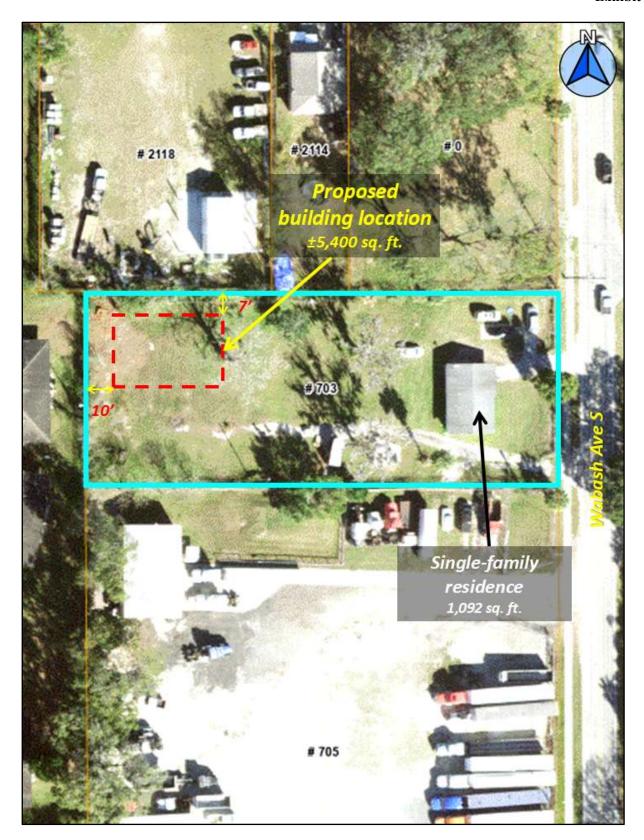
Location Map



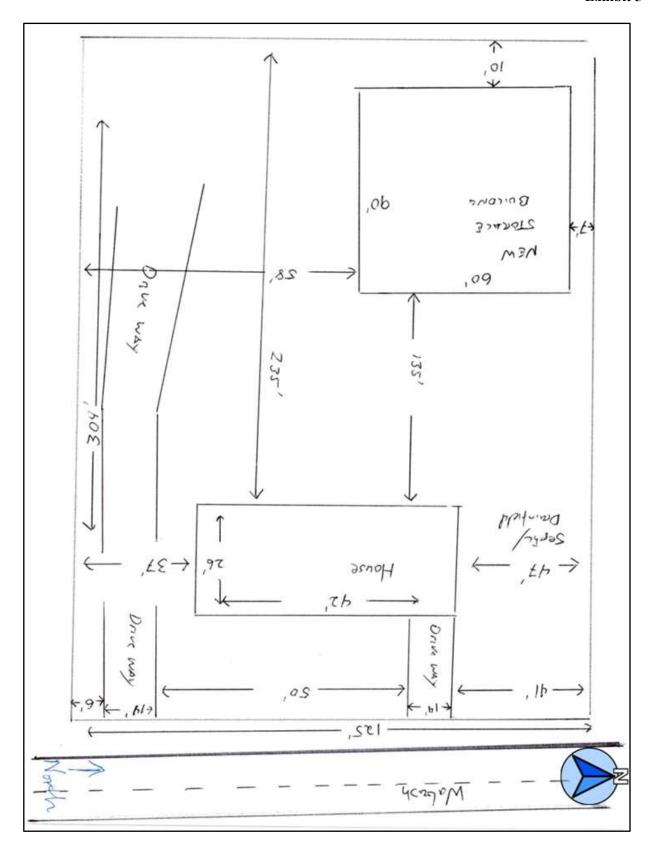
Future Land Use Map

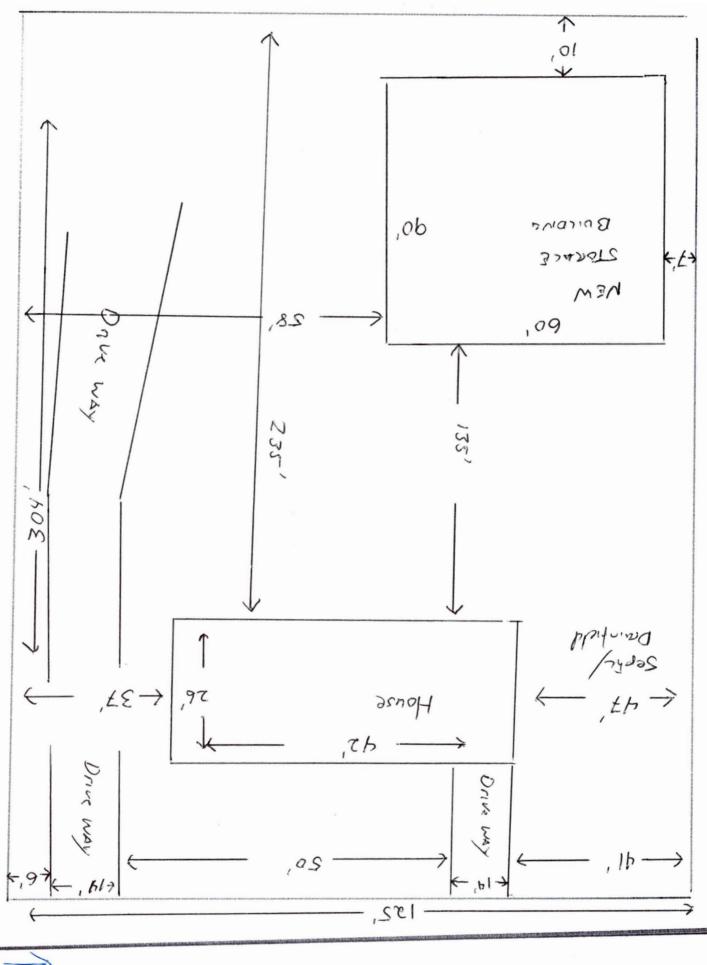

Plus the property at Wabash is already entirely fenced with 8 foot fencing.

Summary:

The applicant is requesting a special exception to park a commercial vehicle on residential property within an Agricultural/Residential Rural (A/RR) land use district east of Lake Wales (Exhibit 2). This commercial vehicle is a 2006 Ford Sterling dump truck. The truck is 10' high and 34' long. No trailer is included in this request. Section 216.D of the Land Development Code (LDC) allows Commercial Vehicle Parking on residential properties pursuant to the rules detailed in this section and approval from the Land Use Hearing Officer following an advertised public hearing.

The subject property is approximately 0.94 acres in a rural area with ample room to park the vehicle in the rear yard, between the home and the eastern property line, as presented on the site plan (*Exhibits 4 & 5*). The depicted parking area will exceed 20 feet from all property lines. To meet LDC requirements, a Type "B" landscaping buffer or six-foot opaque fence will be required along the rear and portions of the side property lines. Amid an overall low rural density and offsite vegetation, however, few visual impacts on neighbors are anticipated. The site is approximately 1.25 miles from SR-60, a major thoroughfare. Few alternatives to commercial vehicle parking are in the area. With the proposed conditions, staff recommends approval of this application.

Development Review Committee

The Development Review Committee, based on the criteria for granting Special Exceptions, finds that LDLSE-2025-9 **IS CONSISTENT** with Section 216.D of the Polk County Land Development Code.

Development Review Committee Recommendation: Based upon the application and a recent site visit, the Development Review Committee recommends **APPROVAL of LDLSE-2025-9**.

CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL:

- 1. This Special Exception shall be limited to parking the subject commercial vehicle, or its functional equivalent, as described in the application and staff report. No other commercial vehicles, heavy machinery equipment, or tractor/trailer rigs shall be parked on the site.
- 2. Approval shall not be transferable to any other owner/occupant of the property. In the event the property is sold, or the operator ceases to reside on the property, the Special Exception approval shall not "run with the land" and shall be null and void.
- 3. No commercial vehicle maintenance shall be performed on the site, and no outside storage of any commercial vehicle parts or equipment is allowed.
- 4. Parking the commercial vehicle on the operator's lot shall be limited to empty weight only (no load or cargo).
- 5. This special exception does not authorize any encroachments into easements, and the applicant shall be responsible to make certain there are no encroachments unless approval is granted by the easement holder and/or any applicable permitting agencies. The property owner(s) is also responsible for compliance with any restrictions of record pertaining to lots and/or land and this approval shall not be used to supersede authority over those restrictions.
- 6. The commercial vehicle shall only be parked in the area in the side yard as generally designated on the site plan (*Exhibit 5*) and shall continuously meet the screening and buffering requirements listed in Section 216.D, Commercial Vehicle Parking and Storage, of Polk County's Land Development Code.
- 7. Utilization of LDLSE-2025-9 is contingent upon the Applicant either: (i) obtaining a driveway permit and installing a driveway that meets commercial driveway standards per LDC Section 705.J and Table 7.8 with final approval from the Polk County Building Division Driveway Inspector (the "Driveway Inspector"); or (ii) demonstrating to the Driveway Inspector that the existing driveway meets County commercial driveway standards. Final written approval from the Driveway Inspector, whether based on satisfaction of condition (i) or (ii) immediately above, is required prior to parking the commercial vehicle on site.

8. Approval of the Special Exception shall be valid for one year. Approvals may be renewed by the Land Development Division with a proper application submitted by the applicant 30 days prior to the expiration date (TBD by LUHO). Noncompliance with any of the conditions of approval will render LDLSE-2025-9 null and void. All conditions of approval, unless otherwise specified, must be met prior to parking the commercial vehicle on the property.

GENERAL NOTES

NOTE: This staff report was prepared without the benefit of testimony and evidence submitted by the public and other interested parties at a public hearing.

NOTE: Approval of this special exception shall not constitute a waiver or an additional variance from any applicable development regulation unless specifically noted in the conditions of approval and consistent with the LDC.

NOTE: All conditions of approval, unless otherwise specified, shall be met prior to the effectiveness and validity of the special exception approval.

NOTE: All written commitments made in the application and subsequent submissions of information made during the application review process, which are on file with the Land Development Division, shall be considered to be binding upon the applicant, provided such commitments are not at variance with the Comprehensive Plan, LDC or other development regulations in effect at the time of development.

NOTE: Issuance of a development permit by the county does not in any way create any rights on the part of the applicant to obtain a permit from a state or federal agency and does not create any liability on the part of the county for issuance of the permit if the applicant fails to obtain requisite approvals or fulfill the obligations imposed by a state or federal agency or undertakes actions that result in a violation of state or federal law.

APPLICATIONS FOR COMMERCIAL VEHICLE PARKING AND STORAGE SHALL DEMONSTRATE COMPLIANCE WITH SECTION 216 OF THE LAND DEVELOPMENT CODE. DEMONSTRATION OF THE CRITERIA FOR GRANTING SPECIAL EXCEPTIONS FOR COMMERCIAL VEHICLES IS SUMMARIZED BELOW:

1. Only one commercial vehicle, as regulated by this Section 216, shall be permitted on any residential lot:

According to the application, this commercial vehicle is a 2006 Ford Sterling dump truck (10' high and 34' long) that the driver wishes to park at this residence in an A/RR land use district. No trailer is included in this request. LDC Section 216 defines a Commercial Vehicle as one that exceeds 26 feet in length and/or is taller than nine feet. No other commercial vehicles shall be parked onsite.

2. Commercial vehicle shall be currently registered and licensed;

The applicant has supplied a current registration.

3. The parking of said vehicle does not have a negative impact to the health, safety, or welfare of adjacent properties;

Staff finds this request will not have a negative impact upon the health, safety, or welfare of adjacent properties. The subject property is approximately 0.94 acres with access to Tiger Lake Road, a Rural Minor Collector roadway. Due to the standards in Section 216 of the LDC, the applicant is not able to park the vehicle in the front of the home, but there is ample acreage on which to locate the subject vehicle in the rear yard while maintaining a minimum 20-foot setback from the property lines.

According to the site plan, the parking area will be to the east of the existing home. The home will screen the parking area from the public roadway, but since the vehicle parking area will be less than 200 feet from a residentially designated or used property, it needs to be screened from the adjacent residential property with a Type "B" buffer, as outlined in Section 720 (Exhibit 7), or a six-foot opaque fence. Large trees and vegetation on surrounding properties will further screen the parking area. Parked in the manner proposed, very little of the vehicle will be visible from off-site.

This area is rural. Adjacent properties to the east and south are vacant. The only home on adjoining property is to the north and will be a minimum of 135 feet from the parking area. Most properties in the area are close to or exceed an acre, and most homes are set at 80-100 feet from the centerlines of the Tiger Creek Road. It is not anticipated that the operation of this vehicle leaving and arriving at the subject site will have a negative impact on the neighbors.

The paved surface width on Tiger Creek Road is approximately 22 feet, which meets LDC requirements. The nearest arterial road is State Road 60, approximately 1.25 miles to the

south. No commercial vehicle restrictions are noted on this road. No sidewalks are found along the surrounding roadway network, but none would be expected in a rural area such as this. A commercial driveway permit will be required in the Tiger Creek Road right-of-way to protect the integrity of the County's pavement at entrance to the site. No Code Enforcement cases are active on this site.

In summary, staff finds this request will not have a negative impact upon the health, safety, or welfare of adjacent properties if maintained and screened in accordance with the site plan and LDC standards. As of 9/22/25, no Code Enforcement cases are open for this property.

4. The applicant can demonstrate that denial of said request would place an unnecessary hardship on the property prohibiting the use of land in a manner otherwise allowed under this Land Development Code;

The applicant uses the commercial vehicle as a source of income. This truck will be parked here on an as-needed basis. This neighborhood is in an area of the County where other options to park commercial vehicles are limited away from an urbanized area.

On January 4, 2022, the BoCC approved LDCT-2021-15 (Ordinance No. 22-002) which incorporated language into Section 216.C of the LDC that exempted a Special Exception approval for any vehicle or heavy equipment parked or stored within an enclosed structure. In the event this vehicle could be stored in such a manner, the applicant would not be required to provide the landscaping/screen or a commercial driveway.

5. Commercial vehicles must park on the same lot occupied by the owner/operator of the vehicle.

The vehicle will be parked on the same lot occupied by the operator of the vehicle.

6. The vehicle shall not be parked in the front yard of the principal residence.

The applicant's site plan (*Exhibit 5*) indicates the proposed parking area is not located in the front yard of the property.

7. The parking area shall be at least 20 feet from all property boundaries.

The site plan (*Exhibit 5*) calls out the parking area in the rear yard with at least 20 feet of separation from the property lines.

8. The vehicle shall park in a manner so that the minimum amount of vehicle surface is facing the road adjacent to the property unless the vehicle is screened or buffered as provided.

The vehicle will be parked in a manner which exposes minimal view of the truck from the road. The parking area will be at least 290 feet from the centerline of Tiger Creek Road.

The truck will be mostly screened from offsite view by existing vegetation, structures, fencing, and buffered by distance from neighbors.

9. When the vehicle parking area is less than 200 feet from a residentially designated or used property, it shall be buffered from the adjacent residential property with a Type B Buffer as outlined in Section 720. A fence with a minimum height of six feet may be used in lieu of, or in conjunction with, a vegetative buffer yard.

The proposed parking area shall meet the buffer and screening requirements of LDC Section 216.D. Existing structures, fencing, and landscaping will help screen the parking area from offsite, but a Type "B" buffer or six-foot opaque fence will still be required, as noted above.

10. Refrigerator units on vehicles shall not be operated on the site.

The subject commercial vehicle does not include a refrigerator unit.

11. Approvals shall be valid for one year, or for a shorter period as specified by the Land Use Hearing Officer. Approvals may be renewed, with proper application following notice provided by the Land Development Division Director 30 days prior to the expiration date, if the commercial vehicle location is consistent with the Land Development Code. The applicant shall bear the burden in demonstrating that the vehicle parking still meets the criteria of the approved Special Exception and Section 216.

This has been included in the conditions of approval.

This site is approximately +/- 0.94 acres and located within an Agricultural/Residential Rural (A/RR) land use district (*Exhibit 2*). Though this is substandard to the modern A/RR minimum lot

size requirement of five acres, it is a lot of record, having been legally created during a prior zoning ordinance under the Rural Conservation (RC) designation with one-acre minimum lot sizes.

According to the Property Appraiser, the home onsite is a 2,052 sq. ft. Mobile Home built in 2000. The applicant has owned the property since March 2017. The size of the property is important in evaluating this case. If the property was 5-acres or larger, the minimum lot size in A/RR, it would be permitted to have one commercial vehicle without having to apply for a Special Exception. However, this property was created prior to the adoption of the LDC and these standards. On August 26, 2025, LDLSE-2025-7 was approved to allow a 2015 Kenworth T880 semi-truck (10' high and 22' long) at 1452 Tiger Lake Road, approximately 0.10 miles to the north.

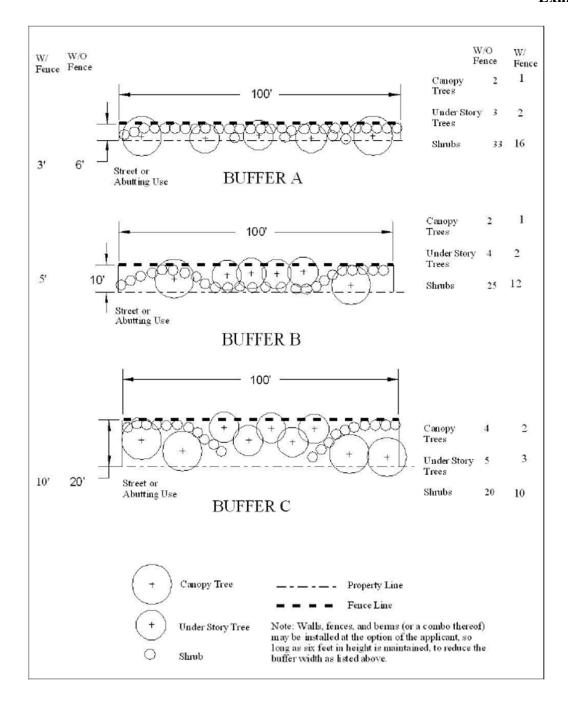


Site Plan

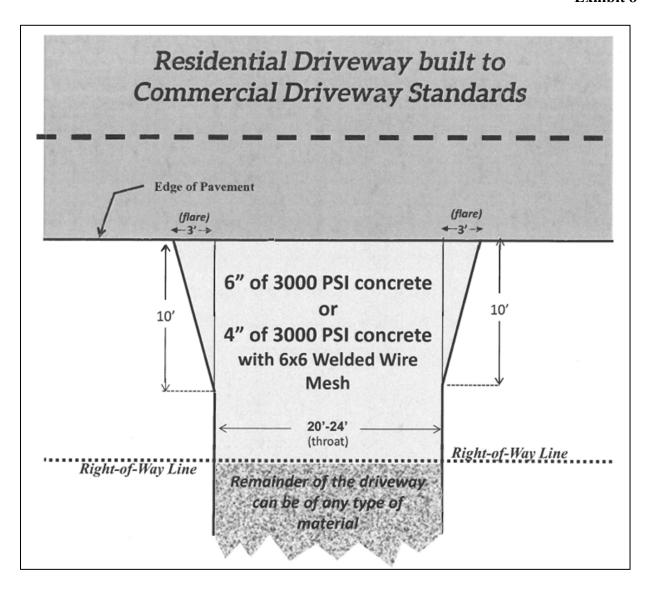

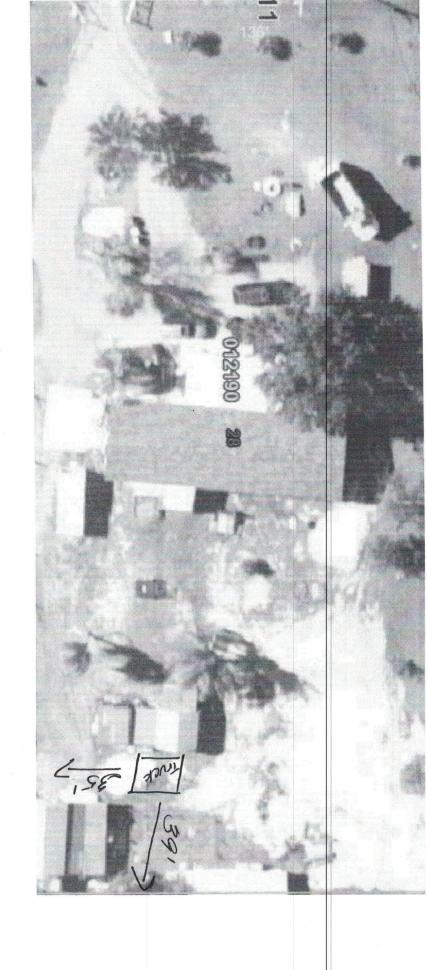

Summary:

This is a request for a Special Exception to allow parking for one commercial vehicle (2005 Peterbilt Model 379) on approximately 0.38 acres of residential property. Section 216.D of the Land Development Code (LDC) allows Commercial Vehicle Parking on residential properties pursuant to the rules detailed in this section and approval from the Land Use Hearing Officer following an advertised public hearing.

According to the application, the vehicle in question is a 2005 Peterbilt. The tractor and trailer are 12.6 feet high with a combined length of 83 feet. The subject property is approximately 0.38 acres with room to park the vehicle while providing adequate buffering from neighboring properties. Since the parking area will be within 200 feet of adjacent residential properties, the property requires a six-foot opaque fence or Type B landscaping bufferyard along portions of the southern and western boundaries or along the immediate parking area in accordance with Section 216 of the LDC. Staff's recent site visit found the eastern and southern property lines have at least a six (6) foot tall opaque fence. The commercial vehicle parking is proposed to be within this space (*Exhibit*

5). A commercial driveway apron onto Lake Lure Loop West, a Local Residential roadway, will be necessary to protect the County roadway from damage. The site has easy access to an arterial roadway, SR 659 (Combee Road North) which is about 800 feet away. Staff recommends approval of this application.

Development Review Committee

The Development Review Committee, based on the criteria for granting variances, the submitted application, and a recent site visit, finds that the applicant's request as written **IS CONSISTENT** with Section 931 of the Polk County Land Development Code (LDC) and recommends **APPROVAL** of **LDLSE-2025-10**

CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL:

- 1. This Special Exception shall be limited to parking one (1) semi-truck and trailer (*Exhibit 8*), or its functional equivalent as described in the application and staff report. No other commercial vehicles, heavy machinery equipment, or tractor/trailer rigs shall be parked on the site.
- 2. Approval of this special exception shall be for the operator (Alberto Aguiar Martinez) of record only. Approval shall not be transferable to any other owner/occupant of the property. In the event the property is sold, or the operator ceases to reside on the property, the Special Exception approval shall not "run with the land" and shall be null and void.
- 3. No commercial vehicle maintenance shall be performed on the site, and no outside storage of any commercial vehicle parts or equipment is allowed.
- 4. Parking the commercial vehicle on the operator's lot shall be limited to empty weight only (no load or cargo).
- 5. This special exception does not authorize any encroachments into easements, and the applicant shall be responsible to make certain there are no encroachments unless approval is granted by the easement holder and/or any applicable permitting agencies. The property owner(s) is also responsible for compliance with any restrictions of record pertaining to lots and/or land and this approval shall not be used to supersede authority over those restrictions.
- 6. The commercial vehicle shall only be parked in the area designated on the site plan (*Exhibit* 5) and shall continuously meet the screening and buffering requirements listed in Section 216.D, Commercial Vehicle Parking and Storage, of Polk County's Land Development Code.
- 7. This commercial vehicle parking approval shall be contingent upon the applicant constructing a driveway to commercial standards for structural thickness and turning radius in accordance with Section 705 of the Land Development Code.

- 8. The property owner(s) is responsible for compliance with any restrictions of record pertaining to lots and/or land and this approval shall not be used to supersede authority over those restrictions.
- 9. Approval of the Special Exception shall be valid for one year. Approvals may be renewed by the Land Development Division with a proper application submitted by the applicant 30 days prior to the expiration date (to be determined by the Land Use Hearing Officer) and evidence is provided to demonstrate that the conditions of approval have been met.
- 10. Noncompliance with any of the conditions of approval will render LDLSE-2025-3 null and void. All conditions of approval, unless otherwise specified, must be met prior to parking the commercial vehicle on the property.

GENERAL NOTES

- *NOTE:* This staff report was prepared without the benefit of testimony and evidence submitted by the public and other parties at a public hearing.
- NOTE: Approval of this variance shall not constitute a waiver or an additional variance from any applicable development regulation unless specifically noted in the conditions of approval and consistent with the LDC.
- NOTE: All conditions of approval, unless otherwise specified, shall be met prior to the effectiveness and validity of the variance approval.
- NOTE: All written commitments made in the application and subsequent submission of information made during the application review process, which are on file with the Land Development Division, shall be considered to be binding upon the applicant, provided such commitments are not at variance with the Comprehensive Plan, LDC or other development regulations in effect at the time of development.
- NOTE: Issuance of a development permit by the county does not in any way create any rights on the part of the applicant to obtain a permit from a state or federal agency and does not create any liability on the part of the County for issuance of the permit if the applicant fails to obtain requisite approvals or fulfill the obligations imposed by a state or federal agency or undertakes actions that result in a violation of state or federal law.

APPLICATIONS FOR COMMERCIAL VEHICLE PARKING AND STORAGE SHALL DEMONSTRATE COMPLIANCE WITH SECTION 216 OF THE LAND DEVELOPMENT CODE. DEMONSTRATION OF THE CRITERIA FOR GRANTING SPECIAL EXCEPTIONS FOR COMMERCIAL VEHICLES IS SUMMARIZED BELOW:

1. Only one commercial vehicle, as regulated by this Section 216, shall be permitted on any residential lot;

The request is to park a 2005 Peterbilt Model 379 commercial vehicle with associated trailer on the applicant's residential property in a Residential Low-1 land use district (*Exhibit 2 & 6*). The subject vehicle is 12.6 feet high and 35 feet long. Meanwhile the trailer is 5 feet high and 48 feet long. These dimensions categorize the truck as a commercial vehicle per LDC Section 216. The vehicle will be parked on the property overnight and in the designated parking area as shown on the site plan (*Exhibit 5*) when present. The parking location is approximately 20 feet from the nearest property line to the south.

2. Commercial vehicle shall be currently registered and licensed;

The applicant has supplied a current and valid registration for the vehicle.

3. The parking of said vehicle does not have a negative impact to the health, safety, or welfare of adjacent properties;

Staff finds this request will not have a negative impact to the health, safety, or welfare of adjacent properties.

The site has an existing driveway providing direct ingress/egress access to Lake Lure Loop West, a Local Residential roadway (Road No. 842133). The Conditions of Approval will require a commercial driveway apron, constructed in accordance with LDC Section 705, to protect the edge of the County's pavement along Lake Lure Loop West from the stretching caused by such a heavy vehicle's turning movements on and off the property.

The designated commercial vehicle parking area depicted on the site plan meets the required 20-foot separation from all property lines. Buffering and screening from neighboring properties is required and listed as a condition of approval in accordance with the requirements of the LDC Section 216.D. A six-foot opaque fence or Type B landscaping buffer will be needed to screen the parking area from the west and south. The applicant has demonstrated that this criterion will be met. According to the site plan and recent site visit, the property currently has an existing opaque fence surrounding the backyard, including the proposed commercial vehicle parking location (*Exhibit 5*). The parcel to the east does have an established residence, but the existing home and accessory structure blocks the parking from view. The applicant also has the option to install a landscape buffer in conjunction with the fence along the property line or in the immediate vicinity of the parking area if they so wish.

With large commercial vehicles such as this semi-truck, staff often examines the route the applicant must take to reach a collector or arterial roadway to gauge the impact it will have on neighbors. The vehicle travels approximately 800 feet north and passes about ten (10) homes before reaching State Road 659 (Combee Road) a state-maintained arterial roadway. While collector roads provide traffic circulation within residential, commercial, and industrial areas, principal arterial roadways have much higher average daily trips and interconnect large activity centers within an urban area. Urban collector roads are intended to connect to arterial roadways. In this instance, the truck's path is preferable since the vehicle can reach a major arterial roadway (SR 659) with a short travel path, limiting the number of residentially developed properties the vehicle will pass.

The roadway width on the traveled road is also important to consider. Lake Lure Loop West and Haywood Street are listed in Polk County's Roadway Inventory as a paved surface with a width of 20 feet. Per LDC Section 821, these local residential roadways meet County standards. A substandard width or unpaved roadway would cause more concern for passing traffic.

- 4. The applicant can demonstrate that denial of said request would place an unnecessary hardship on the property prohibiting the use of land in a manner otherwise allowed under this Land Development Code;
 - The applicant did not include a demonstration of need in the application. Phone conversations determined that the applicant uses the commercial vehicle as a source of income and needs to have the ability to park their vehicle during non-working hours. The applicant can further demonstrate their hardship at the public hearing.
- 5. Commercial vehicles must park on the same lot occupied by the owner/operator of the vehicle.
 - The vehicle will be parked on the same lot occupied by the operator of the vehicle.
- 6. The vehicle shall not be parked in the front yard of the principal residence.
 - The applicant's site plan (*Exhibit 5*) indicates the proposed parking area is not located in the front yard of the property. The applicant must make certain that the truck does not extend beyond the front of the home.
- 7. The parking area shall be at least 20 feet from all property boundaries.
 - The site plan (*Exhibit 5*) calls out the parking area in the side yard with at least 20 feet of separation from all property boundaries as required in Section 216.D.
- 8. The vehicle shall park in a manner so that the minimum amount of vehicle surface is facing the road adjacent to the property unless the vehicle is screened or buffered as provided.
 - The vehicle will be parked in a manner which exposes minimal view of the truck from the road. The proposed parking location will be about 35 feet from the ROW. During the site visit, a fence enclosing the property's backyard was present. This will not only ensure privacy and security, but block potential ROW views.
- 9. When the vehicle parking area is less than 200 feet from a residentially designated or used property, it shall be buffered from the adjacent residential property with a Type B Buffer as outlined in Section 720. A fence with a minimum height of six feet may be used in lieu of, or in conjunction with, a vegetative bufferyard.
 - If approved, the commercial vehicle parking location shall be confined to the area depicted on the site plan on the southern portion, or rear, of the property (*Exhibit 5*). The property directly to the south is currently utilized as a Religious Institution. The only abutting property utilized as a residence is to the east, with the parking area approximately 60 feet from the structure. The northern and western sides of the property are flanked by local roadways with ROW dedicated to the County. The lot to the south is currently buffered with adequate vegetation along that property line.

The site was subject to a Codes Violation (CMA-2025-1684). The applicant has subsequently filed for this Special Exception and will demonstrate compliance with LDC

Section 216. Based on staff's recent site visit, the back and side yards of the property are currently enclosed by at least a six (6) foot tall opaque fence.

10. *Refrigerator units on vehicles shall not be operated on the site.*

The subject commercial vehicle does not include a refrigerator unit.

11. Approvals shall be valid for one year, or for a shorter period as specified by the Land Use Hearing Officer. Approvals may be renewed, with proper application following notice provided by the Land Development Division Director 30 days prior to the expiration date, if the commercial vehicle location is consistent with the Land Development Code. The applicant shall bear the burden in demonstrating that the vehicle parking still meets the criteria of the approved Special Exception and Section 216.

This has been included in the conditions of approval.

The subject site is a 0.38 acre corner lot on the southern end of Lake Lure. The surrounding area consists predominantly of site built single-family homes part of the recorded plat known as "Howenoca Hills 1st Addition". The property is considered Lots 13 and 14 of the plat recorded in 1925 (PB 15, PG 29) and met the minimum lot size requirement of 7,500 square feet in the prior Residential-2 (R-2) zoning district (Ord. 83-02). A single-family residence was constructed on Lot 14 in 1976. Both lots were subsequently combined around 2015, and the applicant purchased the property through a Warranty Deed in March 2022 according to the Property Appraiser.

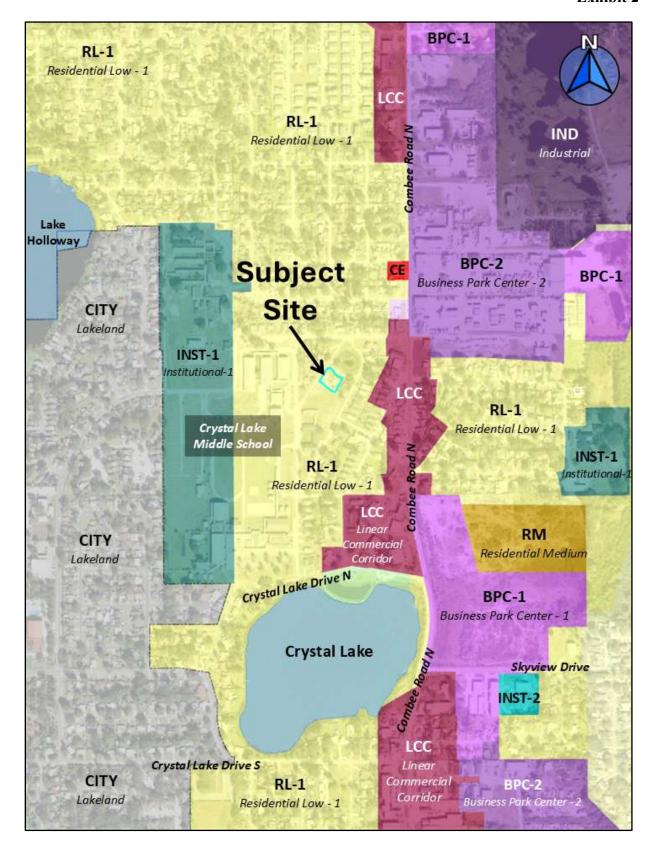

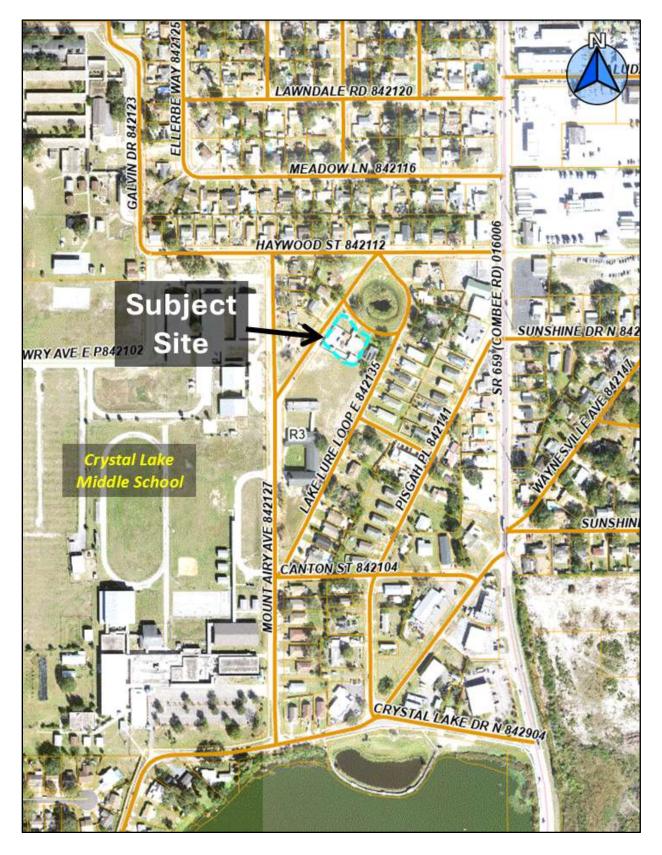

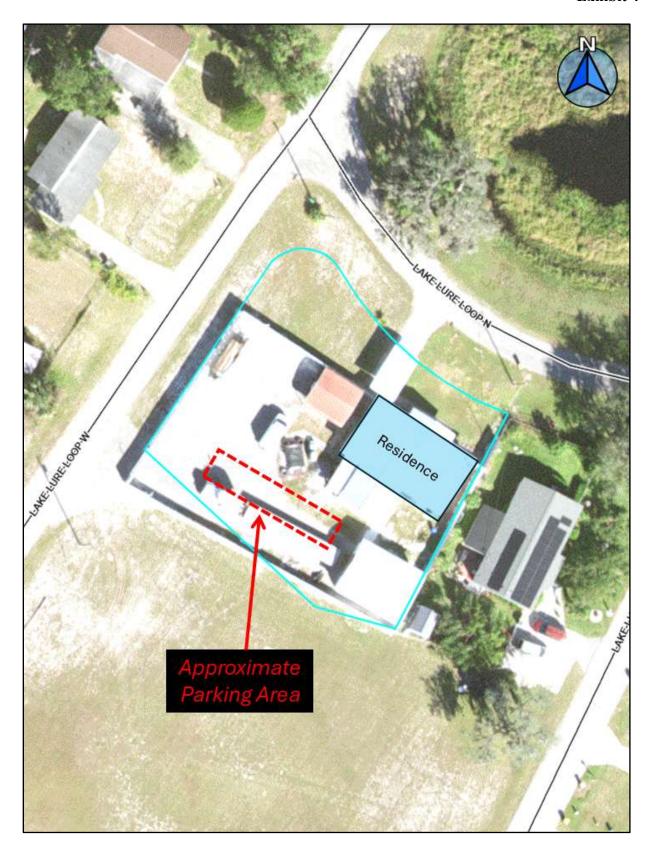
Location Map



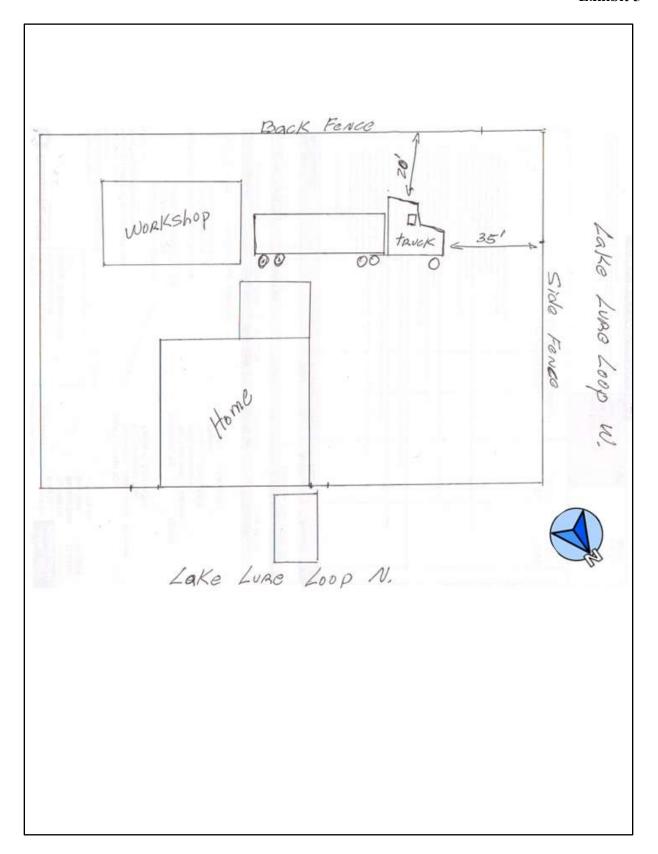
Future Land Use Map

Summary:

The applicant is seeking to build a 9,557 square foot retail plaza on a property with limited depth. In order to maintain a required 50 feet of separation from abutting residential properties and enable the required parking for the plaza, the building must be located closer to U.S. Highway 17.

Structures to the north, and opposite U.S. Highway 17 are located within 20 feet of the right-of-way. The majority of the roadway drainage is diverted to the west side of the U.S. Highway 17 right-of-way through drainage inlets to a subtle drainage structure that lies between the edge of pavement and the right-of-way line along the west side of the road. This separates the applicant's property line from the edge of pavement between 55 feet to 85 feet. The distance between the right-of-way and the edge of pavement on the east side is as low as 20 feet. The roadway is equipped with a 90-degree curb and sidewalks two feet from the edge of pavement on both sides. The posted speed of U.S. Highway 17 is 45 mph on the north side and drops to 40 mph just south of the intersection of Dixie Boulevard on the south side of the property.

Staff find that the request meets the following criteria listed in Section 931:

- The request is in accordance with the general intent and purpose of this Code and will not be injurious to the area involved or otherwise detrimental to the public welfare because the 65-foot setback from arterial road rights-of-way is not needed for public safety but rather intended for aesthetic purposes. Deeper roadway setbacks also encourage higher speeds of travel, and this portion of US Highway 17 is posted for lower speeds.
- Special conditions and circumstances exist which are peculiar to the land, structure, or building involved and which are not applicable to other lands, structures, or buildings in the applicable land use district because this property has an irregular V-shape to it due to the angle in which Dixie Boulevard was platted back in the mid-1920s.
- Granting the requested variance will not confer on the applicant any special privilege because other buildings on adjacent lots are within 20 feet of the right-of-way.

Staff recommends additional time to apply for permits for this request to allow for securing financing, finalizing architectural plans, well and septic tank permitting, site and structural engineering.

Development Review Committee

The Development Review Committee, based on the criteria for granting Variances, finds that the applicant's request as written **IS CONSISTENT** with **Section 931** of the Polk County Land Development Code.

Development Review Committee Recommendation: Based upon the application, and a recent site visit, the Development Review Committee recommends **APPROVAL of LDLVAR-2025-33**, with the following conditions:

- 1. A variance to the standards in Section 208, Table 2.1 of the Land Development Code (LDC) shall be granted for a right-of-way setback reduction from 65 feet to 20 feet for a commercial building or buildings.
- 2. The applicant must apply for all necessary permits within five (5) years of the date for which the Land Use Hearing Officer's Final Order is rendered.
- 3. This variance does not authorize any encroachments into easements, and the applicant shall be responsible for making certain there are no encroachments unless approval is granted by the easement holder and/or any applicable permitting agencies. The property owner(s) is also responsible for compliance with any restrictions of record pertaining to lots and/or land and this approval shall not be used to supersede authority over those restrictions.

- NOTE: Approval of this variance shall not constitute a waiver or an additional variance from any applicable development regulation unless specifically noted in the conditions of approval and consistent with LDC Section 930D.
- NOTE: All conditions of approval, unless otherwise specified, shall be met prior to the effectiveness and validity of the variance approval.
- NOTE: All written commitments made in the application and subsequent submission of information made during the application review process, which are on file with the Land Development Division, shall be considered to be binding upon the applicant, provided such commitments are not at variance with the Comprehensive Plan, LDC or other development regulations in effect at the time of development.
- NOTE: Issuance of a development permit by the county does not in any way create any rights on the part of the applicant to obtain a permit from a state or federal agency and does not create any liability on the part of the county for issuance of the permit if the applicant fails to obtain requisite approvals or fulfill the obligations imposed by a state or federal agency or undertakes actions that result in a violation of state or federal law.

DEMONSTRATIONS OF THE CRITERIA FOR GRANTING VARIANCES SUMMARIZED BELOW:

- 1. Whether granting the variance will be in accordance with the general intent and purpose of this Code, and that the variance will not be injurious to the area involved or otherwise detrimental to the public welfare;
 - The 65-foot setback from arterial road rights-of-way is not needed for public safety. It is intended for aesthetic purposes. Deeper roadway setbacks also encourage higher speeds of travel, according to the Institute of Transportation Engineers (ITE). This area is an approach to the urbanized area of Bowling Green, so the posted speed is reduced from 60 mph to 45 mph and 40 mph just to the south. If there were any development standards that could be reduced without harm to the public, the 65-foot right-of-way setback would be at the top of the list. Therefore, granting a variance in this case will not be injurious to the area involved or otherwise detrimental to the public welfare. Additionally, buildings on adjacent lots are within 20 feet of the right-of-way. So, adherence to the setback will provide very little aesthetic value.
- 2. Whether special conditions and circumstances exist which are peculiar to the land, structure, or building involved and which are not applicable to other lands, structures, or buildings in the applicable land use district;
 - This property has an irregular V-shape to it due to the angle in which Dixie Boulevard was platted back in the mid-1920s. Section 220 of the Land Development Code (LDC) prohibits commercial buildings, dumpsters, and a number of other accessory uses within 50 feet of residential property. The addition of the 65-foot right-of-way setback eliminates a number of other options for building placement and property use. Access must also be setback significantly from the intersection of U. S. Highway 17 and Dixie Boulevard or Hillcrest Drive. A parking space is required for every 300 square feet of office or commercial building space and more if there are medical or restaurant occupants, according to LDC Section 709. LDC Section 740 requires stormwater management for all impervious surfaces for a 25-year, 24-hour storm event onsite for both rate and volume. There is no just cause for reductions from the residential compatibility standards or stormwater requirements, and a reduction in available parking could either be a detriment to the

businesses onsite or result in parking on the right-of-way which can threaten public safety and cause harm to neighboring residents.

3. Whether provided the special conditions and circumstances present in the request do not result from the actions of the applicant;

The applicant purchased the property in 2019. It had been changed to residential in 2000. The Board of County Commissioners recently granted the applicant's request to change it back to commercial.

4. Whether granting the requested variance will not confer on the applicant any special privilege that is denied by the provisions of this Code and will constitute unnecessary and undue hardship on the applicant;

There are other structures along US Highway 17 that are within the 65-foot right-of-way setback. At least three are within 20 feet of the right-of-way. However, the home to the south and the commercial buildings opposite US Highway 17 were built before the first zoning ordinance with setbacks in 1971.

Applying the full 65 feet of setback from the right-of-way and a 50-foot setback from residential for the building, will leave only 35 feet of developable area on the north side (40%) of the property. The available space to place a building on the property is approximately 11,800 square feet in an irregular shape. This would force drainage to one side and parking to another leaving for a very inefficient design. In reality, it would result in a very small building. The other commercial properties along this corridor do not have as irregular of a shape, and the ones on the east side of U.S. Highway 17 do not abut residential property.

5. Whether the variance granted is the minimum variance that will make possible the reasonable use of the land, building, or structure;

The applicant is proposing a $\pm 9,557$ square foot retail plaza on the one-acre property (see Exhibit 5). This is estimated to be the maximum amount of commercial space that can fit on the site while meeting other development standards and infrastructure needs. While it may not be that large in the end, the building will need to have a depth as proposed at 43 feet to serve retail, office, and personal services establishments that might inhabit the building suites. More depth would be better, but there is also parking and drainage that must be accommodated on the site as well. Commercial services are needed in this area according to the applicant and they are seeking to provide as much commercial space for them as possible on this site.

The applicant is also seeking this variance so that the building can be setback the farthest possible from abutting residential properties. The applicant is not asking for more setback relief than abutting structures along the corridor. Additionally, the 20 feet proposed will enable better drainage control on the site.

6. Whether that in no case shall a variance be granted which will result in a change of land use that would not be permitted in the applicable land use designation;

Granting this variance will not result in a change of land use. The property was recently approved for a change of from Rural Cluster Center-Residential (RCC-R) to Rural Cluster Center Commercial (RCC) on October 7, 2025. The proposed retail plaza is a permitted use in the RCC district.

7. Whether that in no case shall the Land Use Hearing Officer or the Planning Commission grant a variance which would result in creation of any residual lot or parcel which does not meet the requirements of this Code; and

Granting this request will not result in the creation of a lot or parcel that does not meet the requirements of the Code. This variance request will not change the size, shape or use of the property.

8. Whether that the granting of the variance does not circumvent a condition or the intent of a condition placed on a development by the Planning Commission or the BoCC.

The property was zoned Regional Commercial (C-3) under the original 1971 zoning map. The setbacks from arterial roads have been 65 feet from right-of-way since November 30, 1971, with the adoption of Ordinance 1971-08. There was a variance process in that ordinance similar to the one in the LDC today. Granting this variance will not circumvent any condition or the intent of a condition placed on a development by the Planning Commission or the BoCC.

Immediately to the west and north are single-family homes and mobile homes. These are the closest structures to the site. Across U.S. Highway 17 is the County Line Club Bar and

ProPlusProducts Inc., an agricultural support use that provides custom blends of fertilizers for various industries, but primarily agriculture and golf courses. There is RCC commercial north of the site on Hilton Road that has a single-family residence but is used for the storage of agricultural use vehicles.

Structures to the north, and opposite U.S. Highway 17 are located within 20 feet of the right-of-way. The majority of the roadway drainage is diverted to the west side of the U.S. Highway 17 right-of-way through drainage inlets to a subtle drainage structure that lies between the edge of pavement and the right-of-way line along that side of the road. This separates the applicant's property line from the edge of pavement between 55 feet to 85 feet. The distance between the right-of-way and the edge of pavement on the east side is as low as 20 feet. The roadway is equipped with a 90-degree curb and sidewalks within two feet of the edge of pavement on both sides. The posted speed of U.S. Highway 17 is 45 mph on the north side and drops to 40 mph just south of the intersection of Dixie Boulevard on the south side of the property.

The applicant's property is part of the Dixie Highway Homesites Unit No. 2 plat that was approved by the Board of County Commissioners on December 14, 1925. During the late 1930s, Dixie Highway became U.S. Highway 17 and was relocated from the west side of the plat to just off the center which was a 50-foot-wide right-of-way named Alma Avenue. An additional row of lots were taken to the east as the roadway widened from two to four lanes in the late 1990s.

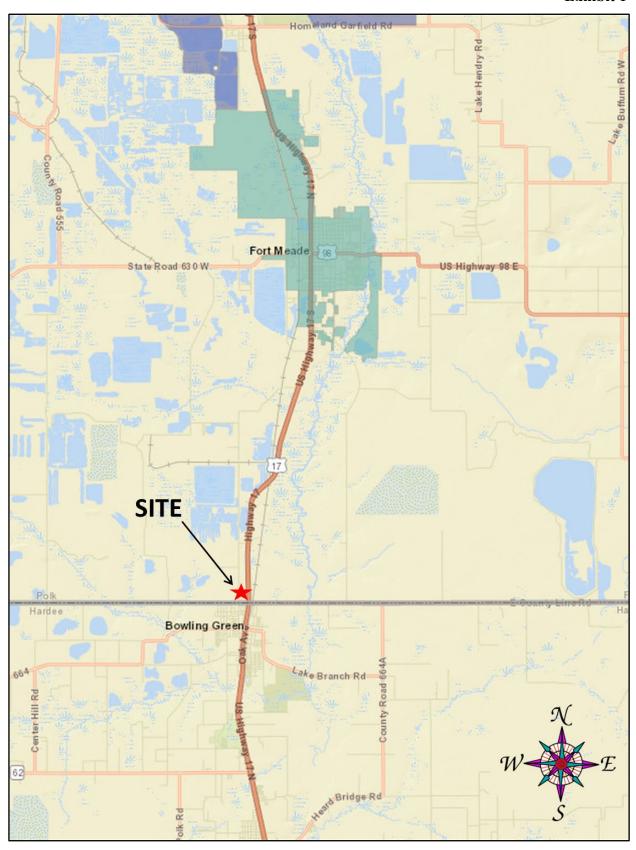

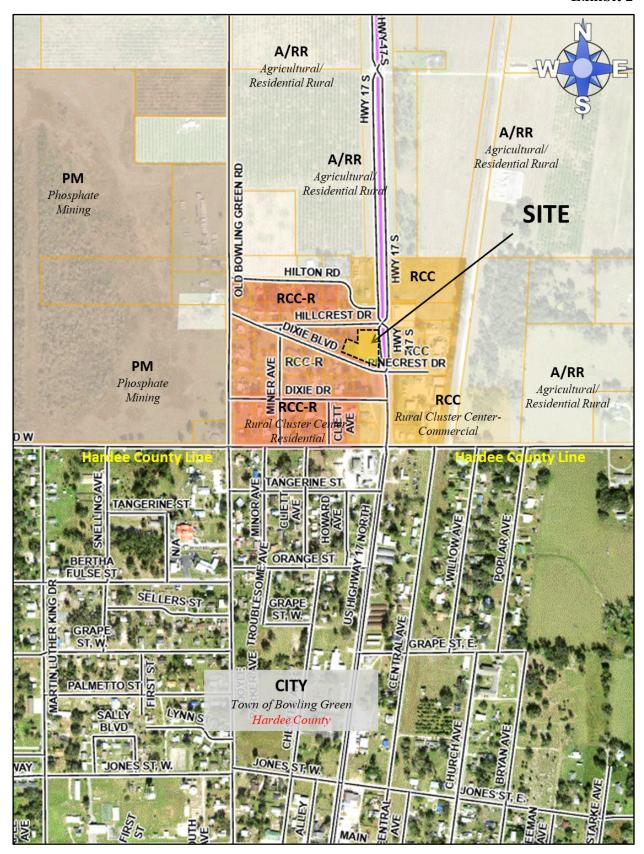

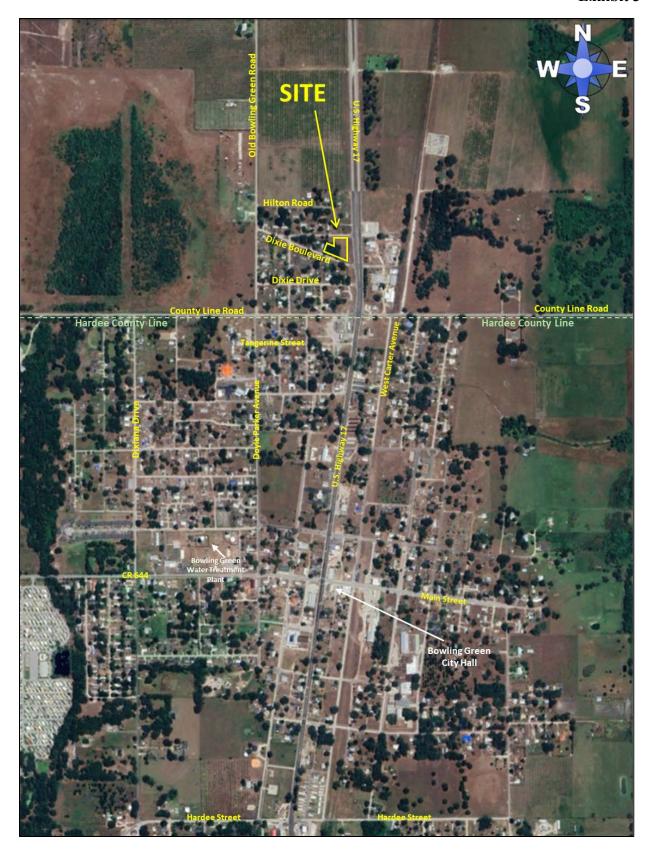

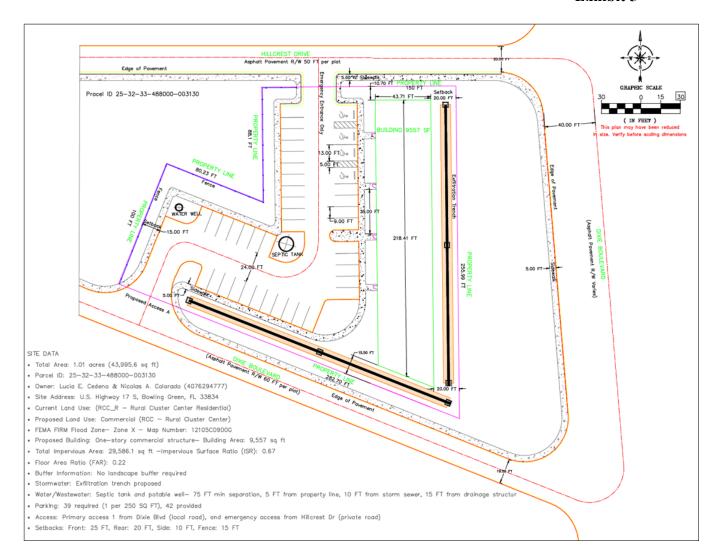

Summary:

The applicant is requesting a side accessory side setback reduction from seven (7) feet to zero (0) feet for the construction of a carport on the southern end of their property. The carport will be approximately 450 sq. ft., and open at both ends according to the applicant. The subject property is located within a Residential Suburban (RS) land use district and is identified as Lot 3 within the Wellington Green Subdivision (PUD 88-14). The PUD established accessory structure setback requirements as seven (7) feet for the interior sides and seven (7) feet for the interior rear. According to submitted documents, the applicant received approval from the Homeowners Association (HOA). Staff is recommending approval as the applicant's request will not be injurious to the area or detrimental to the public welfare. Approval of this variance would allow for efficient use of the applicant's property.

Staff finds that the request meets the following criteria listed in Section 931:

- The request will not be injurious to the area involved or otherwise detrimental to the public welfare because the carport will not be within the existing drainage and utility easement and is located 20 feet from the closest neighboring structure. The carport will be open at the front and back, providing accessible access should the need arise.
- Special conditions and circumstances exist which are peculiar to the land, structure, or building involved. The improvements made to the property over time, including a shed, screen room, and pool, as well as the physical limitations of the site (septic system) restrict the placement of the proposed carport without setback relief. The applicant purchased the property with these conditions already in place.

The subdivision was part of an approved Planned Unit Development (PUD 88-14), which established 7-foot side and rear yard setbacks for accessory structures. The applicant is proposing an eighteen (18) foot by twenty-five (25) foot carport (approximately 450 sq. ft.) that is twelve (12) feet high. The variance request is to reduce the side setback from seven (7) feet to zero (0) feet. It will not reduce the rear yard setback requirement. The carport will be located to the rear of the home along the western portion of the property boundary. The closest neighboring structure is about 20 feet to the west, above any fire separation requirements.

The plat identifies a ten-foot County utility and drainage easement along the front property line of all lots. The proposed carport is behind the residence on the side yard of the property, which is not anticipated to impact this easement. Additionally, the applicant has received HOA approval for this request. Lastly, the carport will be open on both ends, allowing structural maintenance should the need occur.

2. Whether special conditions and circumstances exist which are peculiar to the land, structure, or building involved and which are not applicable to other lands, structures, or buildings in the applicable land use district;

The subject property is located within the Residential Suburban (RS) land use district on approximately 0.32 acres. Pursuant to the Wellington Green Subdivision (PUD 88-14), accessory structures have a right-of-way setback of 15 feet off local roadways and seven (7) feet for both side and rear setbacks. The lot is 0.32 acres, which is below the 5-acre minimum residential lot area in the RS land use district. However, this property is Lot 3, part of the Wellington Green Subdivision platted in 1989, which has a typical lot size of 96.3' x 135' (12,960 square feet). The lot is larger than the typical lot size of the Wellington Green Subdivision. According to Property Appraiser, the site was developed in 1990 with a 2,933 sq. ft. single family residence and associated septic system. Since then, improvements have been made to the site, including the addition of a screen enclosure, pool, and shed. Given the lot size, improvements to the site and septic drain field, the PUD setbacks restrict further site improvements without impeding side and rear yard accessory structure setbacks. The eighteen

- (18) by twenty-five (25) foot carport will along the property line, outside of the septic drain field, and approximately 20 feet away from the nearest structure to the west.
- 3. Whether provided the special conditions and circumstances present in the request do not result from the actions of the applicant;

The lot is a part of an approved Planned Unit Development (PUD 88-14) which regulates lot sizes and other development criteria. When the home was constructed in 1990, a septic system and associated drain field were installed on the southeastern portion of the property. A shed was later constructed in 1999 according to building records. The applicant purchased the property in 2021 with these conditions already in place. The physical limitations of the property dictate the placement of accessory structures, as shown on the site plan (*Exhibit 5*). PUD 88-14 setback requirements, lot sizes, and site improvements over the years significantly limit the amount of usable space without some relief from the PUD setbacks.

4. Whether granting the requested variance will not confer on the applicant any special privilege that is denied by the provisions of this Code and will constitute unnecessary and undue hardship on the applicant;

A majority of homes within this subdivision have accessory structures of some kind. The small lot sizes and septic tanks for each home limit accessory structure placement. More recently, a property in the same subdivision received variance approval to reduce the 7-foot side and rear yard setbacks to 2 and 3 feet respectively to accommodate a shed (LDLVAR-2025-44).

The carport is 18' by 25' in order to accommodate a personal vehicle. While the home has a garage, the applicant stated this carport size is sufficient to meet their needs so they can shelter their vehicle from the elements. Variances are a development privilege. If not for the septic system and existing shed, the carport could locate on the southern or eastern portion of the site, and setback requirements could be met, negating the need for a variance.

- 5. Whether the variance granted is the minimum variance that will make possible the reasonable use of the land, building, or structure;
 - The requested variance is believed to be the minimal variance necessary to optimize the use of the owner's land. The subject property is 0.32 acres, below the 5-acre minimum residential lot area in the RS land use district. Improvements to the site and septic drain field limit the development of the property, restricting any accessory structures to be placed on or within close proximity to the setbacks boundaries, while still maintaining a functional rear yard.
- 6. Whether that in no case shall a variance be granted which will result in a change of land use that would not be permitted in the applicable land use designation;
 - Granting this variance will not result in a change of land use. The property will remain residential with an accessory structure.

- 7. Whether that in no case shall the Land Use Hearing Officer or the Planning Commission grant a variance which would result in creation of any residual lot or parcel which does not meet the requirements of this Code; and
 - Granting this request will not result in the creation of a lot or parcel.
- 8. Whether that the granting of the variance does not circumvent a condition or the intent of a condition placed on a development by the Planning Commission or the BoCC.

There was no evidence found that suggests the proposed request will circumvent the intent of a condition placed on the Wellington Green Subdivision (PUD 88-14) by the Planning Commission or the Board of County Commissioners.

The subject property and surrounding area is Residential Suburban (RS) and considered Lot 3 of the Planned Unit Development 88-14, also known as the Wellington Green Subdivision (PB 88, PG 28) platted and recorded in November 1989. The size of the residential lots within the Wellington Green Subdivision are consistent with surrounding subdivisions platted the late 80s and early 90s. With a lot size of about 0.32 acres (13,878 sq. ft.), this area is in line with the Residential Low-3 (10,000 sq. ft.) minimum lot size requirement. A 10' utility and drainage easement lies along the front of the property. Large vacant pastureland directly abuts the southern property boundary. According to GIS Data Viewer, multiple lots within the surrounding area have added an additional accessory structure (shed) to the property providing examples of how these lot configurations impact future development and the need for setback relief.

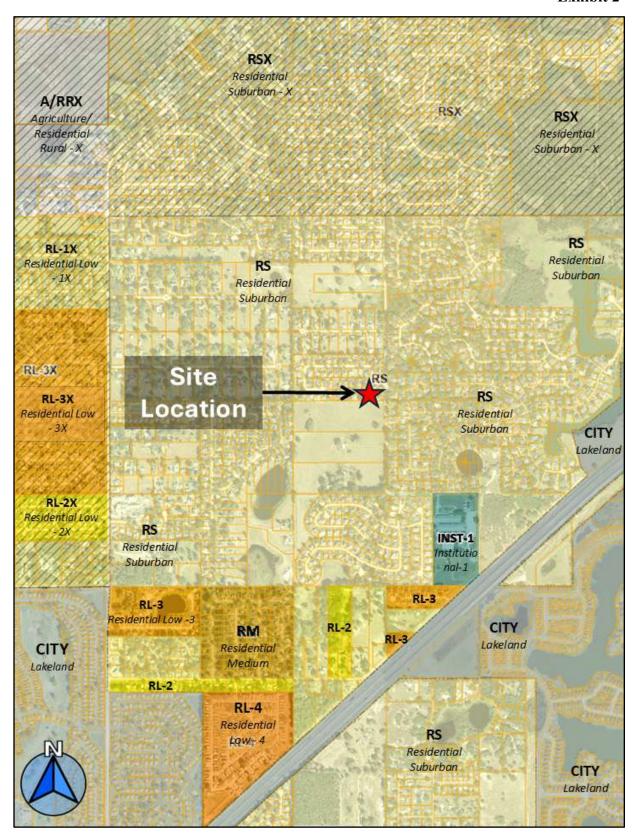

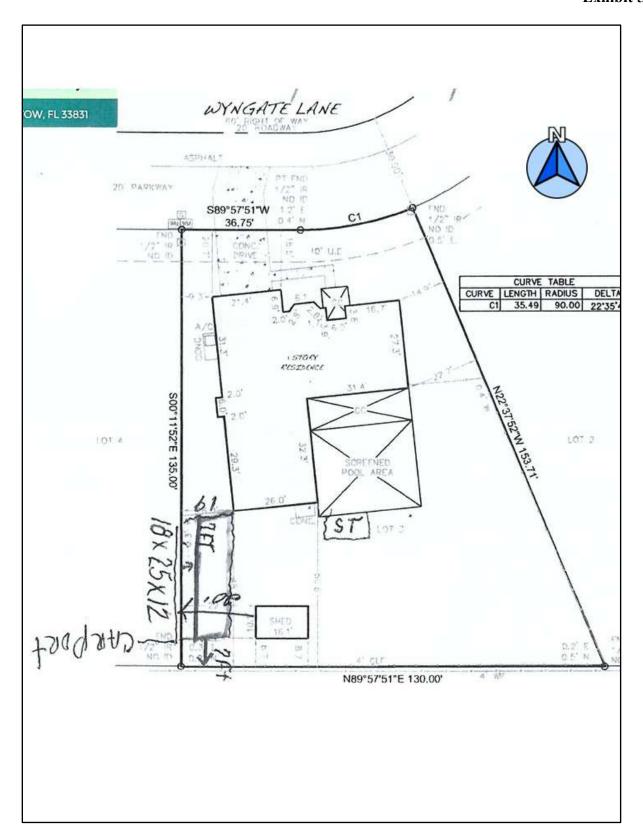

Summary:

Request:

The applicant is requesting a reduction in the primary structure side yard setback from five (5) feet to two (2) feet for the installation of a new 770 square foot (22' x 35') Skyline Keaton doublewide mobile home. According to Section 303, Table 3.4.1, the Outdoor Resorts at Orlando Subdivision has a minimum five (5) foot setback for all structures from interior lot lines. The site was once developed with a smaller mobile home that the applicant is replacing.

History:

Outdoor Resorts at Orlando (ORO) was originally established as an RV Park. At the time, the only units permitted were RVs and park models. The ORO was never approved for mobile homes. The allowance of ANSI and HUD standard park models blurred the line of approval as HUD homes might have been above 500 square feet, or they were 500 square feet when they were permitted and then later expanded.

The reasoning behind only permitting RVs and park models is because one of the challenges with parks is that setbacks cannot be enforced because there is no real property or definitive property boundaries. All structures need to meet adequate separation for adequate fire protection, therefore a 2,500 square foot minimum area exclusive for the location of each recreational vehicle outside of structural setbacks, easements, and landscape buffers was established.

As a solution, the ORO was platted in June 1971, allowing permenant structures and creating small and unusual lots. Permenant structures were limited in size due to the shape and configuration of small lots. In March 1993, an administrative determination was approved to allow the placement of 770 square feet (22' x 35') mobile homes on a RV lot located within the ORO. Prior to the administrative determination, the park was allowing the placement of 22' x 35' RV size units.

Recommendation:

Outdoor Resorts at Orlando Subdivision is identified in the Land Development Code (LDC) in Section 303, Table 3.4.1 as a vested RV Development with a minimum setback of five (5) feet from interior lot lines with no habitable structures placed within 10 feet of another from habitable structure or occupied vehicle on an adjacent space.

The proposed mobile home will abut common ground to the side. Similar to Case VAR 09-41, which was a variance request approved in October 2019, to reduce the rear setbacks from five (5) feet to zero (0) feet on lots abutting common ground with owner authorization. Since next to common ground, the request will not be a concern for a neighbor sharing that property line nor will there be a problem with it meeting building separation for Fire Code. No harm is anticipated. There are many similar placements of mobile homes within the setbacks in the area, so it is not believed to be out of character with the surrounding neighborhood.

This request will cause no direct or indirect harm to the community and recommends approval and is consistent with the surrounding properties, maintaining the integrity of the neighborhood.

Staff recomments approval of LDLVAR-2025-49 as it meets the following criteria listed in Section 931:

- 1. Whether granting the variance will be in accordance with the general intent and purpose of this Code, and that the variance will not be injurious to the area involved or otherwise detrimental to the public welfare;
 - The doublewide mobile home will be located 10 to 15 feet from the closest neighboring structure to the east. The side property line from which the variance is needed abuts common ground, so this will not be a concern for a neighbor sharing that property line nor will there be a problem with it meeting building separation for Fire Code.
- 2. Whether special conditions and circumstances exist which are peculiar to the land, structure, or building involved and which are not applicable to other lands, structures, or buildings in the applicable land use district;
 - The property is located in the Leisure/Recreation-X (L/RX) land use district on approximately 0.07 acres. This was an RV park that was latter approved for permanent structures. Prior to Ord. No. 19-069, the L/RX land use district did not permit mobile homes, mobile home parks, and mobile home subdivisions. Ord. No. 19-069 allows mobile home parks in (L/R) districts through Planning Commission approval (Level 3 Review).

Development Review Committee

The Development Review Committee, based on the criteria for granting variances, the submitted application, and a recent site visit, finds that the applicant's request as written **IS CONSISTENT** with Section 931 of the Polk County Land Development Code (LDC) and recommends **APPROVAL of LDLVAR-2025-49**

CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL:

- 1. The approval of this variance is to reduce the primary structure side setback from five (5) feet to two (2) feet for the installation of a new 22 by 35 Skyline Keaton doublewide mobile home on approximately 0.07 acres in the Outdoor Resorts at Orlando Subdivision within a Leisure/Recreation-X (L/RX) land use district. Further additions or structures placed on the property shall be required to meet the setback requirements of the Outdoor Resorts at Orlando Subdivision or re-apply for another variance approval from the Land Use Hearing Officer.
- 2. This variance does not authorize any encroachments into easements, and the applicant shall be responsible to make certain there are no encroachments unless approval is granted by the easement holder and/or any applicable permitting agencies. The property owner(s) is also responsible for compliance with any restrictions of record pertaining to lots and/or land and this approval shall not be used to supersede authority over those restrictions.
- 3. The applicant shall have one (1) year from the date the Land Use Hearing Officer's Final Order is rendered to apply for all necessary building permits and pay all associated fees for the proposed addition.

The Outdoor Resorts at Orlando Subdivision was platted in 1971. Outdoor Resorts at Orlando Subdivision is identified in the Land Development Code (LDC) in Section 303, Table 3.4.1 as a vested RV Development.

Unless a different vested standard applies, new structures, expansions to existing structures, replacements and additional structures are permitted within Vested RV developments under the following conditions:

- a. There shall be no habitable structure built within 10 feet of another habitable structure measured from leading edge of structure.
- b. There shall be no structures built within 20 feet from the centerline of a drive aisle or right-of-way.
- c. All Park Trailer expansions or additions shall be built to the standards of the Florida Building Code.
- d. All accessory structures shall be built to the standards of the Florida Building Code and setback three (3) feet from the interior lot/space lines or six (6) feet from any other structure outside the space or lot measured from leading edge of the structures (whichever is more restrictive).
- e. Platted lots minimum five (5) feet setback for all structures from interior lot lines.

Pursuant to Chapter 9, Section 930, setbacks from lot lines for vested RV Developments with platted lots are eligible for a variance. The dimensions of the Skyline Keaton doublewide mobile home will be approximately 22 feet across, and 35 feet in length. The variance request is to reduce the side setback from five (5) feet to two (2) feet. The side property line in question abuts common ground, so this will not be a concern for a neighbor sharing that property line nor will there be a problem with it meeting building separation for Fire Code. The closest neighboring structure to the mobile home will be between 10 to 15 feet to the east. The granting of this request will not be injurious to the area.

2. Whether special conditions and circumstances exist which are peculiar to the land, structure, or building involved and which are not applicable to other lands, structures, or buildings in the applicable land use district;

This property is located in the Leisure/Recreation-X (L/RX) land use district on approximately 0.07 acres. According to Section 303, Table 3.4.1, the Outdoor Resorts at Orlando Subdivision has a minimum setback of five (5) feet from interior lot lines. The L/RX land use district does not have a minimum residential lot size, nor does it have a minimum residential gross density in the L/RX land use district is 10 dwelling units per acre. The request is for one dwelling unit on 0.07 acres.

On October 22, 2009 VAR 09-41, a variance request to reduce the rear setbacks from five (5) feet to zero (0) feet on lots abutting common ground with owner authorization, was granted. The subject property is abutting common ground to the western property line, where the applicant requests the side setback reduction. Since next to common ground, the

request will not be a concern for a neighbor sharing that property line nor will there be a problem with it meeting building separation for Fire Code. There are many similar placements of mobile homes within the setbacks in the area, so it is not believed to be out of character with the surrounding neighborhood. area.

Because of the shape and size of the lots within the Outdoor Resorts at Orlando Subdivision, the setbacks restrict further development without impeding on the side and rear setbacks. This request for relief follows suit with VAR 09-41, allowing owners to replace the existing mobile homes in their current locations or intended locations due to the small lots by reducing the rear setbacks from five (5) feet to zero (0) feet on lots abutting common ground.

3. Whether provided the special conditions and circumstances present in the request do not result from the actions of the applicant;

The owner purchased the property in February 2020, according to the Polk County Property Apprasier. The pre-existing single-wide mobile home was built in 1980 at 376 square feet meeting all setback requirements. However, with safer development standards and improved standards of living since 1980, the applicant filed for a demolition permit (BT-2025-11185) as a result of building permit BR-2025-3930 for the installation of a new doublewide mobile home.

The subject site is located at the end of residential development along the south side of the internal roadway. Outdoor Resorts at Orlando Subdivision requires a side setback of five (5) feet with a 10-foot separation between structures. According to VAR 09-41, lots abutting common ground to the rear have a reduced setback of zero (0) feet. Because the subject property abuts common ground on the western side property line, not the rear, a 5-foot setback is required. There is no concern for a neighbor sharing that property line The mobile home is 22 by 35 feet. This request is asking for a 3-foot reduction to the side. This is a very minimal and discrete request. The owner may not have been aware of the accessory structure side setbacks.

4. Whether granting the requested variance will not confer on the applicant any special privilege that is denied by the provisions of this Code and will constitute unnecessary and undue hardship on the applicant;

Every variance approval is a special privilege to some degree. The home is the last lot on the south side of the internal roadway. Mobile homes are permitted in this development. Ord. No. 19-069 was adopted providing vested RV developments and standards.

Abutting the property to the east is residential development and to the west is common ground. This size of the property along with the 5-foot side setback with a 10-foot separation between structures limits future development. Because VAR 09-41 was a request for the reduction of rear setbacks from five (5) feet to zero (0) feet on lots abutting common ground, not side setbacks, the applicant is still required to maintain a 5-foot setback.

- 5. Whether the variance granted is the minimum variance that will make possible the reasonable use of the land, building, or structure;
 - The requested variance is believed to be the minimal variance necessary to optimize the use of the owner's land. The subject property is 0.07 acres. BR-2025-3930 is for the installation of a new doublewide mobile home. The mobile home will be 22 feet wide, meeting the 5-foot side setback with a 10-foot separation between structures on the eastern property line. The closest neighboring structure to the mobile home will be between 10 to 15 feet to the east. The side property line abuts common ground, so this will not be a concern for a neighbor sharing that property line nor will there be a problem with it meeting building separation for Fire Code.
- 6. Whether that in no case shall a variance be granted which will result in a change of land use that would not be permitted in the applicable land use designation;
 - Granting this variance will not result in a change of land use.
- 7. Whether that in no case shall a variance be granted which would result in creation of any residual lot or parcel which does not meet the requirements of this Code; and
 - Granting this request is not anticipated to result in the creation of a lot or parcel that does not meet the requirements of the Code.
- 8. Whether that the granting of the variance does not circumvent a condition, or the intent of a condition placed on a development by the Planning Commission or the BoCC.

There was no evidence found that suggests the proposed request will circumvent the intent of a condition placed on a development by the Planning Commission or the Board of County Commissioners. Section 303, Vested RV Developments and Standards and Section 930 state platted lots may be eligible for a variance to the minimum five (5) feet setback for all structures from interior lot lines.

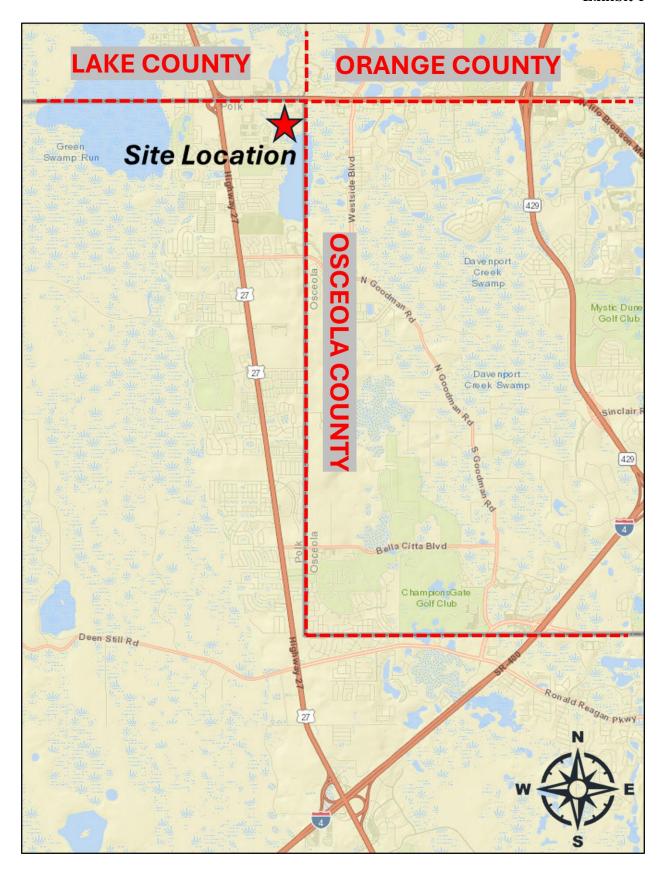

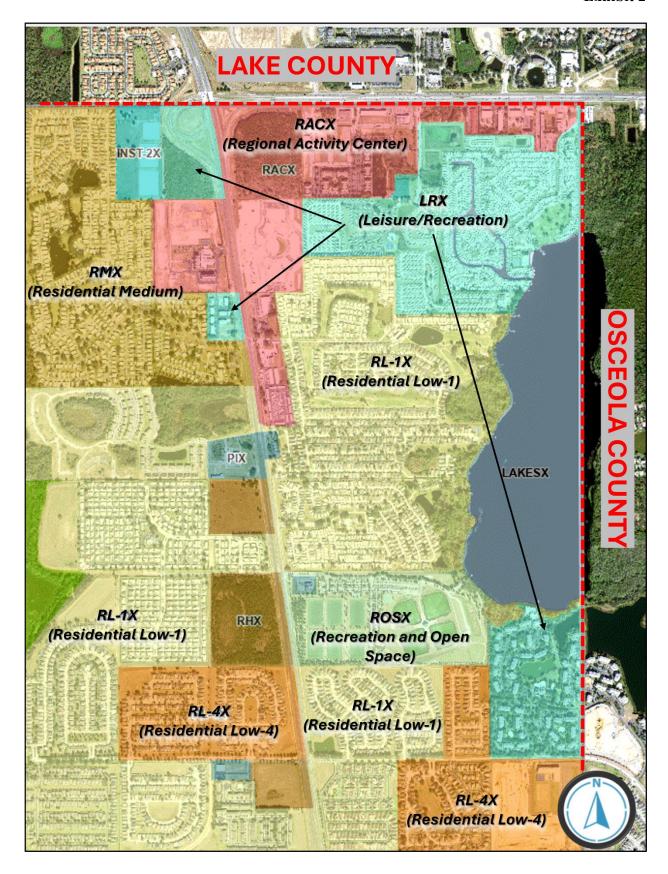
Exhibit 1 Location Map

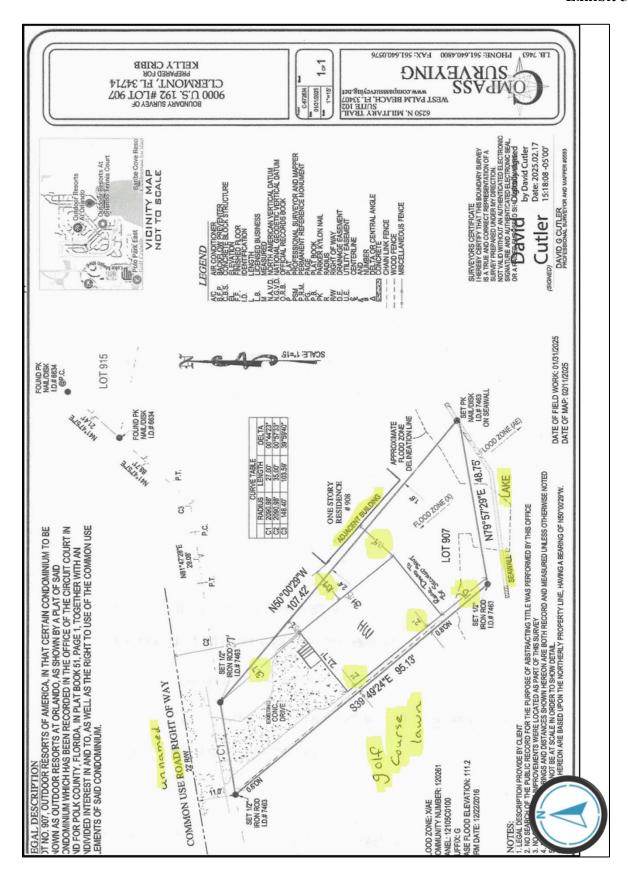

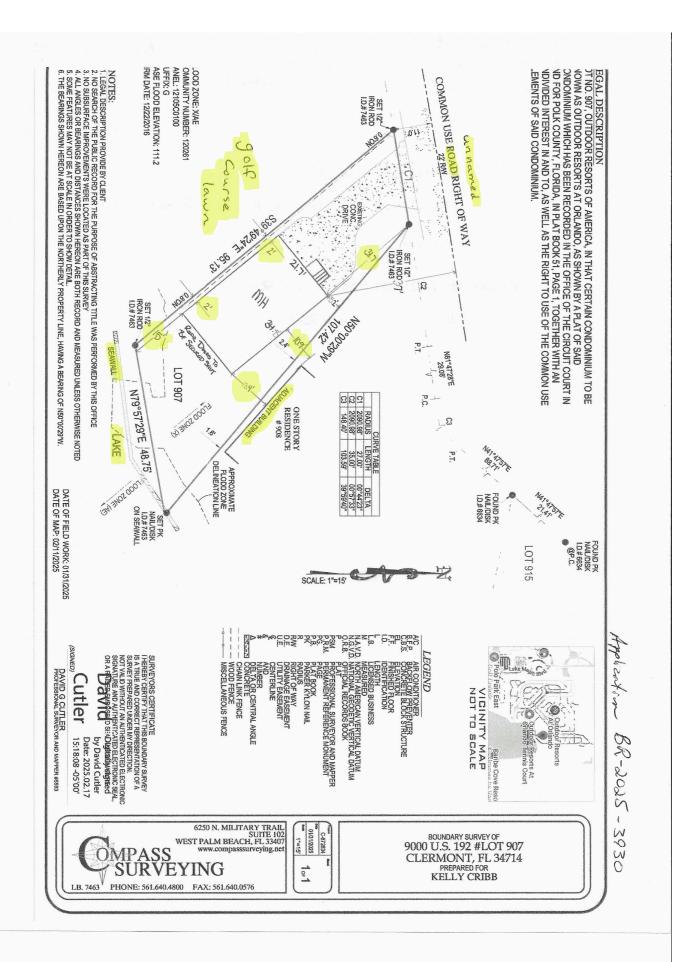

Summary:

The applicant owns an existing Indian American Buffet restaurant within the Publix Imperial Lakes Plaza. The owners are requesting a variance to the separation requirements for a 2COP alcohol license (Beer and Wine consumption on premises). However, there are two religious institutions within 1,000 feet of property (see Exhibit 5). Section 224 of the Land Development Code (LDC) prohibits beer and wine consumption on premises within 1,000 of a religious institution or a public or private school (K-12). Through LDC Section 930, a property owner (or agent of) may request a variance to the 1,000 feet of separation from the Land Use Hearing Officer. Alcohol separation distance is measured from property line to property line.

In 2002, a 2COP Variance (VAR 02-27) was granted, as well as a 4COP Variance (VAR 04-20) in 2004 to the previous Cherry's Restaurant that occupied the building. The 2COP license was Null and Void on March 31, 2020, when Cherry's went out of business.

First Baptist Church Imperial Lakes is within the 1,000-foot distance requirement. First Baptist Church Imperial Lakes is located about 170 feet from the subject property line. Shepherd's Community United Methodist Church is located about 890 feet from the subject property line. There are a few locational factors that need to be considered. Shepherd Road separates the two

uses with four lanes and 170 feet of right of way. In addition, the separation distance is much greater when accounting for pedestrian and vehicular travel. The distance increases to over 1,500 feet when accounting for vehicle and pedestrian travel from the entrance of the proposed restaurant and the religious institutions rather than from property line to property line.

Staff finds that the request meets the following criteria listed in Section 931:

1. Whether granting the variance will be in accordance with the general intent and purpose of this code, and that the variance will not be injurious to the area involved or otherwise detrimental to the public welfare:

There are many instances where alcohol sales and religious institutions have coexisted in close proximity without any adverse effects. Publix Imperial Lakes Plaza already has a Publix liquor that sells alcohol to close distance of these churches.

2. Whether special conditions and circumstances exist which are peculiar to the land, structure, or building involved and which are not applicable to other lands, structures, or buildings in the applicable land use district

In 2002, a 2COP Variance (VAR 02-27) was granted, as well as a 4COP Variance (VAR 04-20) in 2004, to the previous Cherry's Restaurant that occupied the building. The 2COP license was Null and Void on March 31, 2020. Cherry's went out of business so the variance expired.

3. Whether the variance granted is the minimum variance that will make possible the reasonable use of the land, building, or structure,

This request allows the owner the flexibility of offering the customers beer and wine. A Publix Liquors within the plaza sells alcohol package.

Staff recommends approval of a variance to reduce the requirements for separation from schools and religious institutions for this site.

Development Review Committee

The Development Review Committee, based on the criteria for granting Variances, finds that the applicant's request as written **IS CONSISTENT** with **Section 931** of the Polk County Land Development Code.

Development Review Committee Recommendation: Based upon the application, and a recent site visit, the Development Review Committee recommends **APPROVAL of LDLVAR-2025-50**, with the following conditions:

CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL:

- 1. The variance to Section 224 is approved for one 2COP Alcohol Beverage License (Beer and Wine consumption on premises) on Parcel #232926-141964-000010, as shown and described in the staff report.
- 2. The applicant shall secure and locate the necessary alcohol license (2COP license) within one (1) year from the date the Land Use Hearing Officer's Final Order is

rendered. The variance will be valid as long as the beverage license is current and the establishment does not close for a period of greater than twenty-four (24) months, otherwise the variance will become null and void.

3. The property owner(s) is responsible for compliance with any further restrictions of record pertaining to the property and this approval shall not be used to supersede authority over those restrictions.

GENERAL NOTES

- NOTE: This staff report was prepared without the benefit of testimony and evidence submitted by the public and other parties at a public hearing.
- NOTE: Approval of this variance shall not constitute a waiver or an additional variance from any applicable development regulation unless specifically noted in the conditions of approval and consistent with the LDC.
- NOTE: All conditions of approval, unless otherwise specified, shall be met prior to the effectiveness and validity of the variance approval.
- NOTE: All written commitments made in the application and subsequent submission of information made during the application review process, which are on file with the Land Development Division, shall be considered to be binding upon the applicant, provided such commitments are not at variance with the Comprehensive Plan, LDC or other development regulations in effect at the time of development.
- NOTE: Issuance of a development permit by the county does not in any way create any rights on the part of the applicant to obtain a permit from a state or federal agency and does not create any liability on the part of the county for issuance of the permit if the applicant fails to obtain requisite approvals or fulfill the obligations imposed by a state or federal agency or undertakes actions that result in a violation of state or federal law.

DEMONSTRATIONS OF THE CRITERIA FOR GRANTING VARIANCES SUMMARIZED BELOW:

1. Whether granting the variance will be in accordance with the general intent and purpose of this Code, and that the variance will not be injurious to the area involved or otherwise detrimental to the public welfare;

The applicant, Antony Cheriyakadavil, representing Sitar Indian American Buffet is requesting a variance to the 1,000-foot separation requirement between alcohol sales with a 2COP license (Beer and Wine consumption on premises) and religious institution, as required by LDC Section 224. The proposed store requires a variance to this distance separation requirement from the First Baptist Church Imperial Lakes and Shepherd's Community United Methodist Church.

There are few reasons to find this will be injurious to the area. From a pedestrian and vehicular standpoint, access from the First Baptist Church Imperial Lakes and Shepherd's Community United Methodist Church requires crossing Shepherd Road, a 4-lane roadway. The outparcels on the site plan along with landscaping (see Exhibit 6) serve as physical barriers between the subject site and religious institution. In addition, the operating hours of the religious institution are majority on Sundays. Meanwhile, the operating hours of the

proposed restaurant are Monday through Sunday, 10:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m., according to the applicant.

There are numerous examples throughout the County that demonstrate restaurants selling alcohol and religious institutions can co-exist without any adverse effects, as shown in the chart on page 4. Also, the site has been approved for a 4-COP (Cherry's) in the past.

2. Whether special conditions and circumstances exist which are peculiar to the land, structure, or building involved and which are not applicable to other lands, structures, or buildings in the applicable land use district;

Sitar Indian American Buffet is seeking to add 2COP license to their restaurant in the Publix Imperial Lakes Plaza located in the Community Activity Center (CAC) future land use district. The restaurant is within the plaza at the Publix supermarket. The alcohol sales will serve the local residents and visitors in the area. There are other liquor stores in the immediate vicinity of the restaurant, and this area is experiencing high residential growth. Therefore, the requested variance is in accordance with the general intent and purpose of this Code and will not be injurious to the area involved or otherwise detrimental to public welfare. The operational characteristics of a restaurant are not any more impactful than other commercial uses permitted by the property's zoning and therefore will not be injurious to the area or detrimental to public welfare.

The standard method of measuring by property lines is not always the most accurate depiction of real-world phenomenon. Pedestrians and vehicles must travel much further than the property line measurements including crossing Shepherd Road and entering the buildings themselves. The property boundaries between the subject site and religious institutions vary from 170-890 feet. Meanwhile, if measured between the restaurant entrance through vehicle and pedestrian travel to the religious institutions, those distances increase to over 1,500 feet (see Exhibit 6).

3. Whether provided the special conditions and circumstances present in the request do not result from the actions of the applicant;

It is important to realize that the separation requirements of Section 224 apply to a wide variety of uses that have disparate intensities and effects upon the surrounding area. Furthermore, this case illustrates the uneven nature of alcohol policies in Polk County. The applicant would not be seeking a variance to sell alcohol at this location if it was not for the market phenomenon that are present. There appears to be no special conditions and circumstances present that are not the result of the applicant.

4. Whether granting the requested variance will not confer on the applicant any special privilege that is denied by the provisions of this Code and will constitute unnecessary and undue hardship on the applicant;

Several alcohol-distance variances for alcohol sales have been approved since the adoption of the LDC. Therefore, this request is a privilege that has been enjoyed by others under similar circumstances. Below is a chart of other establishments offering liquor sales that have been approved within the distance separation requirement of a school or religious institution.

5. Whether the variance granted is the minimum variance that will make possible the reasonable use of the land, building, or structure;

This approval is the minimum needed to accommodate the use. This request allows the owner the flexibility of offering the customers beer and wine. A Publix Liquors within the plaza sells alcohol. If measured between the restaurant and religious institutions through vehicle and pedestrian travel, those distances increase to over 1,500 feet (see Exhibit 6).

6. Whether that in no case shall a variance be granted which will result in a change of land use that would not be permitted in the applicable land use designation;

Granting this variance will not result in a change of land use. Beer and wine consumption on premises may be approved in CAC districts without limitations if there are no schools or religious institutions within 1,000 feet.

7. Whether that in no case shall the Land Use Hearing Officer or the Planning Commission grant a variance which would result in creation of any residual lot or parcel which does not meet the requirements of this Code; and

Granting the variance will not result in the creation of a lot or parcel that does not meet the requirements of the Code. This variance will not change the size, shape, or use of the property.

8. Whether that the granting of the variance does not circumvent a condition or the intent of a condition placed on a development by the Planning Commission or the BoCC.

Granting this request will not circumvent a condition or intent of a condition placed on the development by the Planning Commission or the BoCC.

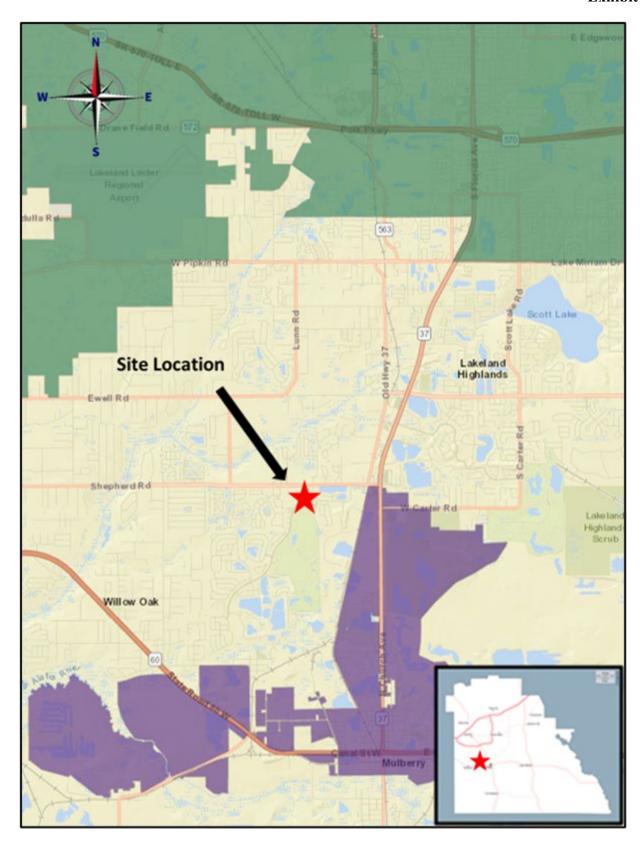

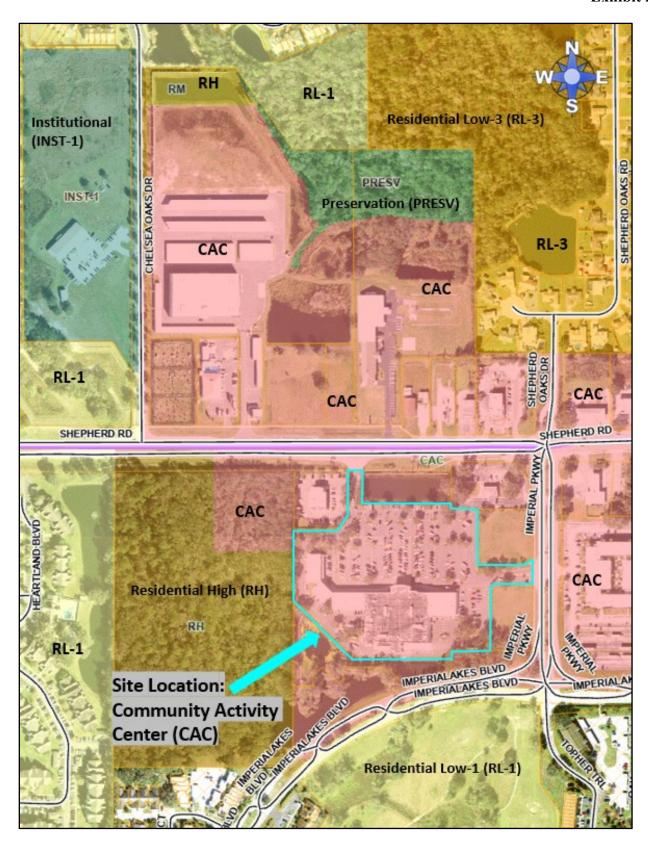

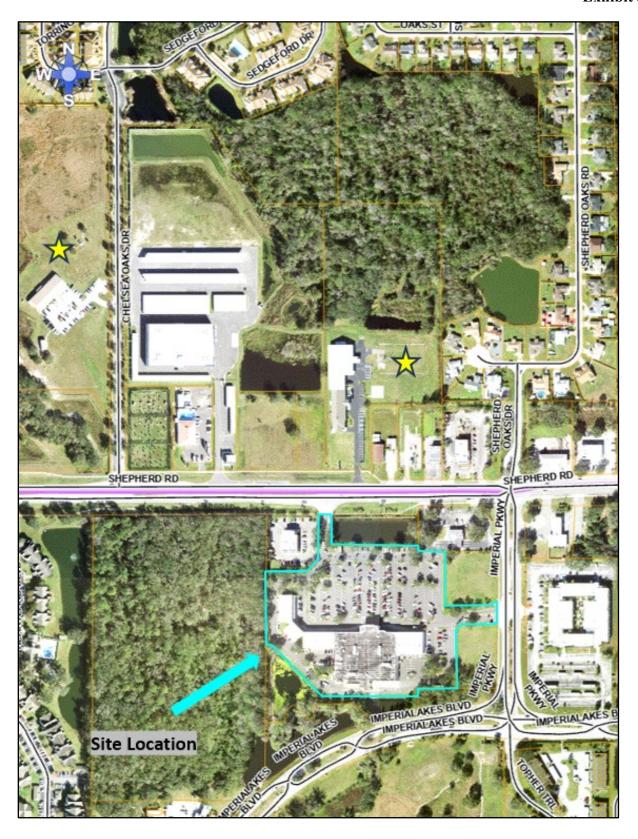

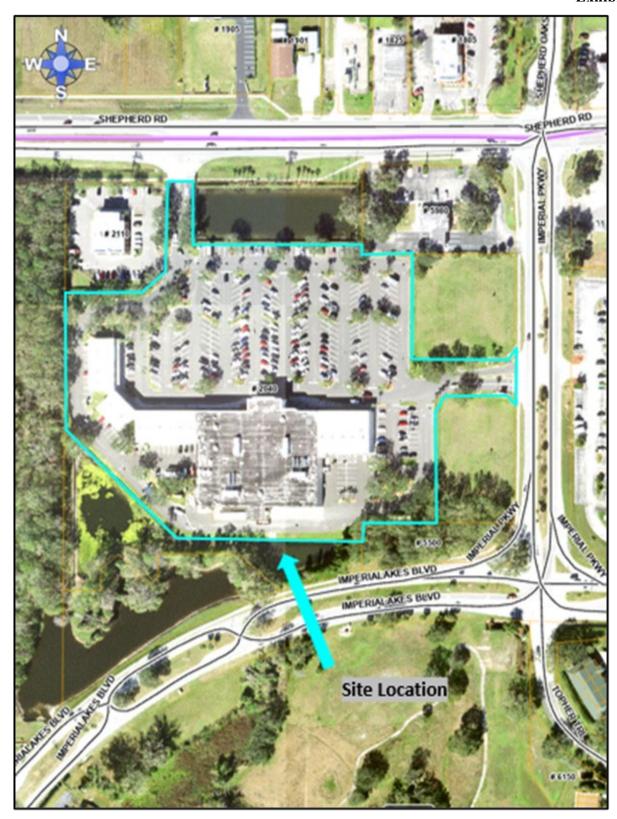

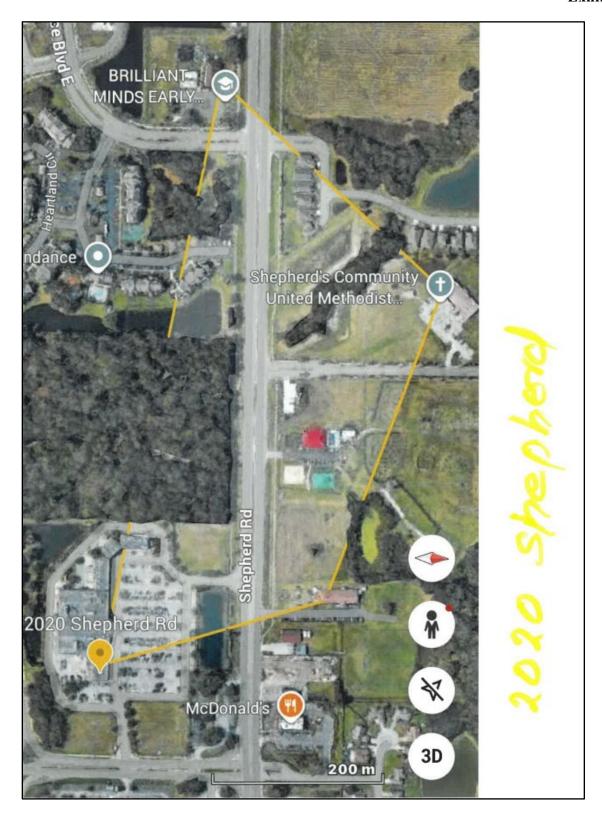

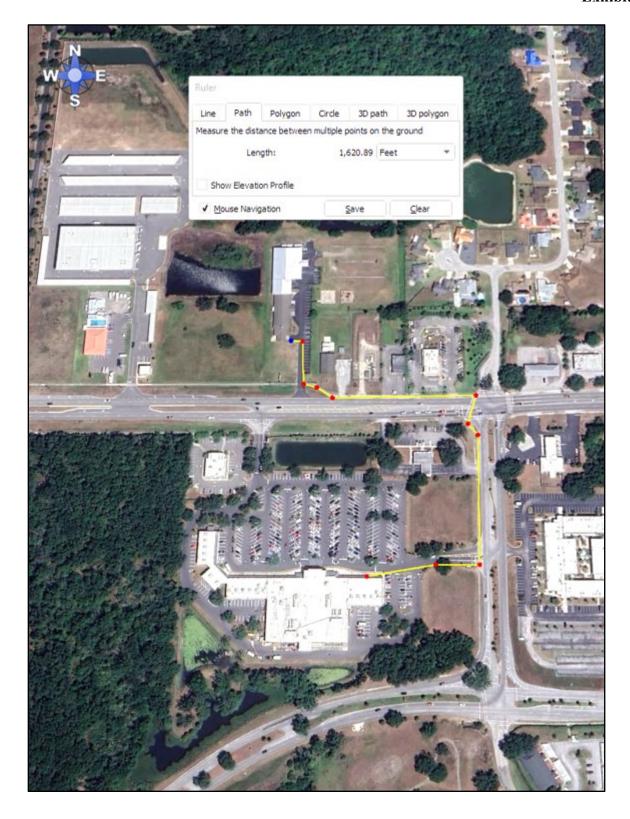

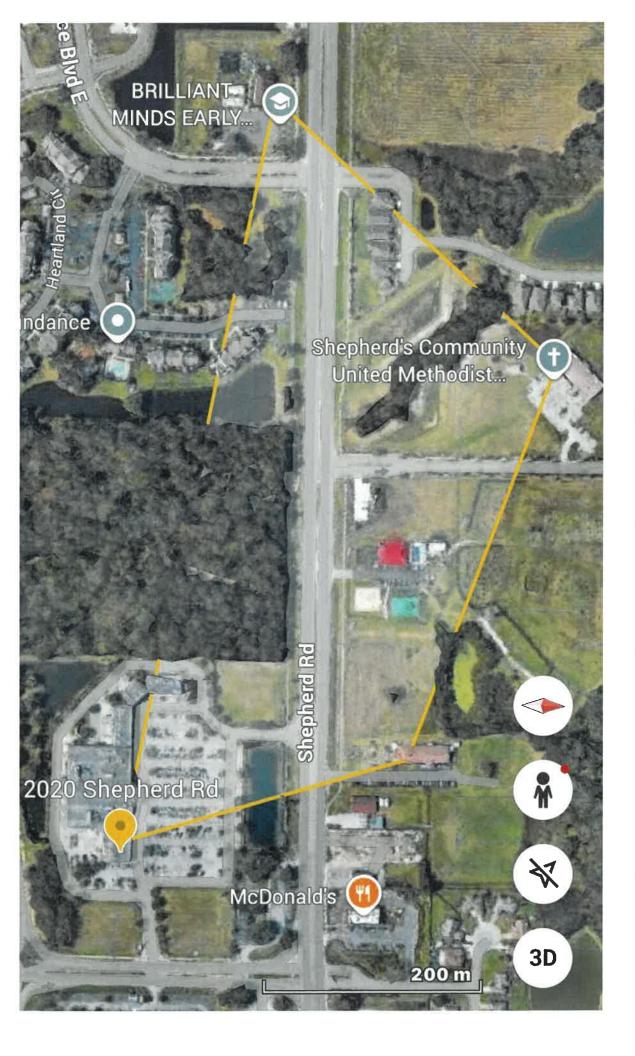

Summary:

The applicant is requesting a variance to allow an accessory structure to be larger than the primary structure. The accessory structure is 50 x 60 (3,000 sq ft) and will be used for storage of vehicles and other household items. The primary home is approximately 1,360 sq ft. The accessory structure in question is larger by 1,640 sq ft. It will be located to the front yard of the property, which is permitted with a concrete foundation. The property is within an Agriculture/Residential Rural-X (A/RRX) future land use district. Pursuant to Section 209.G, of the Land Development Code, an accessory structure may be permitted to be larger than the primary with the approval of a variance from the Land Use Hearing Officer pursuant to Section 930 and 931.

Staff finds this request will cause no harm to the community. The subject parcel is surrounded by a cluster of lots ranging in size from an acre to five acres and in some cases larger. Section 209.D.3 of the Land Development Code states that carports, garages and any other structures intended for the storage of vehicles which have both a rigid roof and a permanent foundation may be permitted in the front yard, provided the front yard setbacks are met. The accessory structure will be surrounded by large trees which will screen it from surrounding properties.

Staff recommends approval of LDLVAR-2025-51 as it meets the following criteria listed in Section 931:

• Whether the variance granted is the minimum variance that will make possible the reasonable use of the land, building, or structure as the home was built in 1968 and does not have a garage, and the applicant will use the structure for storage of vehicles and other household items.

Development Review Committee

The Development Review Committee, based on the criteria for granting variances, the submitted application, and a recent site visit, finds that the applicant's request as written **IS CONSISTENT** with Section 931 of the Polk County Land Development Code (LDC) and recommends **APPROVAL of LDLVAR-2025-51**.

CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL:

- 1. The approval of this variance to Section 209.G of the Land Development Code to allow an accessory structure to be larger than the primary structure as described in the staff report. Further additions or structures placed on the property shall be required to meet the setback requirements of Table 2.2 of the Polk County Land Development Code or re-apply for another variance approval from the Land Use Hearing Officer.
- 2. This variance does not authorize any encroachments into easements, and the applicant shall be responsible to make certain there are no encroachments unless approval is granted by the easement holder and/or any applicable permitting agencies. The property owner(s) is also responsible for compliance with any restrictions of record pertaining to lots and/or land and this approval shall not be used to supersede authority over those restrictions.
- 3. The applicant shall have one (1) year from the date the Land Use Hearing Officer's Final Order is rendered to apply for all necessary building permits and pay all associated fees for the proposed addition.
- 4. The use of the accessory structure approved herein is limited to the storage of items associated with the residential use of the property. No home-based business or commercial uses shall be permitted to occur within the accessory structure.

NOTE: Approval of this variance shall not constitute a waiver or an additional variance from any applicable development regulation unless specifically noted in the conditions of approval and consistent with the LDC.

DEMONSTRATIONS OF THE CRITERIA FOR GRANTING VARIANCES SUMMARIZED BELOW:

1. Whether granting the variance will be in accordance with the general intent and purpose of this Code, and that the variance will not be injurious to the area involved or otherwise detrimental to the public welfare;

The subject parcel is in an area with a cluster of lots ranging in size from an acre to five acres and in some cases larger. The subject site is smaller than 5 acres and created prior to the adoption of the LDC documented by a 1985 deed (BK 2358, PG 0950). The accessory structure is 50 x 60 (3,000 sq ft) and will be used for storage of vehicles and other household items. The primary home is approximately 1,360 sq ft. The accessory structure in question is larger by 1,640 sq ft. The structure will be over 300 feet from the nearest neighboring home. The garage will meet all setbacks for the A/RR land use district. Granting the subject request will not be injurious to the area as the structure will be screened by surrounding trees and accessory structures are permitted on residential properties in accordance with Section 209 of the LDC.

2. Whether special conditions and circumstances exist which are peculiar to the land, structure, or building involved and which are not applicable to other lands, structures, or buildings in the applicable land use district;

This property is located in the A/RRX land use district and is approximately 3.5 acres. This lot is smaller than the A/RRX minimum lot size of 5 acres. This property was recorded by warranty deed on May 1985, prior to the adoption of the LDC.

3. Whether provided the special conditions and circumstances present in the request do not result from the actions of the applicant;

The owner purchased the property in July 2009, according to the Polk County Property Appraiser. The home was constructed in 1968 at 1,360 square feet. The owner already has a shed on the property but does not have a garage. The owner would like to use the garage for storage of vehicles and other household items.

4. Whether granting the requested variance will not confer on the applicant any special privilege that is denied by the provisions of this Code and will constitute unnecessary and undue hardship on the applicant;

Every variance approval is a special privilege. This property is approximately 3.5 acres and has sufficient buffering for the proposed structure. Accessory structures are permitted on residential properties in accordance with Section 209 of the LDC. While not normally allowed in the front, these structures with concrete foundations are.

5. Whether the variance granted is the minimum variance that will make possible the reasonable use of the land, building, or structure;

The requested variance is believed to be the minimal variance necessary to optimize the use of the owner's land. The applicant will use the structure for storage of vehicles and other household items. The home was built in 1968 and does not have a garage.

- 6. Whether that in no case shall a variance be granted which will result in a change of land use that would not be permitted in the applicable land use designation;
 - Granting this variance will not result in a change of land use.
- 7. Whether that in no case shall a variance be granted which would result in creation of any residual lot or parcel which does not meet the requirements of this Code; and

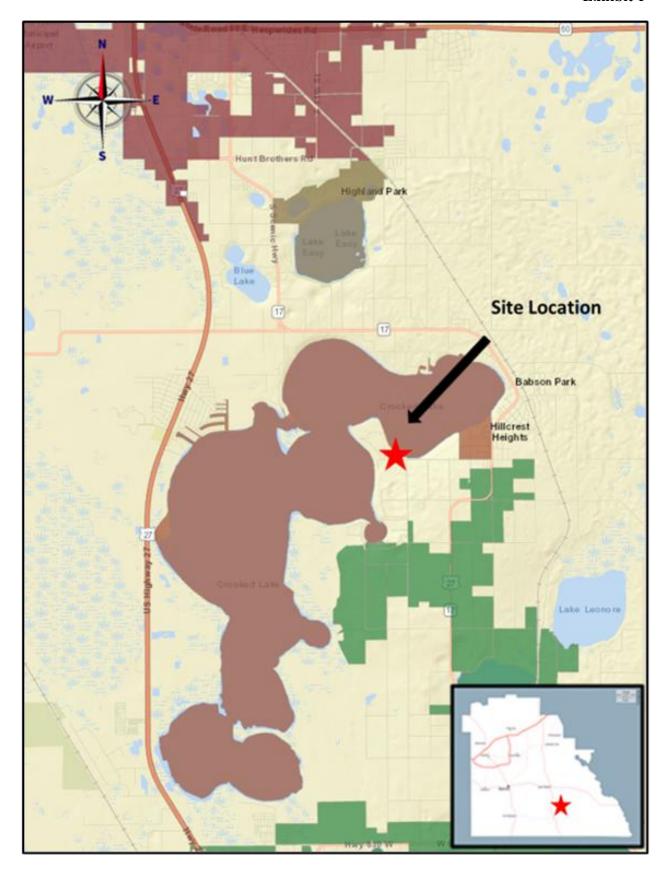

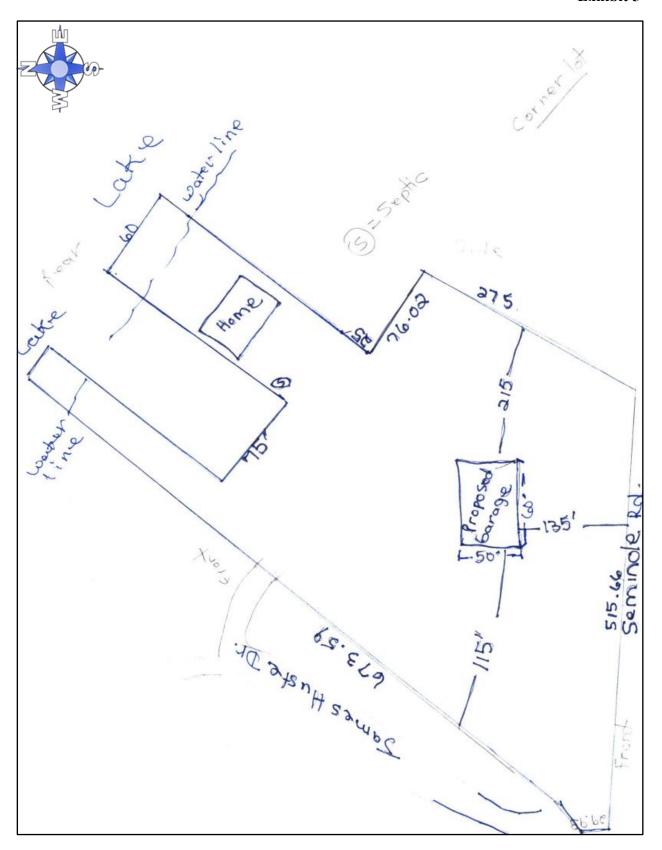

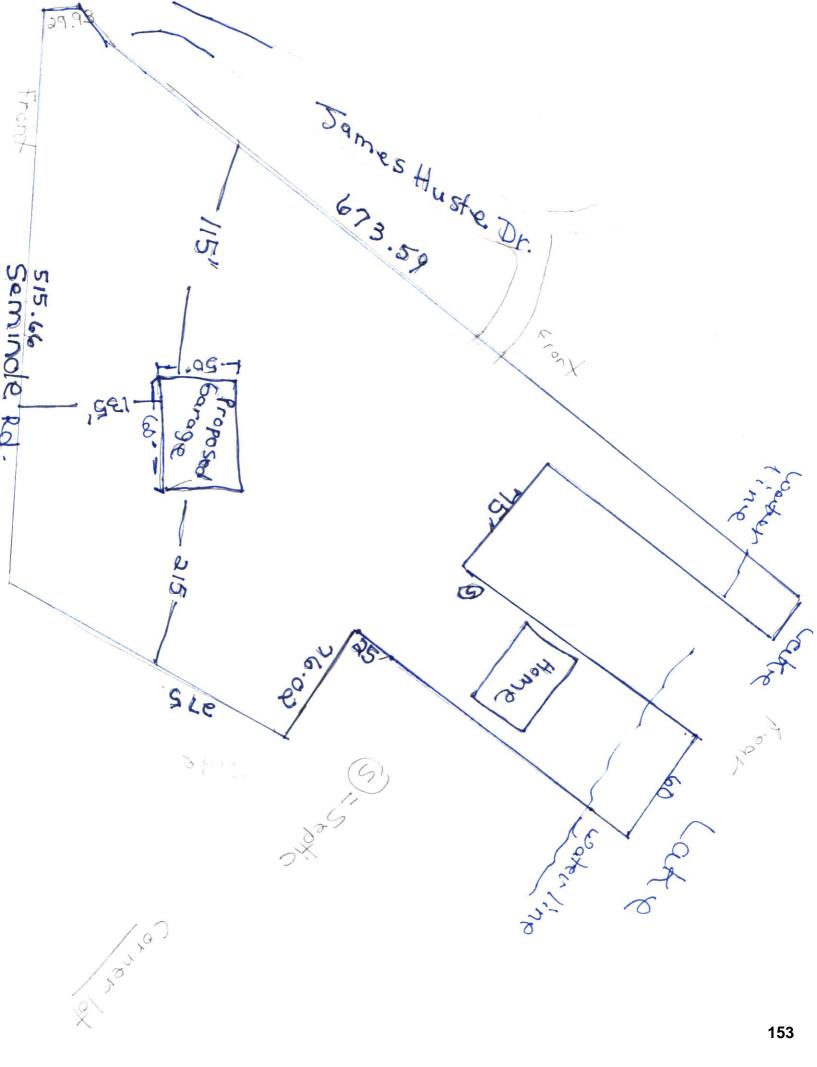

Summary:

The applicant is seeking a variance to the maximum size limit of 1,000 square feet for an accessory dwelling unit (ADU). Section 206.A.2 of the Land Development Code (LDC) limits ADUs to less than the size of the primary residence and not to exceed 1,000 square feet of heated floor space. The owners would like to construct a new home that will be between 2,000 to 2,500 square feet under roof. Meanwhile the existing dwelling unit is 1,510 square-foot under roof, or 1,350 square feet of heated floor space, and would serve as an ADU.

The owners seek this ADU size approval for the property to comfortably house their elder parents onsite and from a separate residence. Considering the max ADU size considers only heated floor space, the existing home intended to become an ADU is only 35% larger than the County's ADU standards permitted by right.

Staff finds this request will cause no direct or indirect harm to the community and recommends approval. Staff recommends approval of LDLVAR-2025-52 as it meets the following criteria listed in Section 931:

1. Whether granting the variance will be in accordance with the general intent and purpose of this Code, and that the variance will not be injurious to the area involved or otherwise detrimental to the public welfare;

The location of the new home will meet primary structure setbacks. The existing home met the primary structure setbacks when it was constructed at the time. Also the impervious surface of the site will not exceed the 60% threshold established in Section 206.A.3.b of the LDC.

2. Whether special conditions and circumstances exist which are peculiar to the land, structure, or building involved and which are not applicable to other lands, structures, or buildings in the applicable land use district;

The owners stated in the application the ADU will provide the ability to comfortably house their elder parents and provide caretaking services for them at a distance. By right, they could demolish and build an ADU just 350 square feet smaller than what's currently on site, but the owners want the home to remain as it stands.

Development Review Committee

The Development Review Committee, based on the criteria for granting variances, the submitted application, and a recent site visit, finds that the applicant's request as written **IS CONSISTENT** with Section 931 of the Polk County Land Development Code (LDC) and recommends **APPROVAL of LDLVAR-2025-52**

CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL:

- 1. A variance to the standards in Section 206.A.2, of the Land Development Code (LDC) shall be granted to adjust the maximum allowable square footage of an accessory dwelling unit (ADU) from 1,000 square feet to 1,510 square feet to allow the existing residence to remain on site.
- 2. This variance shall be valid as long as the new primary residence is constructed at 2,000 square feet under roof or greater.
- 3. This variance does not authorize any encroachments into easements and the applicant shall be responsible for making certain there are no encroachments unless approval is granted by the easement holder and/or any applicable permitting agencies. The property owner(s) is also responsible for compliance with any restrictions of record pertaining to lots and/or land and this approval shall not be used to supersede authority over those restrictions.

GENERAL NOTES

NOTE: This staff report was prepared without the benefit of testimony and evidence submitted by the public and other interested parties at a public hearing.

NOTE: All conditions of approval, unless otherwise specified, shall be met prior to the effectiveness and validity of the variance approval.

NOTE: All written commitments made in the application and subsequent submissions of information made during the application review process, which are on file with the Land Development Division, shall be considered to be binding upon the applicant, provided such commitments are not at variance with the Comprehensive Plan, LDC or other development regulations in effect at the time of development.

NOTE: Issuance of a development permit by the county does not in any way create any rights on the part of the applicant to obtain a permit from a state or federal agency and does not create any liability on the part of the county for issuance of the permit if the applicant fails to obtain requisite approvals or fulfill the obligations imposed by a state or federal agency or undertakes actions that result in a violation of state or federal law.

NOTE: Approval of this variance shall not constitute a waiver or an additional variance from any applicable development regulation unless specifically noted in the conditions of approval and consistent with the LDC.

DEMONSTRATIONS OF THE CRITERIA FOR GRANTING VARIANCES SUMMARIZED BELOW:

1. Whether granting the variance will be in accordance with the general intent and purpose of this Code, and that the variance will not be injurious to the area involved or otherwise detrimental to the public welfare;

Under Ordinance 25-018 enacted by the BoCC on March 18, 2025, ADU sizes on residential properties are permitted up to 1,000 square feet of heated floor space. This standard is to ensure accessory uses remained subordinate in size to the principal structure on the same property. The Board understood that there would be exceptional situations, so this variance option was added to the duties of the Land Use Hearing Officer to review. The one stipulation is that the total impervious surface ratio (ISR) of a property with a larger than 1,000 square foot ADU does not result in more than 60%. The applicant's property is approximately 15.03 acres, and the current home and its accessory structures cover less than 1% of the property. The addition of the new 2,000 to 2,500 square foot primary residence will increase the ISR to 0.95%, well below the 60% maximum ISR of the property.

The applicant and property owner Joseph Hudson, is seeking to build a new 2,000 to 2,500 square foot single-family residence while retaining the old home as an ADU. The existing home is 35%, or 350 square feet of heated floor space, larger than the maximum size permitted in under Section 206.A.2 of the LDC. Under roof, the ADU is also subordinate in size to the proposed primary dwelling unit by about 34%. The subject site is a legal lot of record, and the new principal structure will meet all the required setbacks in the A/RRX land use district. Additionally, the existing 1958 home met all principal structure setbacks at the time. For these reasons, approval will not be injurious to the area involved or otherwise detrimental to the public welfare.

- 2. Whether special conditions and circumstances exist which are peculiar to the land, structure, or building involved and which are not applicable to other lands, structures, or buildings in the applicable land use district;
 - The subject site is within the Agriculture/Residential Rural-X (A/RRX) land use district in the Green Swamp Area of Critical State Concern (GSACSC), surrounded by developed and vacant land similar in size. The property is approximately 15.03 acres, which met the 40,000 acre minimum lot area in the Rural Conservation (RC) zoning district when the property was recorded, and the current 10 acre minimum lot area in the A/RRX. The lot is unplatted and gains access off an unpaved County-maintained local roadway directly to the south (AVT Ranch Road).
- 3. Whether provided the special conditions and circumstances present in the request do not result from the actions of the applicant;
 - The existing home on the subject site was constructed in 1958 and met the principal side and rear setbacks of 15' and 40' under the prior zoning district respectively. According to the request, rather than demolishing the home altogether, the owner instead would use the home as an accessory dwelling unit to comfortably house their elder parents and provide caretaking services. The size of the dwelling is 35% larger than the County's ADU standards permit by right.
- 4. Whether granting the requested variance will not confer on the applicant any special privilege that is denied by the provisions of this Code and will constitute unnecessary and undue hardship on the applicant;
 - This will not confer on the applicant any special privilege that is denied by the provisions of this Code. ADUs are permitted as accessory uses to single-family detached homes and mobile homes in all residential districts and lots of record, so long as they meet setback, dimensional, and locational requirements. According to Section 206.A.3.c of the LDC, the "new" ADU must meet primary structure setbacks when it exceeds 1,000 square feet. The residence was originally zoned Rural Conservation (RC) at the time it was constructed in 1958. Minimum principal structure setbacks in RC district are 25' front, 15' side, and 40' rear. The residence is ± 15.03 acres, well over the 40,000 square feet minimum lot area per RC zoning district making it easy to meet these requirements. In addition to this, the ADU will not be located in the front yard once the new residence is built.
- 5. Whether the variance granted is the minimum variance that will make possible the reasonable use of the land, building, or structure;
 - The owners are seeking to designate their existing home as an accessory dwelling unit (ADU) that is approximately 35% larger than the County's current ADU maximum standard. In terms of total under roof, the ADU will be approximately 34% the size of the minimum new primary dwelling proposed. This still falls into the confines of the definition of accessory (incidental and subordinate). According to the applicant's justification, the request aims to house their older parents in the ADU while providing caretaking services.

- 6. Whether that in no case shall a variance be granted which will result in a change of land use that would not be permitted in the applicable land use designation;
 - Granting this variance will not result in a change of land use. A larger than standard accessory dwelling unit (AD) will not alter the residential use of this property
- 7. Whether that in no case shall a variance be granted which would result in creation of any residual lot or parcel which does not meet the requirements of this Code; and
 - Granting this request is not anticipated to result in the creation of a lot or parcel that does not meet the requirements of the Code. This variance will not change the size, shape, or use of the property.
- 8. Whether that the granting of the variance does not circumvent a condition, or the intent of a condition placed on a development by the Planning Commission or the BoCC.

The evidence found suggests the proposed request will not circumvent the intent of a condition placed on a development by the Planning Commission or the Board of County Commissioners.

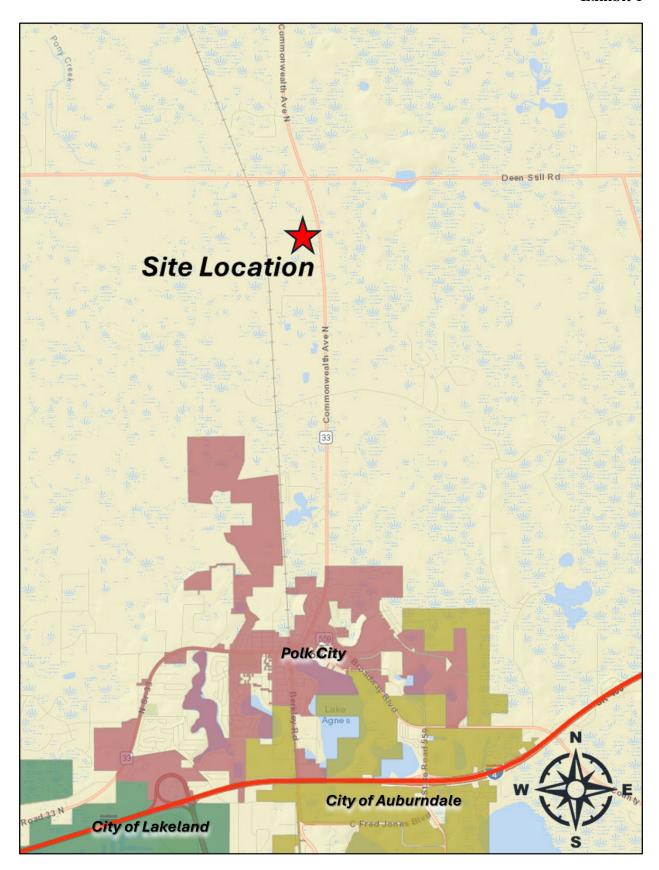

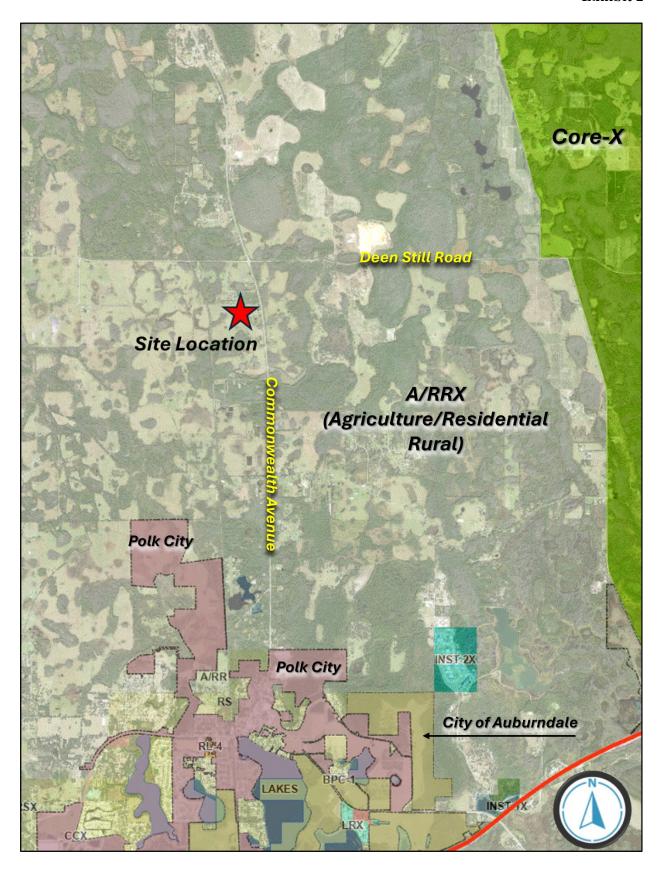

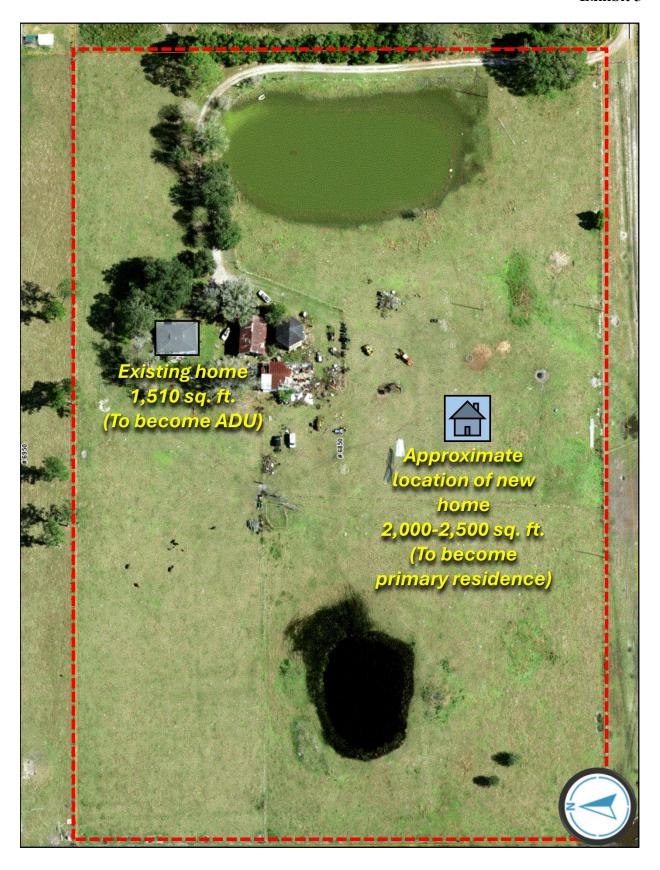

Summary:

The applicant is seeking to build a four-unit apartment building on a corner lot in an existing quadraplex subdivision. Shape of the lot and proximity to the roadway make it difficult to meet all setbacks in the CAC district which are typically for commercial land uses rather than small scale multifamily.

The Village East subdivision plat was designed and approved for quadruplex units on each of the 17 platted lots within the subdivision. At the time of development in the 1980s, the zoning district did not require side yard setbacks as long as there was at least 10 feet of building separation and rear yard setbacks were 10 feet rather than 15 feet as they are today. Additionally, the parking requirements for multifamily dwellings have increased from 1½ spaces per unit to two (2). The setback relief the applicant is seeking is relatively modest for the circumstances.

Staff find that the request meets the following criteria listed in Section 931:

- The request is in accordance with the general intent and purpose of this Code and will not be injurious to the area involved or otherwise detrimental to the public welfare because the posted speed on Coleman Road is 35 miles per hour and the applicant is requesting less than a 7% reduction on one corner of the proposed building.
- Special conditions and circumstances exist which are peculiar to the land, structure, or building involved and which are not applicable to other lands, structures, or buildings in the applicable land use district because development standards such as setbacks and parking requirements have changed since the original quadruplex development was designed over 45 years ago.
- Granting the requested variance will not confer on the applicant any special privilege because all but one of the lots within the development meet today's setback standards.

Staff recommends additional time to apply for permits for this request to allow for securing financing, finalizing architectural plans, site and structural engineering.

Development Review Committee

The Development Review Committee, based on the criteria for granting Variances, finds that the applicant's request as written **IS CONSISTENT** with **Section 931** of the Polk County Land Development Code.

Development Review Committee Recommendation: Based upon the application, and a recent site visit, the Development Review Committee recommends **APPROVAL of LDLVAR-2025-53**, with the following conditions:

CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL:

- 1. A variance to the standards in Section 208, Table 2.1 of the Land Development Code (LDC) shall be granted for a right-of-way setback reduction from 35 feet to 32 feet and side yard setback reductions (both sides) from 15 feet to 10 feet for a four (4) dwelling unit building (quadraplex).
- 2. The applicant must apply for all necessary permits within three (3) years of the date for which the Land Use Hearing Officer's Final Order is rendered.
- 3. This variance does not authorize any encroachments into easements, and the applicant shall be responsible for making certain there are no encroachments unless approval is granted by the easement holder and/or any applicable permitting agencies. The property owner(s) is also responsible for compliance with any restrictions of record pertaining to lots and/or land and this approval shall not be used to supersede authority over those restrictions.

GENERAL NOTES

NOTE: This staff report was prepared without the benefit of testimony and evidence submitted by the public and other parties at a public hearing.

- NOTE: Approval of this variance shall not constitute a waiver or an additional variance from any applicable development regulation unless specifically noted in the conditions of approval and consistent with LDC Section 930D.
- NOTE: All conditions of approval, unless otherwise specified, shall be met prior to the effectiveness and validity of the variance approval.
- NOTE: All written commitments made in the application and subsequent submission of information made during the application review process, which are on file with the Land Development Division, shall be considered to be binding upon the applicant, provided such commitments are not at variance with the Comprehensive Plan, LDC or other development regulations in effect at the time of development.
- NOTE: Issuance of a development permit by the county does not in any way create any rights on the part of the applicant to obtain a permit from a state or federal agency and does not create any liability on the part of the county for issuance of the permit if the applicant fails to obtain requisite approvals or fulfill the obligations imposed by a state or federal agency or undertakes actions that result in a violation of state or federal law.

DEMONSTRATIONS OF THE CRITERIA FOR GRANTING VARIANCES SUMMARIZED BELOW:

- 1. Whether granting the variance will be in accordance with the general intent and purpose of this Code, and that the variance will not be injurious to the area involved or otherwise detrimental to the public welfare;
 - The applicant's setback relief is relatively minimal compared to some others in the plat/neighborhood. The setbacks in the Community Activity Center (CAC) district are also intended more for retail businesses, commercial plazas, and large multifamily developments. They do not serve the same purpose on an individual, lot by lot basis. Some flexibility will not be injurious to the area involved or otherwise detrimental to the public welfare. The posted speed on Coleman Road is 35 miles per hour and the applicant is requesting less than a 7% reduction on one corner of the proposed building. At a reduction from 15 to 10 feet on the side lot lines, the building will be over 25 feet from the nearest offsite building which is more separation between buildings than most of the other properties in the development/plat.
- 2. Whether special conditions and circumstances exist which are peculiar to the land, structure, or building involved and which are not applicable to other lands, structures, or buildings in the applicable land use district;
 - Special conditions and circumstances exist which are peculiar to the land. The lot is not as uniform in shape as most of the quadruplex lots are within the development, and it is also a corner lot. All but four of the 17 have a full 90 feet of width and 105 feet of depth. The applicant's lot is only 70 feet wide on the north end and the right-of-way setback is greater than 11 of the 17 lots. Staff insists upon holding the building to the required number of spaces because rental tenants today possess more vehicles than they did over 40 years ago.
- 3. Whether provided the special conditions and circumstances present in the request do not result from the actions of the applicant;
 - The property owner purchased the parcel in February of 2004. The plat was recorded in 1981. The plat was designed for multifamily quadruplexes on each lot under the zoning ordinance in existence at the time. Development regulations changed in September of

2000. Setback standards increased from zero (0) on the sides to 15 feet and 10 feet on the rear to 15 feet. The applicant is proposing the first new buildings in the development since the 1980s. It is reasonable that the owner was not aware that the development standards had changed since the other units were built or that the same standards that the previous units were built under no longer applied. The parking standards were also lower at 1½ spaces per unit in the 1980s whereas they are two (2) spaces per unit today. Although, some of the buildings proved eight spaces where most only provide six spaces.

4. Whether granting the requested variance will not confer on the applicant any special privilege that is denied by the provisions of this Code and will constitute unnecessary and undue hardship on the applicant;

There is only one structure out of a total of 15 buildings in the development that meets the current setback requirements of the CAC district. While all 15 were established when the zoning was C-3 and setbacks were not required on side lot lines as long as building separations were met, approximately seven (7) are not meeting the 10 feet that was required from rear lot lines and two (2) of them are not meeting the right-of-way setbacks from Coleman Road. Therefore, approval does not confer on the applicant a special privilege. Additionally, the applicant's property is a corner parcel and lacks the same depth as other parcels in the subdivision which further complicates the placement of the quadruplex.

5. Whether the variance granted is the minimum variance that will make possible the reasonable use of the land, building, or structure;

The applicant is proposing a ±3,916 square foot quadruplex which is similar in size to all the other existing quadruplexes in the development (see Table 1). This requires a minimum of eight (8) paved parking spaces per LDC Section 709. There is a 10-foot-wide utility easement on the north side of the lot. To provide for the building, required parking with entrance turning radius, and avoid the utility easement, this is the minimum variance needed to exercise the vested development rights enjoyed by the other quadruplex buildings in the subdivision. The largest amount of relief is five feet on each of the side lot lines which leaves more of a separation than many of the quadruplexes in the development. The relief from the Coleman Road right-of-way is less than 7% compared to the building on Lot 17 which is at a 25% reduction from the standard length.

6. Whether that in no case shall a variance be granted which will result in a change of land use that would not be permitted in the applicable land use designation;

Granting this variance will not result in a change of land use. While all multifamily development requires Planning Commission approval in CAC, the plat is considered a vested development per LDC Section 111 Vested Rights and a quadruplex on this property would also meet the requirements of Residential Infill in Section 303 for administrative approval.

7. Whether that in no case shall the Land Use Hearing Officer or the Planning Commission grant a variance which would result in creation of any residual lot or parcel which does not meet the requirements of this Code; and

Granting this request will not result in the creation of a lot or parcel that does not meet the requirements of the Code. This variance request will not change the size, shape or use of the property.

8. Whether that the granting of the variance does not circumvent a condition or the intent of a condition placed on a development by the Planning Commission or the BoCC.

The entire Village East plat was zoned Regional Commercial (C-3) under the original 1971 zoning map. Multifamily dwellings were permitted by right in C-3 up to 16 dwelling units per acre. It did not require Board approval for quadruplexes on each of the 17 lots. The subdivision was intended for 68 total units on ± 5.31 acres for a density of 12.8 dwelling units per acre. The Board approved the plat on January 27, 1981. There are no conditions or specific plat notes on the plat.

Carla Court is part of the Village East plat approved by the Board of County Commissioners in 1981 (Plat Book 71, Page 6) and was intended for quadruplexes to be placed on each lot in the subdivision. The property was zoned Regional Commercial (C-3) in which multiple family dwellings were a permitted use. Setbacks were 35 feet from the right-of-way, not required on the side, and 10 feet in the rear. Building separation was 10 feet plus 1/3 of a foot for each foot of building over 15 feet. That is why many of the existing quadruplexes in the subdivision are on or near side lot lines. However, the quadruplex on lot 17 is within less than the 35-foot right-of-way setback of Coleman Road which is more than the applicant is requesting in relief. It was built in 1984. The County does not have complete records of variance approvals prior to 1990.

In the plat, there is a 10-foot drainage easement abutting the right-of-way of Coleman Road and there is a 10-foot utility easement that separates the applicant's property and Lot 16 from Lot 14 to the north. There is an 8-inch gravity wastewater line that extends to a manhole that provides sanitary sewer connection to lots 14-17 in it. There is a six-inch water line in the right-of-way on

Coleman Road and a 4-inch water line in the right-of-way of Carla Court along the western side of the property.

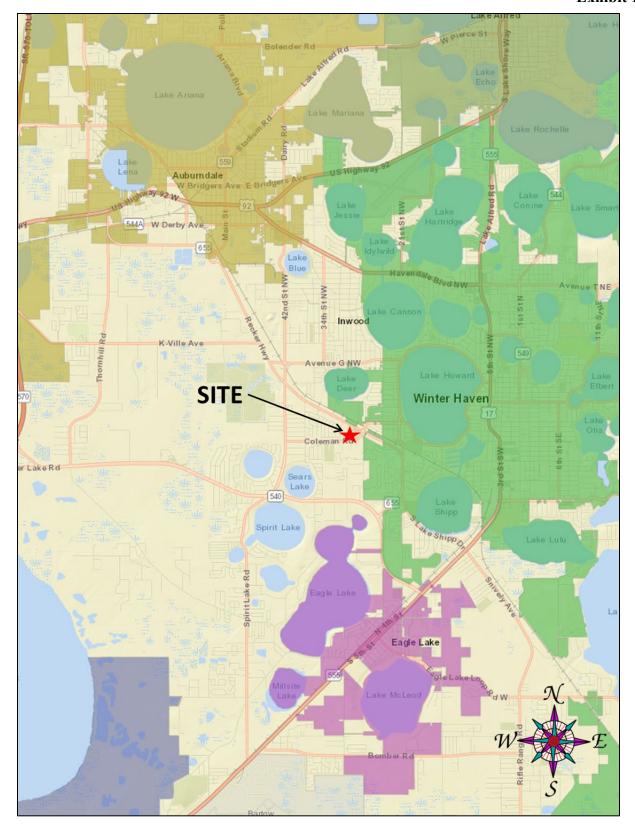

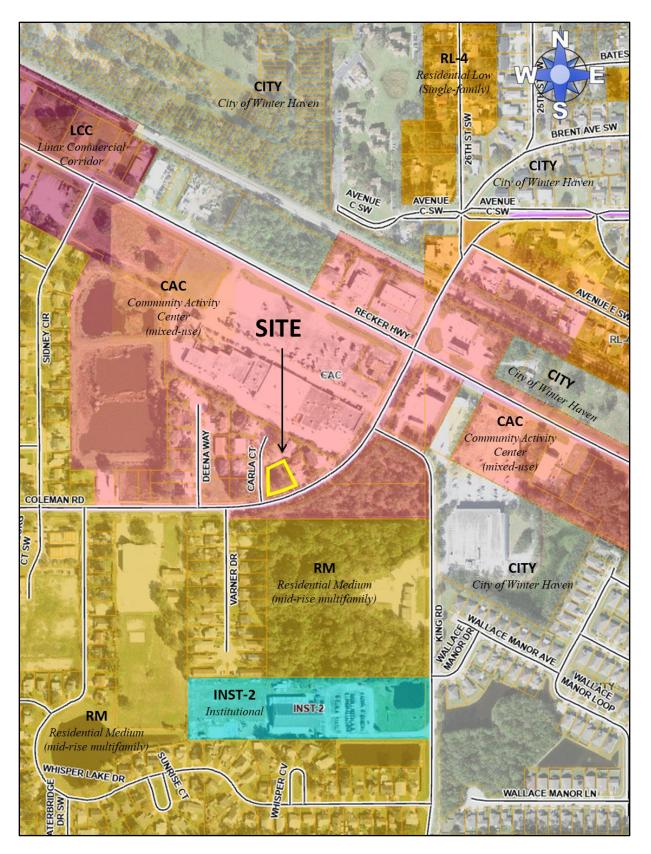

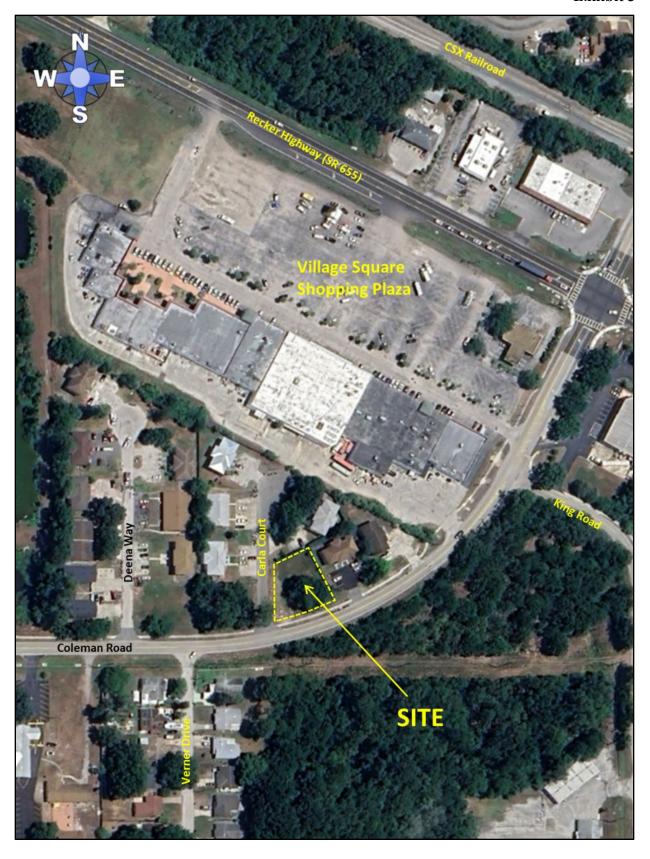

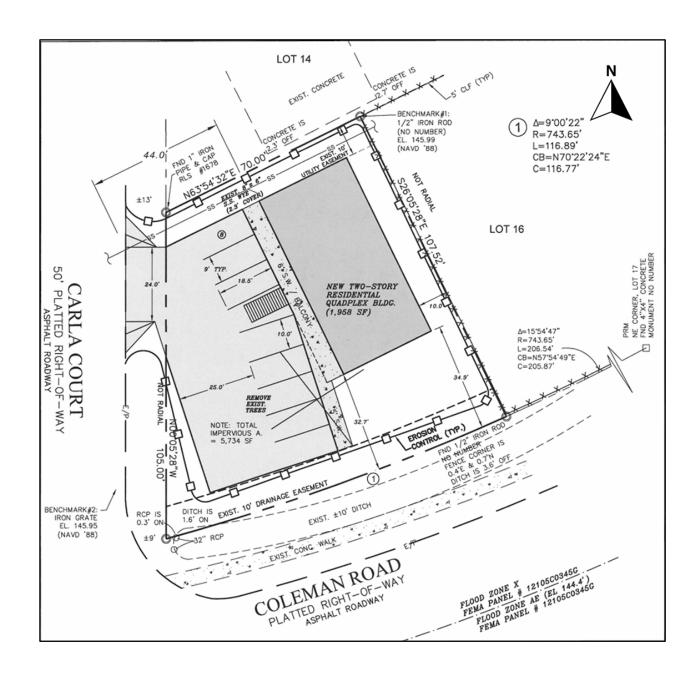

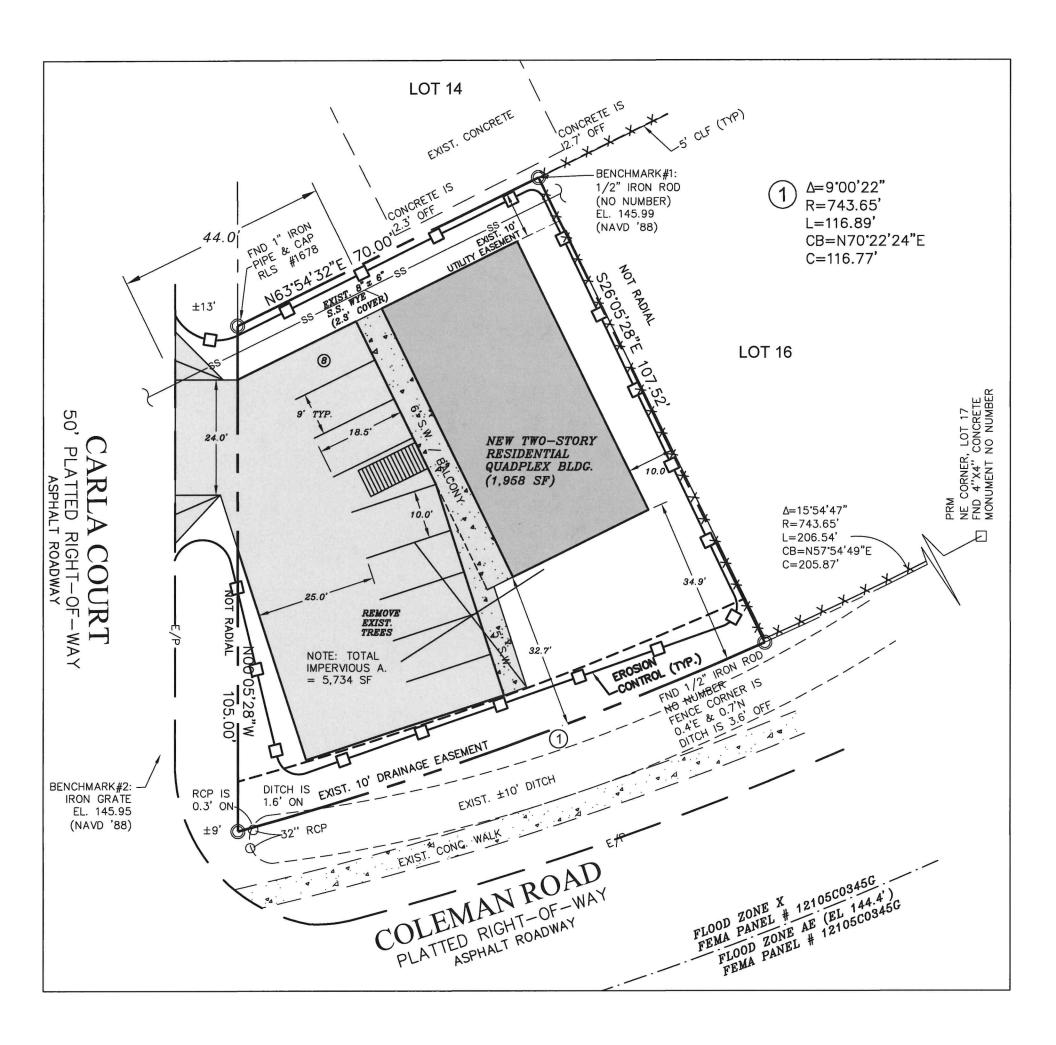

Summary:

The applicant is seeking setback relief to account for the misplacement of the building slab in relation to a collector roadway. Construction of the home had begun and passed the first level of inspection before it was realized that the right-of-way line was closer than other properties along the roadway. The variance requested is to reduce the setback standard from 35 feet to 28 feet, a 17% total reduction. The property is one parcel in a four-lot plat that fronts Windee Avenue named Windee Tower Estates. All four homesites in the plat are under construction. Construction was halted on the subject property after the concrete slab foundation was completed. The lots immediately to the east and west are much larger because they were established before the city of Lakeland extended potable water to this portion of Old Medulla Road. The extension of urban services to the area has enabled an increase in development density and a decrease in lot sizes.

Staff find that the request meets the following criteria listed in Section 931:

- The request is in accordance with the general intent and purpose of this Code and will not be injurious to the area involved or otherwise detrimental to the public welfare because the request is modest and the 35-foot setback from urban collector road rights-of-way is not needed for public safety. It is intended for aesthetic purposes. Deeper roadway setbacks also encourage higher speeds of travel.
- Denial of the variance will constitute unnecessary and undue hardship on the applicant relative to the amount of public benefit derived from strict adherence to the standard. The setback encroachment is relatively small compared to the enormous cost of demolition and reconstruction.

Development Review Committee

The Development Review Committee, based on the criteria for granting Variances, finds that the applicant's request as written **IS CONSISTENT** with **Section 931** of the Polk County Land Development Code.

Development Review Committee Recommendation: Based upon the application, and a recent site visit, the Development Review Committee recommends **APPROVAL of LDLVAR-2025-59**, with the following conditions:

CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL:

- 1. A variance to the standards in Section 208, Table 2.1 of the Land Development Code (LDC) shall be granted for a right-of-way setback reduction from 35 feet to 28 feet for a single-family dwelling.
- 2. The applicant must apply for all necessary permits within one (1) year of the date for which the Land Use Hearing Officer's Final Order is rendered.
- 3. This variance does not authorize any encroachments into easements, and the applicant shall be responsible for making certain there are no encroachments unless approval is granted by the easement holder and/or any applicable permitting agencies. The property owner(s) is also responsible for compliance with any restrictions of record pertaining to lots and/or land and this approval shall not be used to supersede authority over those restrictions.

GENERAL NOTES

- NOTE: This staff report was prepared without the benefit of testimony and evidence submitted by the public and other parties at a public hearing.
- NOTE: Approval of this variance shall not constitute a waiver or an additional variance from any applicable development regulation unless specifically noted in the conditions of approval and consistent with LDC Section 930D.
- NOTE: All conditions of approval, unless otherwise specified, shall be met prior to the effectiveness and validity of the variance approval.

- NOTE: All written commitments made in the application and subsequent submission of information made during the application review process, which are on file with the Land Development Division, shall be considered to be binding upon the applicant, provided such commitments are not at variance with the Comprehensive Plan, LDC or other development regulations in effect at the time of development.
- NOTE: Issuance of a development permit by the county does not in any way create any rights on the part of the applicant to obtain a permit from a state or federal agency and does not create any liability on the part of the county for issuance of the permit if the applicant fails to obtain requisite approvals or fulfill the obligations imposed by a state or federal agency or undertakes actions that result in a violation of state or federal law.

DEMONSTRATIONS OF THE CRITERIA FOR GRANTING VARIANCES SUMMARIZED BELOW:

- 1. Whether granting the variance will be in accordance with the general intent and purpose of this Code, and that the variance will not be injurious to the area involved or otherwise detrimental to the public welfare;
 - The applicant's request for setback relief is relatively minimal (approximately a 17% reduction). The 35-foot setback from urban collector road rights-of-way is not needed for public safety. It is intended for aesthetic purposes. Deeper roadway setbacks also encourage higher speeds of travel, according to the Institute of Transportation Engineers (ITE). Much of the roadway is lined with trees and vegetation, so there is not an intrinsic aesthetic that is noticeable in the building line along this corridor. This portion of Old Medulla is close to the intersection with the entrance to the south side of Lakeland-Linder International Airport. The posted speed is 35 mph. In the past, this entrance was restricted and gated. Granting this variance will not be injurious to the area involved or otherwise detrimental to the public welfare.
- 2. Whether special conditions and circumstances exist which are peculiar to the land, structure, or building involved and which are not applicable to other lands, structures, or buildings in the applicable land use district;
 - There are special conditions and circumstances that exist which are peculiar to the land. This property has different setback regulations than the other three lots in the Windee Tower Estates plat because it is a corner lot at the intersection of a local road and an urban collector road. As a result, it is the largest of the four lots in the plat by 739 square feet (7.3% larger). This provides enough space to place the 30'x 66' (1,980 sq.ft.) dwelling at the interior side setback line and meet the 35-foot right-of-way distance from Old Medulla Road. Unfortunately, that placement was misinterpreted at some point during the site development. As a result, the 30-foot-wide foundation was placed five (5) feet three (3) and 3/8 inches too far to the south. The applicant is requesting this setback relief to reduce the added cost of construction that will result from having to physically correct the mistake.
- 3. Whether provided the special conditions and circumstances present in the request do not result from the actions of the applicant;
 - The placement of the concrete slab foundation was the result of a miscommunication in the construction process that was not realized until after a substantial amount of work had been accomplished. The setback encroachment is relatively small (17% reduction) compared to the enormous cost of demolition and reconstruction.

- 4. Whether granting the requested variance will not confer on the applicant any special privilege that is denied by the provisions of this Code and will constitute unnecessary and undue hardship on the applicant;
 - The only structures on Old Medulla Road that are within the 35-foot right-of-way setback are the results of right-of-way taking after the structures were built. A residence at 2711 Old Medulla Road is within 32 feet and a religious institution at 4543 Waring Road is abutting both rights-of-way on the northwest corner of Old Medulla and Waring Roads. The right-of-way was taken for turn lane expansions at the intersection. While the applicant's request can be perceived as a special privilege, it was never intentional. The setback relief is not a significant benefit to the homeowner. It is more of a benefit to the neighboring lot to the north. The granting of the variance will alleviate the substantial cost burden of demolishing the foundation and starting construction all over again. The setback encroachment is relatively small (17% reduction) compared to the enormous cost of demolition and reconstruction.
- 5. Whether the variance granted is the minimum variance that will make possible the reasonable use of the land, building, or structure;
 - The applicant's request for setback relief is relatively minimal (approximately a 15% reduction). This request is just enough to render the recently constructed concrete slab foundation permissible for a single-family residence. There is no further request for encroachment into any other property line setback requirements.
- 6. Whether that in no case shall a variance be granted which will result in a change of land use that would not be permitted in the applicable land use designation;
 - Granting this variance will not result in a change of land use. The property has been mapped RL since 1991 and RL-4 since September 1, 2000. A single-family, site-built residence is proposed on the subject property.
- 7. Whether that in no case shall the Land Use Hearing Officer or the Planning Commission grant a variance which would result in creation of any residual lot or parcel which does not meet the requirements of this Code; and
 - Granting this request will not result in the creation of a lot or parcel that does not meet the requirements of the Code. This variance request will not change the size, shape or use of the property.
- 8. Whether that the granting of the variance does not circumvent a condition or the intent of a condition placed on a development by the Planning Commission or the BoCC.
 - The property was zoned General Industrial (GI) under the original 1971 zoning map. This area was intended to be an industrial park but during an economic downturn in the mid-1970s, lots were sold, and residences were developed on them. When the Board of County Commissioners adopted the Comprehensive Plan in 1991, the roads running north off of Old Medulla Road (Windee Avenue, Clements Road and Freedom Lane) were designated Residential Low (RL) on the Future Land Use Map. With the adoption of the LDC in 2000, RL-4 was mapped here because of the past GI zoning and the Transitional Ordinance (ORD. 2000-010). No further development restrictions are approved. Granting this

variance will not circumvent a condition or the intent of a condition placed on a development by the Planning Commission or the BoCC.

The subject property is one parcel in a four-lot plat that fronts Windee Avenue named Windee Tower Estates. All four homesites in the plat are under construction. Construction was halted on the subject property after the concrete slab foundation was completed. The lots immediately to the east and west are much larger because they were established before the city of Lakeland extended potable water to this portion of Old Medulla Road. The other properties outside of the plat on Windee Avenue are served by well and onsite septic systems which require larger land area to support. The property opposite Old Medulla Road to the south is approved for a ± 62 -acre light industrial park within the City of Lakeland under a Planned Unit Development.

Medulla Road comes to a 90-degree turn just after passing Windee Avenue heading west. At the intersection is the entrance to the south side of Lakeland-Linder International Airport. At one time, this entrance was gated which is why Old Medulla Road turns abruptly. The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) estimates that Old Medulla sees 1,550 vehicles traversing it daily. The Polk Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) estimates 900 of them occur during the peak hour which is likely when workers are leaving from the many businesses and industries on the south side of the airport such as the GEICO Insurance Regional Office Building, Champion Interior & Exterior Painters - Corporate office, several flight schools including Polk State College - Airside Center, and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) Aircraft Operations Center. During the off-peak times of the day, traffic is relatively mild for an urban collector road. Windee Avenue is just under a quarter mile long. It terminates into private property 1,306 feet from the center of the intersection with Old Medulla Road.

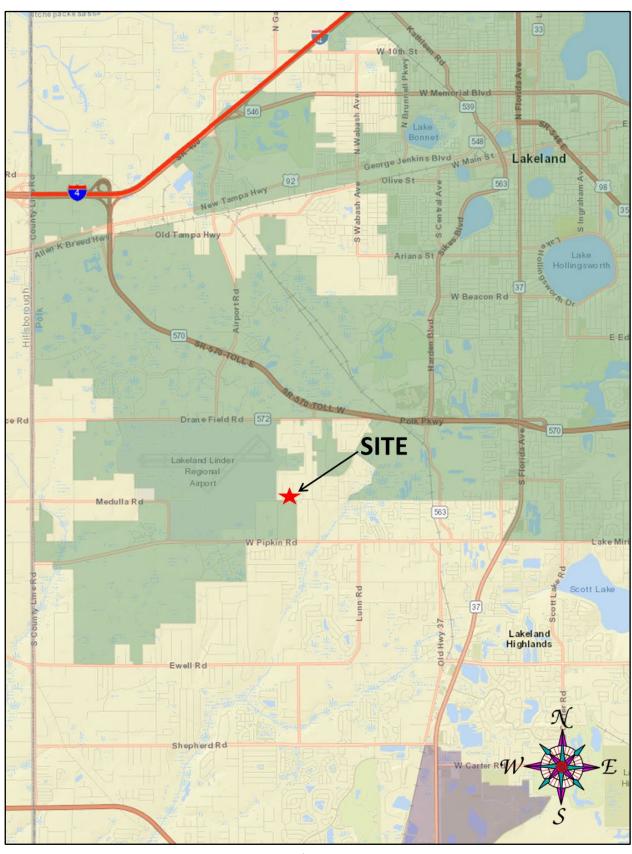

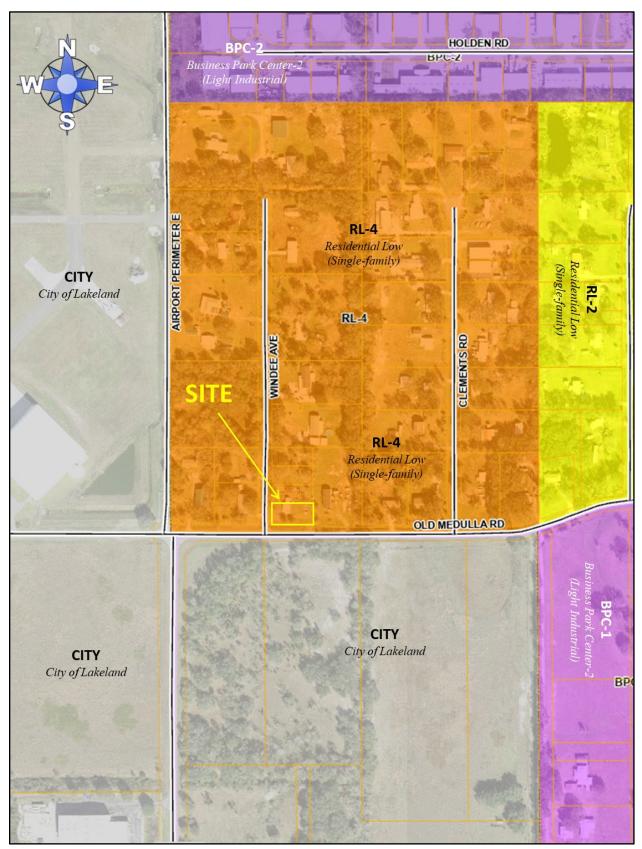

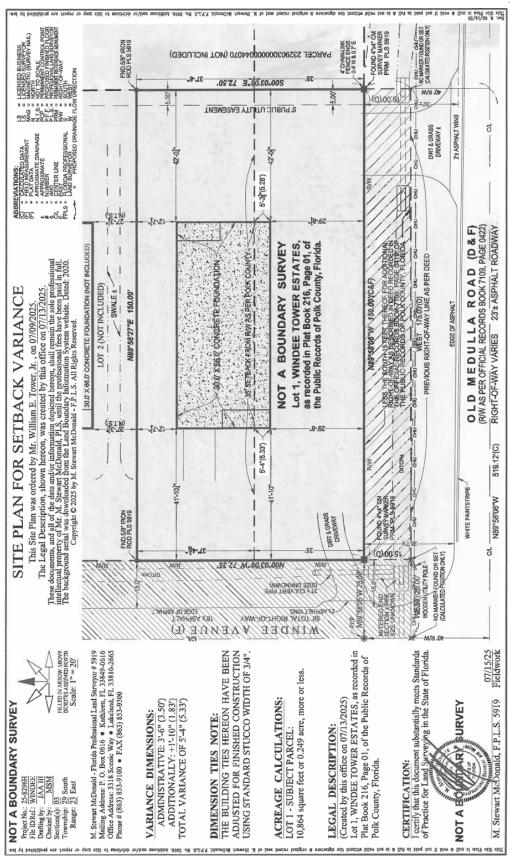
